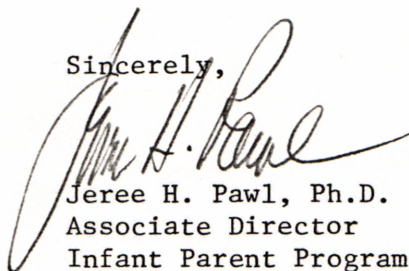

Dear Selma --

I called yesterday and was told that you were ill and away from work for awhile. This made me feel a bit squeamish about my mission in writing as I'm about to ask a favor of you. Especially since I often think of you with a very special admiration and sense of thanks. This summer I had the pleasure - both professional and aesthetic - of reading your book on infant mental health. My only complaint (but equally a source of admiration) was your restraint in drawing theoretical conclusions from the work.

The request I'd like you to consider is this. At each meeting of the American Psychoanalytic there is a session or two titled, "Research in Progress." I am in charge of organizing these sections. This year we have three submissions, ^{for DEC} all concerning work with and study of deaf children. Two of these reports concern study of symbol formation, one concerns efforts to provide periods of better communication with the young child with research questions about the effects of this intervention on "self-formation" and object relatedness. The emphasis of the session, since these are research efforts in various stages of progress, is to bring out problems of methodology, design, interpretation, etc. They are not finished papers or formal presentations. After 20-30 minute reports, we have a prepared discussant review the issues and offer comments and then have discussion with the audience.

The obvious question is: Would you agree to be the discussant for these three related reports? I know you'll be at the meeting on Saturday. We could schedule this for Friday afternoon from 2-5pm.

I'm enclosing copies of the material sent to me by the presenters. These are not the reports that will be read but give an idea of what issues will come up. If this is inconvenient, we'll make other arrangements.

I hope this finds you on the mend!!!

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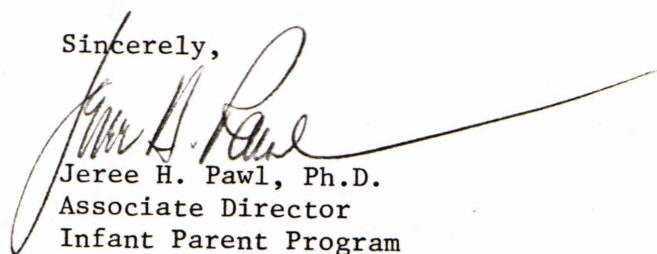

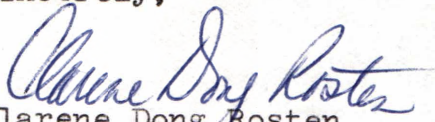

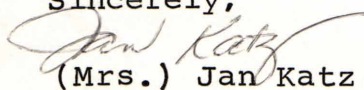
