Inducted: 2013



Head Coach of Girls Basketball Team for 32 years from 1969-2001. Had a total career record of 692-211. Led the Dragonettes to 15 state playoff berths, 9 region championships and the State Championship in 1973-74. Was named Region Coach of the Year 9 times.

D.B. Carroll

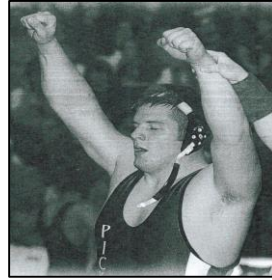
Inducted: 2013



Basketball Coach at Jasper High & Pickens County High before 1957 consolidation. Coached 3 State Championship teams and 2 state runner-ups. Starting in 1949, team won 187 consecutive games. Named to the GACA and GA Prep Sports Halls of Fame.

Chad Wigington

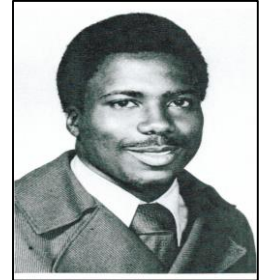
Inducted: 2013



Class of 2005 Graduate. Lettered in Wrestling and Football. Won the State Wrestling Championship for heavyweights in 2005. Finished 2nd in the State in 2004 and 3rd in State in 2003. Had a career record of 151-13 with 127 career pins.

Fred Anderson

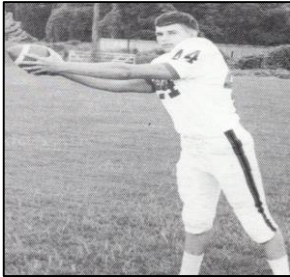
Inducted: 2013

Charlie Chastain

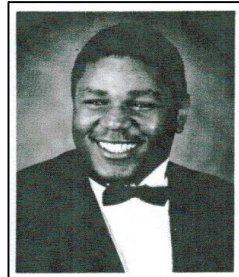
Inducted: 2013

Tommy Pye

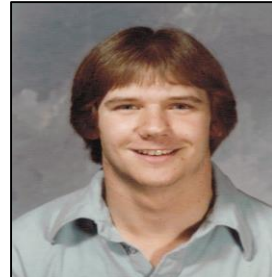
Inducted: 2013

Steve Eubanks

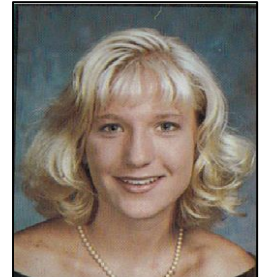
Inducted: 2013

Allison Thomason

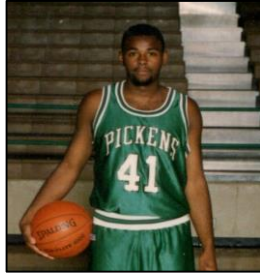
Inducted: 2014

Inducted: 2014



Class of 1995 Graduate. Lettered in Basketball. Was named an All-State player 3 times. Holds the career (2,582), season (1,001) and game (62) scoring records. Averaged 38.5 points/game in the 1993-94 season. Also holds records for most 3-pointers made in a game, season, and career.

Jeremiah Boswell

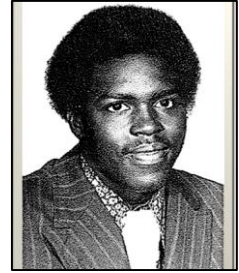
Inducted: 2014



Class of 2001 Graduate. Lettered in Basketball. Was a 3-time Region Player of the Year and named All-State in 1999-00 & 2000-01. Scored 1958 career points and set school record for Free Throw percentage. Led team to 3 straight state playoff appearances and an Elite 8 finish in 1999-00.

Alonzo Hampton

Inducted: 2015



Class of 1972 Graduate. Lettered in Football, Baseball, Basketball, and Track & Field. Was an All-State Football player in 1971 and held record receiving yards in a game for over 40 years. Both stood for years. In Track & Field, held the High Jump school record from 1971-96.

Cay Roland

Inducted: 2015



Class of 1974 Graduate. Lettered in Basketball and Tennis. Was a key member of the 1973-74 Girls Basketball team that won the Class A State Championship. Was an All-State player in 1974 and scored 1640 Career Points in her basketball career with the Dragonnettes.

Linda McAfee

Inducted: 2015



Class of 1974 Graduate. Lettered in Basketball. Was named State Most Valuable player at the conclusion of the State Championship 1973-74 season. Named to the All-State team in 1974. Scored 1239 points in her career with the Dragonnettes.

Don Howell

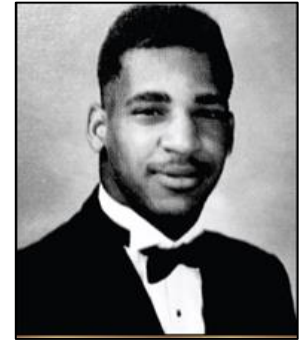
Inducted: 2016

Inducted: 2016



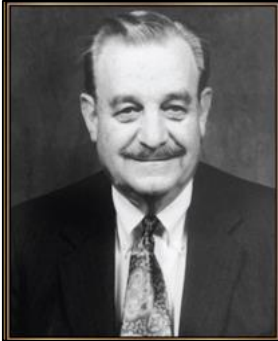

Don Enis

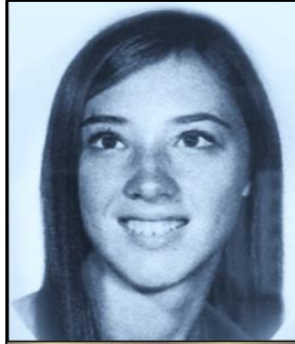
Inducted: 2016



Longtime coach in Football, Baseball, and Basketball. As the Head Football Coach for 8 years, he coached 2 All-American and 8 All-State players. His 1971 team was the first to win 8 games in a season and set numerous defensive team records that still stand. As a baseball coach led the team to back-to-back region titles in 1971 & 1972

Debbie Deboard

Inducted: 2016



Class of 1970 graduate. Lettered in Basketball and Tennis. Set the school record for points in a season in basketball with 946 in 1969-70, averaging 38.6 points a game. Set school record for points in a game with 56. Scored 1276 career points. In Tennis earned 1970 State berth as a Singles player.

Katie Frye

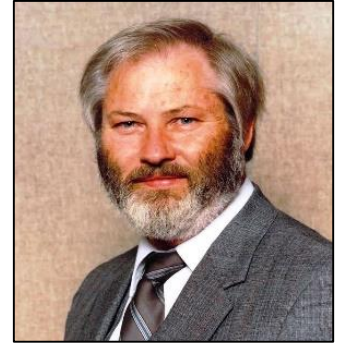
Inducted: 2017



Class of 2001 graduate. Lettered in Basketball, Softball, and Tennis. In Basketball was All-State, named a Georgia State All-Star, and Region Player of the Year in the 2000-01 season. Scored 1904 career points and led the team to 4 consecutive state tournament appearances.

Jordan Shaw

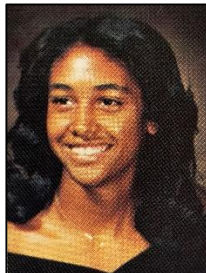
Inducted: 2017

Class of 1982 Graduate. Lettered in Basketball and Softball. In Basketball, scored 1838 career points and held the career scoring record from 1982-97. 2nd team All-State in 1981 and Honorable Mention All-State in 1982. Also led the team in rebounds in 2 years of her career.

Whitney Propes

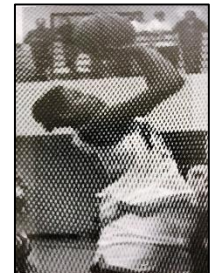
Inducted: 2018

Two-time region champion in Girls Golf (2008 & 2009)

Class of 2002 Graduate.

Lettered in Baseball and Basketball. Had a career batting average over .400 and recorded over 100 career stolen bases. In Basketball, had 795 career points, 165 steals, and 347 assists. He was a member of the 1999-00 Region Championship Basketball team. Was named honorable mention All-State.

Stephen Hunter

Inducted: 2019



Class of 2005 Graduate.

Lettermen in Football, Basketball, and Golf. Scored 1148 points in Basketball with 518 career rebounds. Was a member of the 2003 Golf Region Championship team. In football, holds the career interception record (9) and scored 7 TDs and had 862 receiving yards in his career.
