PARENT'S CORNER

Lesson Aim: I should let God's Word show me how to live.

Lesson Scripture: Luke 15:11-32

Memory Verse: Psalm 119:105

Truth: God's word teaches us how to live.

In-Home Experience: Ask your kids a series of questions such as, "Would I still love you if you ate all my chocolate?" or, "Would I still love you if you broke my favorite coffee mug?" The answer is "Yes!" Explain that God is even better at loving than a parent because he is perfect and that there is nothing anyone could do that is so bad that could make God stop loving them.
