

THE NORMAN J. HUBNER ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Eddie Dubbs was a three sport athlete who graduated in 1990. His team accomplishments are 1990 Sectional basketball champions and 1990 State baseball champions. His most memorable experience was winning the State baseball championship as a member of that team and also being awarded the L.V. Phillips mental attitude at the same State championship. He was awarded seven varsity letters in three years of varsity competition. In 1989 he was All-Conference in football for the Duneland Athletic Conference. In that same season, he was the recipient of the Dr. Gardner Mental Attitude Award.

Eddie credits his older brothers for always taking him with them to various athletic contests and therefore fostering his interest and desire to play these various sports. He also noted coaches Pat O'Neil and Roger Lowe for being great motivators. Eddie's impact on local sports has lasted much longer than just his playing days. He has served as a coach in various sports at various levels over the years. He has coached Pop Warner Football, Babe Ruth and KVA Baseball, and Kesling Middle School Football.
