The following has been posted on our school website along with the actual Ohio Department of Health Director's Order regarding the Mandatory Requirements for Sports to Return. Please familiarize yourself with these orders so as to not jeopardize the safety and health of all parties involved and allow our athletes to exhibit their talent and skills on the field.

Ticket Policy and Spectator Guidelines

Mandatory Spectator Guidelines as set forth by the Ohio Department of Health:

- All spectators, in addition to players and coaches, must conduct daily symptom assessment checks. All volunteers are to conduct a self-assessment. If you have a fever of 100 degrees or higher, a cough, headache, sore throat, shortness of breath, fatigue, chills or body shakes, loss of taste or smell, unexplained body aches, or have had contact with anyone who was diagnosed with or has symptoms of Covid 19 then stay home. Stay home if you are experiencing any of these symptoms.
- Stay home if you are vulnerable and at risk
- As per the mandate, only family and household members and loved ones of players, coaches, and team staff members will be permitted to attend. The Executive Order mandates that attendance is limited to families and thus only 15% of fixed seating will be filled.
- You must have a season ticket to enter the stadium, as tickets will be pre-issued to each player's family. Since season tickets were pre-paid at issuance there will be no exchange of funds at the gate. Families have the right to determine which family members or close 'loved ones' use their allotted passes for the home games. Remember, there will not be any individual game tickets sold at the event
- Siblings of the players are the only permitted students and must enter with their families.
- All TCC fans will enter with their pre-issued ticket at the gate that is adjacent to the SE corner of the school building. This entrance will be marked with a sign. This is the same gate that the opposing football team enters the field. There will be markings that indicate distancing at this entrance. If there is a long line then wait in your car until it lessens. You must present your ticket at that time and your name will be recorded for contact tracing purposes at that time. (Note that gates will be opened 30 minutes prior to the game).
- Fans of the opponents will present vouchers that were distributed at their school and pay at the gate with the Ticket Booth at the far SE corner of the field. This area will be marked with a sign. No one can enter without a Voucher. There will be markings that

indicate distancing at this entrance. If there is a long line then wait in your car until it lessens.

- Spectators must wear a mask at all times.
- Spectators are asked to sit with immediate household members and to physically distance themselves from other families/spectators.
- Physical distancing is 6'. That means to the right of you, to the left of you, in the row in front of you and the row behind you
- Both TCC fans and opponents spectators will be encouraged to sit in the grasslands with family members. The grasslands will be clearly marked in circles that will be properly distanced from one another. Lawn chairs are permitted and encouraged
- Physical distance should be practiced when in lines for concessions and restrooms outside of our Porta Johns. There will be markings in the ground that designate the 6' distance.
- No congregation of spectators or players is permitted at any time before, during or after the match. This will be difficult to follow as our parents, fans and students are used to congregating in mass at length after our Athletic contests. That will not be the case this year due to the mandated requirements! The Gates will close 20 minutes after the contest ends and all spectators need to clear the premise.
- The ticket procedure for away games will be as follows: The opponent of TCC will determine how many tickets each family member can receive. Due to the limited capacity, this will probably be 2-3 tickets per family. You will receive a voucher a day or 2 prior to the game. You must present this voucher and pay for the ticket at the gate of our opponent. No voucher means no entrance to the opponent's field. You must follow these guidelines as well when visiting another schools facilities
- Note: for Home games 1 NP Police Officer will be hired to guard against spectators entering the game at the NE end of the Facility where there is no gate but an open ended area.

Safety and Education:

- Players are monitored daily at practice and have been since summer skill training began June 1, 2020. They will continue to be monitored daily at school and at practice. They will be monitored upon entering a bus for away games with a temperature check.
- Players, coaches, trainers and officials should not be in physical contact with one another except in the field of play. This means no team huddles, no high-fives, no end zone celebrations, etc.
- All coaches and players must wear masks and practice social distancing when not on the field of play. This means in team meetings, in the locker room, etc.
- A meeting with the entire football and volleyball teams and coaches will be held the week of August 24th as I will verbally read and discuss the Executive Order that applies to them regarding distancing, masking, congregating, huddling, high fives, before and after game procedures, locker room procedures, equipment and water bottle procedures, etc.
- All coaches have up to date CPR certifications and the AED is in working order and all AED pads are updated
- Smith Ambulance will also be at games to assist medically if needed
- Our trainer is on site during practices and games to assist in following the procedures

- Individual plastic water bottles with the players numbers on them have been purchased in order that each player drinks out of their own bottle. In the past a few water bottles were passed around and water squirted in the mouth of the players. Since there will be a bit of a challenge getting the correct bottle into the hands of each player, we have 3 student helpers organizing the bottles of those players on the field.
- Locker rooms will be used only for PreGame meetings and Halftime Adjustments. A Post Game meeting can be held outdoors in the end zone while distancing. Because of limited showers and space we will not allow the student athlete to bath at the school. They will place their helmet and shoulder pads on top of their lockers and depart from the facility after games.
- An online Fall Sports meeting will be conducted or a video will be released prior to our Home opener on September 5th to educate TCC students and parents participating in Sports regarding the Director's Order
- Our PA volunteer will make a minimum of 2 announcements per game on some subject relating to the Executive Order. The messages will relate to Distancing, masking, congregating, etc.
- In order to help players continue to follow policy during games, a person will be assigned to monitor the sidelines and make sure masks are worn, distancing is followed, equipment is not shared, etc.
- In case of inclement weather, the PA announcer will require spectators to return to their vehicles. Home team fans will first file out from the same gate they entered and the visiting spectators will exit from the Ticket Booth gate they entered.

Concessions:

- Food concession operations will adhere to Ohio's guidance for restaurants.
- Distancing will be maintained at the Concession as X markings will be spray painted 6' apart in the grass area
- Food and drinks will be limited. Food will be prepackaged.
- All volunteers are to conduct a self-assessment. If you have a fever of 100 degrees or higher, a cough, headache, sore throat, shortness of breath, fatigue, chills or body shakes, loss of taste of smell, unexplained body aches, or have had contact with anyone who was diagnosed with or has symptoms of Covid 19 then stay home. (Note: this message is also on our website where volunteers sign-up to work games).
- gloves and masks must be worn by workers

Cleaning:

- All facilities will be cleaned according to current guidelines and extra attention will be taken for the cleaning of ticket tables/counters, handrails and doors, press box or scorers tables and other frequently touched surfaces. These surfaces will be cleaned before and after all events.

- Hand sanitizer will be readily available at the field of play. This includes at the area of entrance, at the concession area and in the Porta Johns.

Enforcement:

George Zambie as Athletic Director will serve as the Compliance Person and the point of contact to communicate with Health authorities.
