BIOS

MICHAEL PLATT

Michael Platt currently serves as President for the South Carolina Society of Healthcare Emergency Management Board of Directors. He has served as President since January 2017, and has been on the board since its inception.

Michael first became involved with the board while working as Manager of Safety and Emergency Preparedness for Palmetto Health in Columbia, SC. In this role, he leads two Emergency Preparedness Coordinators and two Safety Coordinators while managing the Safety and EP programs across three hospitals under the Palmetto Health banner.

Michael has been involved with Emergency Management for over thirty years first, as a Fire Fighter and then as the Fire Marshal for the State of South Carolina. He has also serves in the South Carolina Air National Guard as Deputy Fire Chief for McEntire JNGB.

MICHAEL A. ELIEFF

Mike Elieff is the Director of the Office of Public Health Preparedness at the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, with responsibility for public health emergency response, planning and preparedness programs, and the administration of grants from the CDC, Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) and Homeland Security. He serves as the DHEC member on the Homeland Security Advisory Committee and the Interagency Coordination Committee. Prior to joining DHEC he worked for the SC Emergency Management Division as Chief of Operations Support. During his tenure at SCEMD, he served as the first NIMS Coordinator for South Carolina and co-wrote the Statewide NIMS Implementation Plan. Additionally, he developed and implemented the Disaster Logistics Support Plan. During activations of the State Emergency Operations Center he served as the Chief of Logistics.

Mike served 21 years in the US Army, where he was part of the team that created the doctrine for Military Support to Civil Authorities. He has played an active role in several disasters ranging from the Cuban refugee crisis, Hurricanes Andrew and Floyd among others, multiple mid-west blizzards, and flooding. During the Haiti earthquake response he served in an advisory capacity on logistical operations to the US Ambassador's senior leadership team. Most recently he was the DHEC Area Commander for Hepatitis A, the October 2015 flood, and Hurricane Matthew.

STEVE HARRINGTON

Steve Harrington, GPC is the Grants Administrator for the Office of Public Health Preparedness at the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control. He has more than 25 years of experience in writing, securing, and managing federal, state, and foundation grants. Steve is one of only 350 grant professionals in the nation to have attained Grant Professional Certification (GPC) from the Grant Professional Certification Institute (GPCI) and was in the first nationwide group to sit for the exam in Washington, DC in 2007.

Before coming to DHEC, Steve held grant related positions in state/local government, as well as in other private grant related firms. Steve formerly served as Grant Services Director for the law firm of Nelson, Mullins Riley and Scarborough, LLP, in Columbia, SC and Washington, DC; where he assisted the firm's clients with all their grant related needs. He also served as Grants Administrator/Coordinator for Clarendon County, South Carolina, where he administered over \$60 million dollars in project funding, among 130 different projects, from 15 different funding sources, ranging from economic development, infrastructure, to fire, EMS, and law enforcement. Steve's other titles include Grants Procurement Officer for the Charleston County (South Carolina) School District and Grants Coordinator for the South Carolina Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

SKIP PAYNE

Commander (CDR) Skip Payne serves as a Deputy Director for the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) Program. He serves as an advisor to the MRC Director and is responsible for developing, implementing, managing, and evaluating MRC related programs, projects, and activities. CDR Payne also represents the MRC by serving on various committees and task forces advising internal and external stakeholders on issues related to civilian volunteers and their participation in public health, preparedness, and response activities. Additionally, CDR Payne augments the Regional Incident Support Team — National Capital Region as a Liaison Officer, where he deploys in support of National Special Security and National Capital Area Events.

MARK W. RADCLIFF

Mark W. Radcliff is the Special Projects Administrator with the MD Police and Correctional Training Commissions. He began his career with the United States Marine Corps, where he served two Diplomatic Missions abroad before participating in the Gulf War as an Infantry Squad Leader. Upon being honorably discharged from the Marines Mark entered the field of Law Enforcement, where he served as a Police Officer with the Federal Protective Service and a Criminal Investigator with the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. He also served in the field of Forensics in the private and public sectors.

Prior to assuming his current position, Mark served as an instructor at the Correctional Entrance Level Training Academy in Sykesville, MD. His additional roles and titles include: Training Coordinator for the Mid Atlantic Regional Gang Investigators Network (MARGIN); Certified Instructor in Law Enforcement and Corrections with the Training Commissions; Certified Instructor with the State of New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety Division of Criminal Justice Police Training Commissions; and Certified Motorcycle Instructor with the State of Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration and the Harley Davidson Motor Corporation.

LINDY WILLIAMSON

Lindy Williamson is the owner of LGW Consulting, LLC. As an educator, she has trained communities, hospitals, mental health agencies, emergency services, military, schools, businesses, churches and service organizations worldwide. Lindy has also been an approved instructor for the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation since 2000 and has spoken at national symposiums/conferences serving the needs of mental health agencies and emergency services on the state, regional and national level.

From 2007-2011, Lindy served as consultant and trainer for the National Veterans Foundation which maintains a national toll free Hotline for Veterans and their families. For over 10 years, Lindy volunteered or worked with the staff of the 2-11 Hotline in Charleston, SC. The 2-1-1 Hotline is accredited by the American Association of Suicidolgy and answers calls for the State of South Carolina for both 1-800-SUICIDE and for 1-800-273-TALK (The National Suicide Prevention Hotline). She also spent ten years as the lead counselor and one of the instructors for the State of Mississippi Law Enforcement Peer Support team (MSLEAPS). Lindy has been deployed to numerous major disasters, including the World Trade Center, the Asian Tsunami, and several hurricanes, including Katrina. She has worked with Green Cross, CISM Teams, the Red Cross and FEMA to provide assistance for both first responders and victims.

DR. LINDA BELL

Dr. Linda Bell is the South Carolina State Epidemiologist and Director of the DHEC Bureau of Disease Control. A native of El Paso, Texas, Dr. Bell received her undergraduate degree in Molecular Biology from the University of Texas at Austin. She obtained her medical degree from the University of Texas Southwestern Health Science Center at Dallas, where she also completed her Internal Medicine residency. Prior to holding her current position, Dr. Bell served as an Epidemic Intelligence Service Officer with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention with the Viral Special Pathogens Branch and with the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC). Dr. Bell has held several positions with DHEC including: Medical Epidemiologist, Director of the Division of Acute Disease Epidemiology, and Director of Clinical Services.
