

## Daily Attendance & Screening Procedures

- Daily attendance & health pre screening of all athletes, managers & coaches is required.
- Coaches will complete their own attendance and health screening via the provided Google Form.
- Coaches will complete daily athlete attendance and health screening via Final Forms. This process must be completed before any activity can commence.
- Questions asked during the screening process:
  - Close contact or cared for someone with COVID-19?
  - Have cough?
  - Have sore throat?
  - Shortness of breath?
  - Have fever?
- If a student says yes to any of these questions isolate the athlete until a parent/guardian can pick them up. Contact a parent or guardian. An athlete is permitted to drive home on their own. Alert the ATC & Athletic Director.
- Questionable responses or if the coach has health concerns; athlete must be checked by the ATC.

## Return to School After Exclusion

Once an athlete or coach is excluded from the school environment, they may return if they satisfy the recommendations of the CDC. Currently those guidelines are:

### 1. Untested

Persons who have not received a test proving or disproving the presence of COVID-19 but experience symptoms may return if the following three conditions are met:

- They have not had a fever for at least 72 hours (that is three full days of no fever without the use of medicine that reduces fevers); and
- Other symptoms have improved (for example, when your cough or shortness of breath have improved); and
- At least 10 calendar days have passed since your symptoms first appeared.
- The state website has a list of over 200 testing facilities, their location, and hours 9 of operation. This list is updated frequently.

### 2. Tested Positive- Symptomatic

Persons who experienced symptoms and have been tested for COVID-19 may return to school if the following conditions are met:

- The individual no longer has a fever (without the use medicine that reduces fevers); and
- Other symptoms have improved (for example, when your cough or shortness of breath have improved); and

- At least 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared; or
- The individual has received two negative tests at least 24 hours apart.

**3. Tested Positive- Asymptomatic**

Persons who have not had symptoms but test positive for COVID-19 may return when they have gone ten calendar days without symptoms and have been released by a healthcare provider. Students may also return if they are approved to do so in writing by the student's health care provider.

**4. Tested Positive- Impact on School Operations**

Establish predetermined thresholds for mitigation strategies by following ISDH's recommendation to work with your local health department in following the CDC guidance which can be found here. Reference page three, "When a confirmed case has entered a school, regardless of community transmission."

**Coaches who have any reported positive cases of Covid-19 must report immediately to the Athletic Director & School Medical Personnel and further guidance will be given.**
