
Roonga first partnered with the Ed Fund in the fall of 2013. With teachers spending \$1.6 billion out of pocket each year, the Ed Fund wanted to ease the burden on teachers by stocking basic classroom


supplies - paper, pencils, dry erase markers, tissue and the like.
