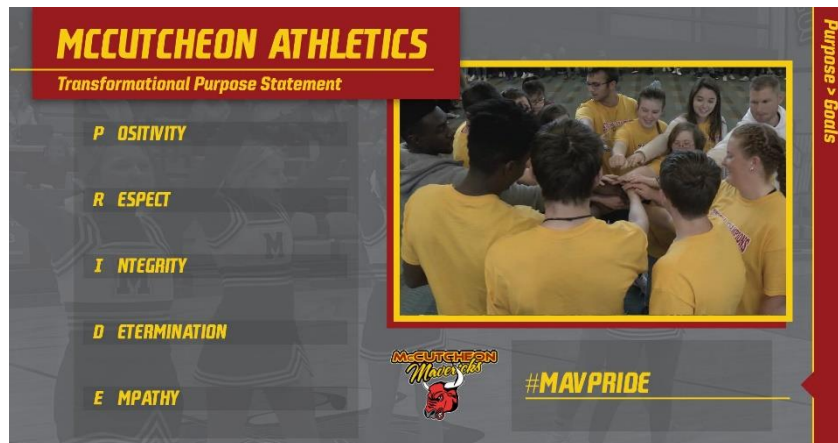


McCutcheon High School Freshman Orientation Program 2020

Conference Affiliation

North Central Conference

- McCutcheon competes in 20 conference sports
- Each sport has its own conference championship
- Athletes can be named to All-Conference teams in their sport
- West: Logansport, Harrison, Lafayette Jeff, Kokomo, & McCutcheon;
East: Muncie Central, Anderson, Richmond, Arsenal Tech, & Marion

Academic Requirements

- IHSAA Guidelines: athletes must pass 70% of the classes taken (5 of 7)
- Semester grades take precedence over 9 week grades
- Eligibility/ineligibility period = 9 weeks (no mid-term eligibility)
- Study tables may be created by each coach as they feel necessary
- Team GPAs are averaged, teams are strongly encouraged to average above a 3.0

McCutcheon Athletic Handbook

Each athlete must agree to abide by all rules established in this handbook. A complete copy can be found on the McCutcheon Athletic Website.

- McCutcheon Code of Conduct
 - Specific provisions deal with violation of rules dealing with alcohol, illegal drugs, & tobacco
 - General conduct rules have been created dealing with appearance, attitude, behavior, and sportsmanship
 - Code of Conduct rules are in effect 365 days a year.
- IHSAA Eligibility Rules
 - These rules deal specially with age, amateurism, enrolment, scholarship, and physical condition
- Attendance
 - 8:00 Rule/Early Departure
 - Student must be in attendance by 8:00 or no after school activities
 - Exceptions = doctor's note or permission from AD
 - Any student that misses part of the day or leaves early = no after school activities
 - Exceptions = doctor's note or permission from AD

TSC Random Drug Testing Policy

- All TSC athletes and cheerleaders are eligible during their season.
- Each athlete and cheerleader is assigned a number during the season.
- Numbers are selected on a random basis every 7-10 days.
- The numbers are selected for the school by the testing lab.
- 5% of the athletes participating in that season are selected each time.
- If an athlete tests "positive", the Drug Ed. Counselor informs the A.D.
- The A.D. will inform the athlete and his/her custodial parents.
- The athlete will have the opportunity to explain the positive test results.

- If the positive results cannot be satisfactorily explained, the athlete and his/her family will be given the opportunity to have the remaining portion of the sample tested at their expense.
- TSC also reserves the right to continue testing any athlete who has tested positive during the school year.

TSC Drug Testing Policy – Consequences

1st Offense

- Alcohol and Illegal Drugs – suspension from 50% of the contest season in which the athlete is presently competing, which may carry over into the next season.
- Tobacco – suspension from 30% of the contest season in which the athlete is presently competing, which may carry over into the next season.

2nd Offense

- Suspension from athletic participation for 1 calendar year from the date of the suspension.

3rd Offense

- Suspension from athletic participation for remainder of high school career.

Required Paperwork & Fees

- IHSAA Physical (dated after April 1st, signed by a licensed doctor with the doctors' license number). Emailed & faxed copies are not accepted!
- Online documents via tippecanoe-in.finalforms.com or (visit our website: <https://mhs.tsc.k12.in.us/mccutcheonathletics>). Parent/Guardian & Athlete must complete online documentation.
- Participation Fee: Onetime \$75 fee. Must be paid before the athlete participates in a contest.

Post-season Athletic Awards

- Each sport has specific letter winning requirements (see handbook)
- Athletes who earn a varsity letter may purchase a letter jacket.
 - Jackets and patches are purchased by the athlete/family
 - These items can be purchased at The Athlete. A form with signature from the AD must be presented to those retailers to purchase letters or a jacket.

McCutcheon Physical Nights

- Important: student athletes must have a physical on file before they can participate in summer/off-season activities. A physical must be dated after April 1st 2020 to be valid for the 2020-2021 school year.

Summer Open Facilities & Conditioning

- Each sport sets up their own schedule with the following exceptions:
 - Designated times:
 - Fall Sports = Monday Nights
 - Winter Sports = Wednesday Nights
 - Spring Sports = Tuesday Nights
 - No restrictions for Thursday – Saturday
 - No organized athletic participation or contact ever on a Sunday
- Participation is optional but highly recommended

Summer Camps

- Many sports will hold one week summer team camps in either June or July.

What Athletes Want From Parents

- 3 B's
 - Be There
 - Be Positive
 - Be Seated
- Parents Role
 - Before Season – ask us why we want to play and what our goals are, and accept those as your own.
 - During Season – provide us with confidence and keep your focus on the team.
 - After a Game – give us space and time.
 - Always – be a source of confidence, never teach us to point blame when goals are not met.
- How to maximize your son or daughter's athletic experience – help them reach their potential
 - Always support the coach in the car and at the dinner table
 - Share concerns about the coach with your coach, not your student athlete.

Curbing Sports Specialization

- Why Play Multiple Sports:
 - The earlier you specialize = earlier you peak
 - Specialization increases injury risk
 - Specialization increases burnout
 - Increased experiences working with different coaches is the foundation of sports
- Overuse injuries now account for 50% of all injuries in middle school and high school
- 70% of kids drop out by the age of 13 (seldom will you hear the athlete quit because of lack of passion – they say they quit because of parental pressure or unfair treatment by or the dislike of coaches – often they have created new goals).
- College coaches want multi-sport athletes. College coaches will find the athletes they want. College coaches will see how hard you play, react and if you are a good teammate during your second sport.
- Playing a minimum of two sports throughout high school should be your goal!
