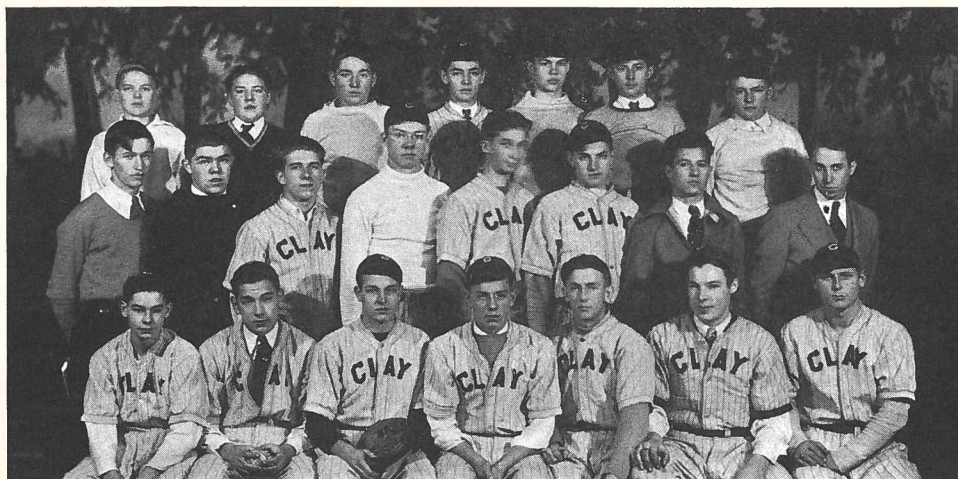


Baseball
