

Spectator Guidelines

Fall Activities 2020
Olathe Public Schools

To ensure the safety of all, the following protocols are in place for all Olathe Public Schools events during the fall season. To attend an event students, staff, and fans will:

1. Be symptom free of Covid-19
2. Conduct a personal temperature check prior to arriving to event (temp must be below 100 degrees)
3. Arrive with hands sanitized
4. Wear a mask upon arrival, throughout the event, and when leaving
5. Social distance by 6' (families may sit closer together)
6. Bring only essential items to the event
7. Not be allowed to interact with teams or be on fields/courts
8. Exit facility immediately following the event
9. Follow additional mitigation protocols that are sport/activity specific
10. Understand that guidelines are subject to change based upon local/state recommendations

Tickets/Attendance

- ✓ Each player receives 4 tickets for varsity football, volleyball, and soccer. There is no cost for these tickets. Tickets are for family members only.
- ✓ Sub-varsity teams will receive 2 tickets per player.
- ✓ Each gymnast receives 2 tickets due to the small size of the facility.
- ✓ Cheer and dance team members receive 4 tickets.
- ✓ Marching band (football) will have their half-time show performed virtually on the videoboard. No tickets issued.
- ✓ Tickets are not required for golf, tennis, cross country.
- ✓ Special passes (Staff ID's, Senior Citizen, & Activity passes) will not be accepted until restrictions are lifted.
- ✓ Students are not allowed to attend unless a family member is participating in the event and must sit with their family.
- ✓ Visiting team members will receive 4 tickets for varsity football, volleyball, and soccer.
- ✓ Visiting gymnastics teams will not receive tickets due to the small size of the facility.
- ✓ Concession stands will not be available.
- ✓ Schools will make efforts to livestream varsity football, volleyball, and soccer.
- ✓ USD 233 reserves the right to not issue a ticket to anyone not willing to follow these guidelines. Staff members have the authority to enforce mitigation protocols.
