Dustin Horter Breaks 1600m State Record

Friday night at Mason, the Rod Russell Mason Invitational took place. As for the Lakota East Boys team, we had Junior Justin Dwyer placing second in the 400m dash with a second week in a row under 50 seconds with a 49.53-simply amazing! Anyone who follows Lakota East track will tell you how much fun it is to see Justin fly around the oval. He has such excellent form and is so speedy!

The night on the whole belonged to Senior Dustin Horter though, as he won the Dream Mile at 10:30 PM after several delays. The Dream Mile is a very special event which pulls in the top runners from all over the state of Ohio. Spectators line the track as each competitor is called and runs down the track to cheering and high fives. This year it included Chad Johnson and Zach Kreft, the D3 and D2 State Champions in the 1600 respectively, as well as many other top competitors. The atmosphere is electric, complete with a hometown roaring crowd. As late as it got, everyone stayed to see history made and to cheer Dustin on as he broke a 33 year old 1600m record that some questioned would ever be broken in the State of Ohio. Dustin's times were 4:03.40 for the 1600m and 4:04.82 for the Mile. The former 1600m record, by Bob Kennedy in 1985, was a 4:05.13. Dustin also broke his own 1600m school and district record of 4:07.52 from 2017, as well as the 1600m Cincinnati city record of 4:07.2 by Mason Ward of Colerain in 2000.

Dustin's Mile time as well as his 1600 m time represent the fastest time run in the country this year, so he is currently US #1 in both, along with being the current US #1 in the 3200m at a time of 8:48.62, which is also a school and city record. Dustin is currently US #4 in the 800, and has established the city record for that this season, breaking Princeton Jason William's record of 1:51.76 in a 1:50.73 at the Wayne Relays last week.
