1. ICE-BREAKER QUESTION: What living creature do you find most fascinating?

2. PRAYER REQUESTS AND PRAYER TIME:

Here are some suggested prayer prompts if kids have a hard time thinking of something to pray for:

*If Jesus were sitting next to you right now, what would you say to him?

*Do you have a friend or family member who is sick or needs help with something?

*Did anything happen this week that you didn't like? Is there something you are worried about? Is there something you can ask God for help with?

*What is something in your life that you can thank God for?

"Suppose you can be trusted with something very little. Then you can also be trusted with something very large." Luke 16:10a, NIrV


4. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS & BIBLE PRACTICE:

- Have kids use their table of contents to find the book of Proverbs. Is it in the Old Testament or New Testament? *Old*
- Find Proverbs chapter 6 (big number); verses 6-8 (little numbers).
- Have your child read Proverbs 6:6-8 out loud.

"You people who don't want to work, think about the ant! Consider its ways and be wise! It has no commander. It has no leader or ruler. But it stores up its food in summer. It gathers its food at harvest time."

- According to this verse, what creature should we think about as an example of working hard? *The ant*
- What does the verse tell us about ants? *They don't have a commander, leader or ruler; they store food and gather food without being told by a leader or ruler*
- What would happen if one of those ants suddenly stopped working? What would happen if 20 or 100 or 500 hundred stopped? *Those ant colonies wouldn't function well at all if each ant didn't pull its own weight.*
- Responsibility is showing you can be trusted with what is expected of you. It means you need to carry your own load, to do your own part.
- This week, when you're given a responsibility—whether big or small—think about that ant. Work hard and do your part so others will trust you!
