

PROPOSAL TO CONDUCT A SURVEY OF FAMILY SUPPORTIVE SERVICES OFFERED THROUGH UCSF CAMPUS, HOSPITALS AND CLINICS. *C. Hargrove*

GOAL: Improve UCSF's effectiveness in responding to special needs of families and children during their encounters with our hospitals and clinics.

- OBJECTIVES:
1. Conduct an inventory survey of existing family support resources; identify gaps in service; identify duplications in service; identify contradictions.
 2. Make recommendations for interfaces and coordination needed to improve service delivery.
 3. Develop resource directory and distribute to campus and community at large.
 4. Develop an interdisciplinary committee to facilitate long term coordinative efforts to improve family support services. (e.g. representatives from Social Work, Pediatric Medicine, Nursing Service, Nursing Education, Langley Porter Institute, parents, patients.)

- METHOD:
1. Conduct preliminary interviews with representatives of departments with known programs of family support, with families, with news service and public service programs in order to develop a comprehensive list of potential child and family support services.
 2. Design survey instrument.
 3. Conduct survey.
 4. Compile information.
 5. Draft directory.
 6. Present directory to advisory committee and discuss final product and recommendations for future coordination of identified resources.
 7. Print and distribute directory.
 8. Submit final report to William Kerr.
