Of the 3,243 eligible voters, 2,314 or 71.35% cast their ballots in yesterday's election.

Having the highest percentage of voters turning out was E section, with 97.44% of the eligibles casting their ballots. Closely grouped with only a fraction of a percent difference, were L, K, and M units with 91.64%, 91.49%, and 91.26% respectively.

Other averages although smaller, may be attributed to the lack of competition in those sections. They are as follows: H-89.37%, G-68.06%, F-53.67%, C-47.62%, D-45.13%, and J-42.29%.
