Hardy Breaks Rim As Men's Varsity Basketball Wins In Arizona

Jaden Hardy had 27 points, 8 rebounds and 8 assists, and Coronado's boys basketball team cruised to an 82-51 victory over Rancho Solano Prep at the Hoophall West showcase in Scottsdale, Arizona on Saturday. Tyrell "Fat Daddy" Hunt added 18 points and 12 rebounds for Coronado, and Felix Reeves scored 12.

Max Howard had 10 points for the Cougars and Richard "PopPop" Isaacs added 7 points and 7 assists, including an off-the-backboard alley-oop to Hardy, who broke the rim with a dunk to force a stoppage in play.

Varsity Flag Football Keeps Rolling

Coronado 35, Rancho 6 — At Coronado, Kaylin Hall passed for 206 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Cougars over the Rams. Reagan Raimer, Bridget Podlesni, Ashley Taibi and Sydnee Hansen each caught a touchdown pass for Coronado. Ava Yarbrow added 90 rushing yards and a score for the Cougars.

Coronado 33, Desert Oasis 0 — At Desert Oasis, Reagan Raimer scored three touchdowns to lead the Cougars past the Diamondbacks. Raimer caught two touchdown passes from Kaylin Hall and returned an interception for a score. Hall completed 14 of 25 passes for 171 yards and three touchdowns, including a scoring pass to Ashley Taibi. Ava Yarbrow rushed for 103 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries for Coronado.

Coronado 34, Arbor View 0 — At Coronado, the Cougars intercepted five passes and routed the Aggies. Reagan Raimer had two interceptions and returned one for a touchdown for Coronado. Rachel Burt picked off two passes, and Lexie Potts added an interception for the Cougars. Kaylin Hall threw four TD passes, including two to Sydnee Hansen for Coronado. Ava Yarbrow and Sophia Coronel added TD catches for the Cougars.
