

CONCORD ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2019

Crystal Brim Cleveland: Crystal is a 1999 graduate of Concord High School. While at Concord, she earned nine varsity letters in volleyball, basketball and track and received the 1999 Athlete of the Year award. Crystal played volleyball all four years lettering in two of those seasons. As a senior, she was named captain and led her team to both the Northern Lakes Conference and sectional championships under Coach Jim Routhier. That same year she was named to the All-Northern Lakes Conference team. Crystal played basketball all four years lettering in three of those seasons under Coach Lyle Gaff. She was named team captain her junior year and earned the Best Defensive Player Award as a senior.

Crystal also ran track all four years and lettered each season. She was named team captain both her junior and senior years. Crystal competed in four events each meet: the 3200 meter relay, 400 meter dash, 200 meter dash, and the 1600 meter relay. Her sophomore year, Crystal won the 1600 meter relay regional championship with Jaime Marshall, Nikki Kelly and Stacey Peterson. Her junior year she helped lead the team on a dream run during Coach Craig Shafer's last and lucky number 13th year, winning the Goshen Relays, the Northern Lakes Conference championship, and the sectional championship. Crystal attributes much of her track success to Coach Dave Juday's workouts and to her training partner Stacey Peterson, a 1998 graduate and 2012 CHS Athletic Hall of Fame inductee.

After graduating from Concord, Crystal attended Campbell University on a presidential academic and athletic scholarship. She played volleyball at Campbell all four years, earning varsity letters each year. She completed her junior year ranked 22nd in the nation in digs per game for NCAA Division I volleyball. She was named the 2002-2003 Atlantic Sun Conference Student-Athlete of the Year, and was also named to the 2002-2003 Verizon Academic All-American Team. Crystal graduated Campbell with a 4.0 GPA in Spanish with teaching licensure. She was one of fifty students in the nation to earn a 2003 Phi Kappa Phi Graduate Fellowship and attended Indiana University, Bloomington to earn a master's degree in Latin American Studies in 2005.

Crystal has served as the Department Chair of World Languages at several high schools and taught Spanish language and literature courses for the past 15 years. Crystal has traveled to over 30 countries, has published two articles with the American Association on the Teaching of Foreign Languages, and has presented at numerous academic conferences. Crystal lives in Charleston, South Carolina with her husband Joseph and their two daughters Charlotte Jane (2) and Isabel Rose (1).

Brant Fowler: Brant is a 2000 graduate of Concord High School. While at Concord he earned ten varsity letters in football, basketball and golf.

Brant played football all four years lettering in three of those seasons. His senior year he was a team captain while playing quarterback, middle linebacker, kicker, and punter. He was named All-Northern Lake Conference, Academic All-State, Team MVP Special Teams (three years), Team Mental Attitude winner, WFRN Mental Attitude winner, South Bend Tribune 4A Kicker, and the Marvin Wood Student Athlete of the Year. He was a member of the 1998 State Runner-up team.

Brant also played basketball all four years and earned three varsity letters. He was a team captain his senior year.

Brant played golf all four years as well, lettering in all of those seasons. He was named All-Northern Lakes Conference all four years and was Academic All-State his senior year. He helped the team to an NLC championship in 1997 and a sectional championship in 1998. Brant was also the salutatorian of his graduating class with a 3.98 GPA.

After graduating from Concord High School, Brant attended Bethel College on a golf and academic scholarship. Brant lettered all four years at Bethel. He earned All-Conference honors his sophomore year.

In 2003, while still in college, Brant began working for LeMaster Steel Erectors in Elkhart, IN. He transferred to their Noblesville office in 2008 and became the General Manager of that office in 2011. He is currently the Vice President at LeMaster Steel Erectors. He resides in Noblesville with his wife Maile and their two daughters Gabby (13) and Olivia (11).

Marvin Roush: Marv Roush, a 1966 graduate, was a three-year starter and while playing both offense and defense for the football team he earned three varsity letters. At that time Concord didn't have their own football field, so all games were played at Elkhart's Rice Field.

Marvin also earned two varsity letters playing basketball. He averaged 17 points per game, was the top scorer his senior year, led in rebounds, was MVP and ended with a total of 662 career points. He played junior varsity for Abe

Hoogenboom. His highlight was winning the JV County Championship. The team got to not only cut the net down but also a piece of Coach Hoogenboom's necktie as he had promised before the tourney started. Marv has ever since carried that piece in his billfold. Abe was a great coach, mentor and friend. Other influential coaches were Lee Perry his junior year and Max Eby his senior year.

After graduating from Concord, Marv went on to play basketball at Martin Methodist College in Tennessee. As a freshman and sophomore he was voted MVP. After his junior year in college he married another Concord grad and longtime girlfriend, Judy Stout. They spent the next two years in Pennsylvania doing volunteer work at a boys' home.

Eventually things came full circle and Marv was back at Concord. He followed his father, Dwight Roush, and grandfather, Henry Roush, and became a bus driver in 1982. In January of 1989 he was named Concord's first Transportation Director. During that time, he worked closely with the athletic department and coaches to make sure they got to their contests on time. After nearly 23 years as director he decided to retire in 2011.

Since retirement, Marv has enjoyed farming, traveling, and attending his grandchildren's activities. He and Judy have two children, Trent and Heather. Trent and his wife Jenny are 1991 Concord graduates. They have two boys Gavin (2017 Concord graduate) and Garrett. Heather (1992 Concord graduate), a teacher at Concord Junior High, and her husband, Dave Brunswick, have four children, Alexandra, Justin, Troy and Andrew. Beginning next fall all six grandchildren will be the third generation at Concord.

Josh Staley: Josh is a 2000 Graduate of Concord High School. While at Concord he earned nine Varsity letters, 3 each in basketball, football, and track. Josh helped Concord reach the 1998 Class 4A state championship game and a number one state ranking in 1999 as a part of the football team. He was also named to the NLC all conference football teams in both 1998 and 1999. In 1999 he was named to the IFCA Academic All-State team as well as named a team captain.

Josh also played basketball for four years at Concord earning three varsity letters starting as a sophomore, junior, and senior. He also earned three letters in track participating in long jump, shot put, and sprints of various distances.

After Concord Josh attended Taylor University in Upland, Indiana to play football where he graduated in 2004. While at Taylor he earned four varsity letters in football. He started a total of 39 out of 40 games in his Taylor career and was named MFCA All-Conference in each of his four seasons. Josh also still holds both the career and single season records for sacks and tackles for loss. Josh was named Conference Player of the Week and NAIA National Player of the Week during his career. His other awards at Taylor include Taylor University Male Athlete of the Year in 2004, Davie O'Brien Award as the top linemen in 2003, and NAIA First Team All-American in 2003.

Josh was inducted into the Elkhart County Sports Hall of Fame in 2016 and Taylor University Sports Hall of Fame in 2017. Currently he lives in Goshen with his wife Heather and his two daughters Willow and Livia. Josh has been in the RV Industry for 15 years and is currently a General Manager at Dutchmen RV which is part of the Keystone RV group.

Wendy Clem Wolfe: Wendy is a 1974 graduate of Concord High School. While at Concord she earned eight varsity letters in volleyball, basketball, tennis, and track. Wendy was also named MVP tennis in 1973, and MVP in volleyball and basketball in 1973 and 1974. She was honorary captain of volleyball and basketball in 1974. She also earned state honors in 1974 from the Girl's Athletic Association.

After high school, Wendy first attended Calvin College in Grand Rapids Michigan where she played volleyball, basketball and softball. In her junior year she transferred to Purdue University where she made the women's basketball team. However, at that point she found herself at a crossroads; either stay in sports and take less course hours or accelerate her college major work and start a career. She ended her participation in college sports and pursued career ambitions.

Wendy graduated from Purdue University with a major in mass communications and began a broadcast career back in her hometown of Elkhart working at WSJV-TV. Two years later she accepted a job at KRDO-TV in Colorado Springs and soon advanced to Denver to work at KUSA-TV.

In 1986, a former colleague from WSJV who had become a Marketing Vice President for the Walt Disney Company encouraged her to consider a job at Disney in Florida. The Walt Disney Company was building a television and movie studio and needed professionals with broadcasting experience. In 1987, Wendy joined Disney and met her soon to be husband in Disney Traditions her second day on the job. Wendy and Jack were married in 1988 and one year later were transferred to Paris, France to work on the opening of Disneyland Paris. They lived in Paris three years and returned to

Disney in Orlando in 1993. Wendy was promoted to Vice President of Parks and Resorts Marketing responsible for events and on-site marketing.

In 1995, Wendy and Jack made a lifestyle decision to relocate in Breckenridge, Colorado to live and work in a beautiful mountain resort town. For several years, Wendy returned to the Broadcast industry to work for Gannet as Corporate Vice President of Marketing. She traveled extensively until 1999 when she and Jack adopted an infant son. To stay closer to home, Wendy left Gannet and worked part-time as a marketing consultant. Her projects ranged from working with the NFL evaluating a new entertainment venture to working with an upscale interior designer in the Vail Valley.

In 2011, Wendy was encouraged to campaign for a seat on the Breckenridge Town Council. She was elected to her first term in 2012 and was re-elected in 2016. Wendy is now in her 8th and final year as an elected official. Wendy, Jack and their son, Alex, continue to reside in Breckenridge where they ski, hike and ride mountain bikes and never miss a day of taking in the majestic view of the beautiful Rocky Mountains.
