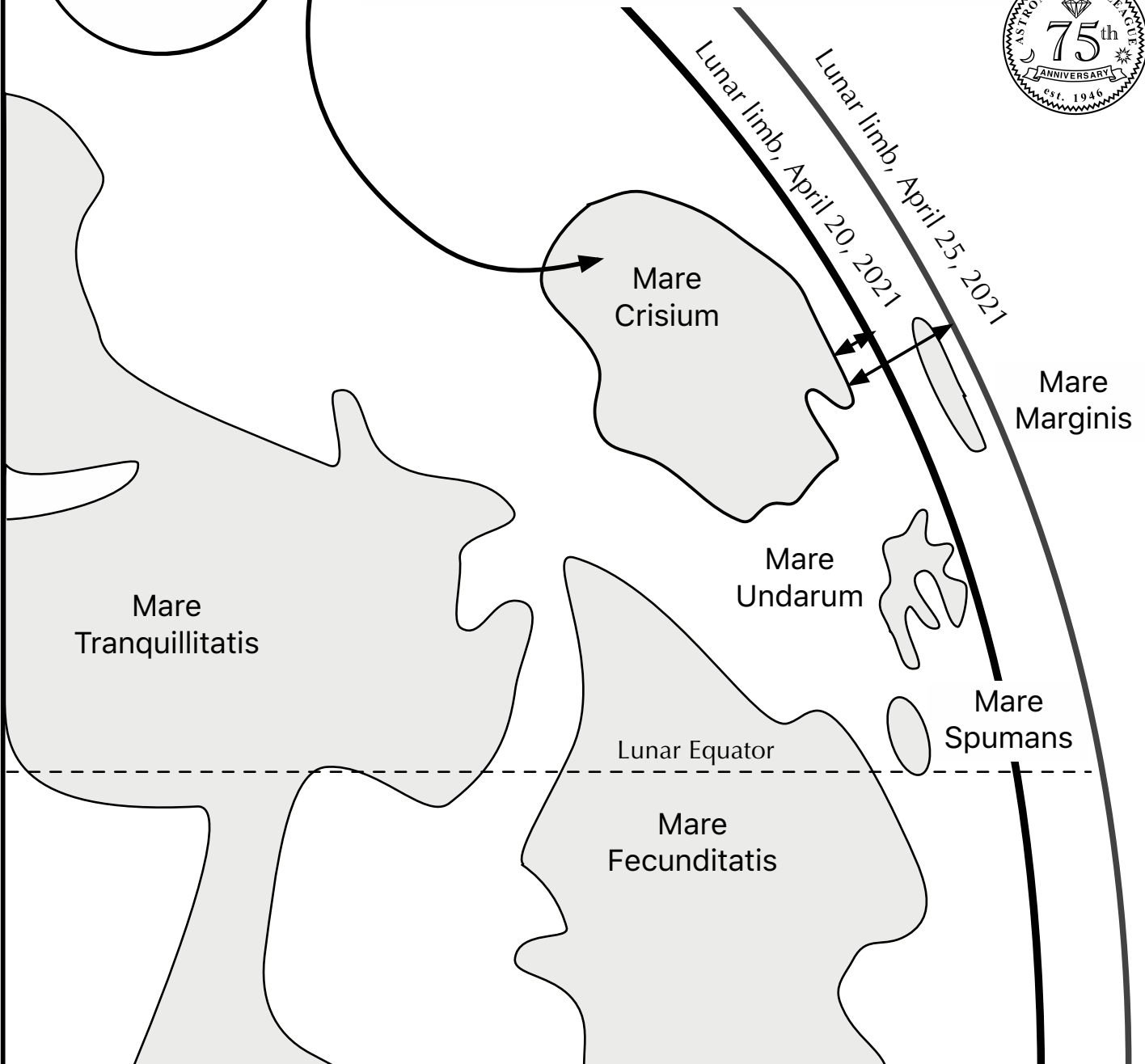


Lunar Eastern Libration: near Mare Crisium, at the eastern edge of the Moon



With binoculars or a small telescope, look just north of the lunar equator along the eastern edge of the lunar disk for the large dark-floored Mare Crisium. Note how far it lies from the limb. That distance should noticeably change between April 20 and 25. Using a small telescope, Mare Marginis will still be beyond the rim. It will be visible on June 23.
