8/24	Loveland Quad Invite				<p>The Lakota East men's varsity cross country team opened up their 2020 campaign this past Monday at the Loveland Sunset Quad Invitational.</p> <p>The men's team did not run a few key runners but still showed that the team has come a long way since 2019. The East men placed 3 out of 4 teams closely behind very good Loveland and Turpin teams. Junior, Ashton Gibbs has established himself as the Thunderhawk frontrunner this year. He placed 6th overall in the 83-man field with a time of 17:30 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course. Senior Flynn Prather placed 9th overall, setting a lifetime PR of 17:44 on a not-so-fast course. Junior, first-year runner, Will Tenoever placed 12th overall in an incredible debut. His time was 17:54. Rounding out the scoring for the Hawks was the sophomore duo of Aidan Mahaffey (16th, 18:06) and Andrew Gibson (19th, 18:50).</p> <p>Next the East Cross Country Teams will be at the Lebanon Warrior on Saturday, Sept. 5th.</p>

9/5	Warrior Invite	2nd			<p>The men's team for Lakota East continued to show that they plan to make a statement this Fall in the GMC, the District, the Regional, and possibly even the State. The Thunderhawks placed 2nd out of 18 teams at the Lebanon Running Warrior Invitational this past Saturday.</p> <p>Junior, Ashton Gibbs ran a near lifetime best of 16:43 for the 5k (3.1 mile) course to place 7th overall in the 139-man field. Senior, Flynn Prather went under the 17:00 minute mark for the first time, running 16:54 for 10th place. That puts Flynn at #28 on the all-time Lakota East performance list. Junior, first-year runner, Will Tenoever also went sub-17:00 by running 16:57 and placing 11th overall. Will is now in the record books as the 30th fastest Hawk of all-time. The #4 man for East was sophomore Aidan Mahaffey who also ran a personal record time of 17:12 to place 21st overall. The 5th and final scorer for the Hawk men was sophomore Marshall Novean, who ran a personal best time of 17:16 to place 23rd overall. It will be very exciting to see how this team progresses throughout the rest of the Fall.</p> <p>The Thunderhawk men will be resting a few of their varsity runners next week, but the majority of the team will be racing at the Mason Invitational on September 12th.</p>

The sophomore trio of Andrew Gibson (18:49, 73rd), Marshall Novean (18:59, 87th), and Jake Boeskool (19:28, 98th) were the next three finishers for East. Ashton Gibbs, junior, once again led the way for East with his 11th place finish in a personal record time of 16:25.2 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course. That time moves Ashton up to #16 all-time at Lakota East High School.</p> <p>Senior, Flynn Prather also had a personal record performance of 16:37 to place 17th overall. That moves Flynn up to #22 in the Lakota East history books. Yet another personal record went to junior Will Tenoever who placed 23rd overall in 16:51, moving him up to #26 all-time. Sophomore, Aidan Mahaffey dipped under 17:00 for the first time in his career, running 16:59.9 for 27th overall. Aidan joins the all-time list with that performance at #35. The final scorer for East was sophomore Marshall Novean who, you guessed it, ran a personal record of 17:04 to place 31st overall.</p> <p>The Lakota East Junior Varsity teams also emerged victorious on Saturday. The men placed 1st out of 8 teams and were led by sophomore Nick Boeskool who was the overall junior varsity champion with his time of 17:40.8. The women's junior varsity team placed 1st out of 6 teams. They were led by sophomore Hope Keith who ran 21:21 to win the junior varsity race.</p> <p>Next up for Lakota East Cross Country is the Lakota East Fall Classic II at Voice of America park on Saturday, September 26th.</p>
9/26	Lakota East Fall Classic II			<p><u>Lakota East Boys Cross Country Finish 4th at Lakota East Fall Classic II</u></p> <p>The Lakota East boys' cross country team also placed 4th out of 5 teams in an even more competitive field than the girls. Highlighting the performances for the Hawks were juniors Ashton Gibbs and Will Tenoever. Gibbs moves up to #13 all-time at East with his 4th place finish in 16:17.4 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course. Tenoever moved up the history ranks as well, to #22, with his 10th place finish in 16:37. That time matches his senior teammate, Flynn Prather, who repeated his own personal record time of 16:37 on Saturday. Prather placed 11th overall. The sophomore duo of Aidan Mahaffey (31st, 17:26) and Andrew Gibson (36th, 17:37) rounded out the top-5 scorers for the Thunderhawks.</p> <p>Next up for Lakota East Cross Country is the Sycamore Invitational on Saturday evening, October 3rd at Sycamore High School</p>
10/3	Sycamore Invite			<p>The Lakota East boys' cross country team placed 2nd behind Loveland as well, despite not running three of their regular varsity runners. Senior Flynn Prather ran a personal-best time of 16:26.8 to lead the charge for the Hawks, which placed him 5th overall. That impressive performance moves Flynn up to #17 all-time at Lakota East High School.</p> <p>The second runner for East was sophomore Aidan Mahaffey, also running a personal-record time of 16:56 to place 10th overall. That moves Aidan up 5 spots on the all-time list to #30. Junior Haitham Eid was next runner across the line for the Thunderhawks in 14th place, running 17:18. Rounding out the scoring for Lakota East was sophomore Andrew Gibson (16th, 17:21) and junior Brandon Moore (19th, 17:25).</p> <p>Next Up for the Lakota East Junior Varsity cross country team is the Ross Invitational on October 10th. 8/24	Loveland Quad Invite				<p>The Lakota East women's varsity cross country team opened up their 2020 campaign this past Monday at the Loveland Sunset Quad Invitational.</p> <p>The women's team was also not running a fully healthy varsity squad, but they still placed a very respectable 2nd out of 4 teams behind a very good Loveland squad. Seniors Kelsi Harris and Carly Spletzer showed they were forces to be reckoned with in 2020 by placing 3rd and 4th overall in a 110-girl field. Their times of 19:22 and 19:33 for the 5k (3.1-mile course) were a great place to start for the season on a course that was not producing many fast times. Junior, first-year runner, Dani Thorner placed 9th overall in a time of 20:48. Rounding out the top 5 scorers for the Lady Hawks were freshman Jocy Willis (14th, 21:15) and junior Sarah Renfro (15th, 21:21).</p> <p>Next the East Cross Country Teams will be at the Lebanon Warrior on Saturday, Sept. 5th.</p>

In these situations, other runners are called upon to step up for the team, and that they did! The Thunderhawk women actually were in a 3-way tie for 1st place out of 14 teams, which is an extremely rare situation. Based on the 6th runners' placings, Lakota East wound up officially in 3rd place.</p> <p>Senior Carly Spletzer ran fearlessly, placing 2nd overall in a huge season-best performance, and one of her top career performances, of 18:42 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course. There were 115 total runners in the field. Senior Kelsi Harris was the #2 runner for East, running tough despite not</p>

				<p>having her best day, placing 8th overall in 19:35. Junior, first-year runner, Dani Thorner learned a lot from her first race last week and knocked over a minute off of her time, to place 10th overall in 19:47. That is also the 25th fastest women's time in Lakota East history. Sophomore, Jocey Willis also knocked over a minute off of her time from the previous race as she bounces back from injury. She placed 12th overall in 20:12. Rounding out the top 5 scorers for the Hawks was junior Sarah Renfro, who went above and beyond her strategy requirements to place 17th overall in 20:25.</p> <p>The women's varsity team will be idle next week, however the rest of the team will be competing at the Mason Invitational on September 12th.</p>
9/12	Mason Invite	15th		<p>The Mason Invitational on September 12th was an opportunity for some of the Lakota East junior varsity cross country athletes to get some high quality varsity experience. They also got a taste of a true cross country course, in very hot conditions, that included two creek crossings, a very steep mulch hill, and many challenging rolling hills as well. The times were slower on Saturday but the Thunderhawks ran like warriors.</p> <p>The women's team placed 15th and were led by sophomore Hope Keith who placed 92nd in the 140-runner field. Her time was 23:06 for the 5k (3.1-mile course). The next two runners across the line were the sister duo of Sophie and Brooke Wilson who placed 117th (24:23) and 122nd (24:32) overall. The Lady Thunderhawks edged out conference-rival Mason by 1-point to win the 19-team competition at the Valley View Nature Preserve.</p> <p>Senior, Carly Spletzer was the overall women's champion in the 141-runner field. Carly's amazing time of 18:14.4 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course is a personal record as well as the 2nd fastest time ever run by a Lakota East girl. Lindsay Zinn's 17:28 from the year 2000 is the only performance better than Carly's in the record book. Senior, Kelsi Harris ran a 35-second season best to place 5th overall in a time of 18:47. Junior, Dani Thorner was next across the finish line for East. Thorner placed 11th overall in time of 19:25 which moves her up to #18 all-time at Lakota East. Sophomore, Jocey Willis continued her weekly progressions by placing 17th overall in a time of 19:51. The individual race saw 2 of the top 3 women in the State, Faith Duncan (Lebanon) and Carly Spletzer (Lakota East) going head to head for the 2nd time this Fall. Duncan took the 1st place overall honors in a time of 17:50, which is now the #1 time in the State. Spletzer was not far behind in 2nd place with her personal-record time of 18:11.3 for the 5k (3.1-mile) course, the State's current #3 time. That mark also improves Spletzer's 2nd fastest time in Lakota East history. Junior, Dani Thorner, was the next Hawk across the line in 18th place, with a time of 19:50. QB TJ Kathman led the list rushing for 86 yards and throwing for 97 yards. Josh Thornhill rushed for 88 yards and a TD. Jack Hartman caught 2 TD passes. Eric Davis and Jordell Smith both scored rushing TD's.</p> <p>The Hawks (3-3, 3-2 GMC) will look towards the postseason now. East will host Sycamore (1-4) in a first round GMC battle. The Aves didn't play this past weekend. They defeated East 34-31 in the season opener.</p> <p>The winner of Friday's matchup will play either Lakota West or West Clermont in the next round.</p>
10/9	PLAYOFFS vs. Sycamore	won	28-10	4-3	3-2	<p>For the 2nd time this season Lakota East met Sycamore on the gridiron. After losing to Sycamore by a field goal to start its season, Lakota East wanted to set the tone of the two teams' first-round playoff game Friday in Liberty Township. The Hawks made sure this game had a different outcome.</p> <p>On the first offensive snap for the Thunderhawks, running back Charlie Kenrich ran for a season-long 73 yards to set up first-and-goal. Three plays later, Kenrich's first rushing TD of the year gave Lakota East a lead they would not relinquish over the final 45 minutes en route to a 28-10 victory.</p> <p>Kenrich was the story of the first half as the 6-foot-3 junior ran for 80 yards and a score on four attempts. He also leaked out of the backfield and hauled in an eight-yard touchdown pass from TJ Kathman with 1:26 left in the first half to give Lakota East a 21-10 advantage at the intermission.</p> <p>Kathman, who had the most passing touchdowns (9) in a regular season by a Lakota East quarterback since 2005, used his legs to take over in the final two quarters. In the second half, the junior signal-caller ran nine times for 100 yards to finish with a season-high 134.</p> <p>Sycamore mounted a drive deep into Lakota East territory late in the third quarter. On the first play of the fourth quarter ran to the Lakota East 10, where he was stripped. Lakota East's Josh Thornhill, who had an interception in three straight games prior to the postseason, leaped on the discharged pigskin for the game's only turnover.</p> <p>Kathman proceeded to run five times for 79 yards on Lakota East's ensuing drive, setting up Jordell Smith's three-yard TD run with 8:34 left in regulation to put the game away.</p> <p>As a team, Lakota East's triple-option attack churned out 320 yards on the ground and averaged 8.4 per attempt. Thornhill ran for 71 yards on five carries and fullback Eric Davis added 19.</p> <p>In his 11th season at the helm of the Thunderhawks, head coach Rick Haynes has been on the sidelines of every playoff game in program history and improved to 4-3 with the win. Lakota East is a perfect 4-0 in first-round contests, but have never advanced past the second round.</p> <p>The Thunderhawks will head just eight miles south to face rival Lakota West in the second round Oct. 16. The unbeaten and state-ranked Firebirds handled West Clermont Friday, 44-0. Next Fridays winner will meet either Mason or Colerain in the Regional Semi-Final on Friday, Oct. 23rd.</p>
