### WORKING WITH YOUR SCHOOL BOARD

WELCOME to another Twin Falls School District Board of Trustees Meeting. You are encouraged to attend all regular board meetings.

We are proud of our school system and the board members are dedicated to the continued improvement of the Twin Falls Schools.

We understand that from time to time patrons of school districts have concerns and feel a need to bring those concerns to the attention of the school or teachers. In order to maintain continuity and best resolve these concerns, we recommend to our patrons the following procedures:

- 1. The first and most effective step is to take the concern to the staff member who is closest to the problem. (In many cases this will be the teacher, coach, etc.) We have found that most problems are resolved at this level.
- 2. If there is still a concern on the matter, we then recommend that the concern be brought to the attention of the Principal. We have found that unresolved concerns from item #1 are usually resolved satisfactorily by the building administrator.
- If the concern is not satisfactorily resolved at that level, then the concern should be taken to the Director of Elementary Programs 3. or Director of Secondary Programs.
- If the concern is not satisfactorily resolved at that level, then the concern should be taken to the Superintendent of Schools. 4. Difficult concerns can usually be resolved.
- 5. However, if the patron still feels the concern has not been properly resolved he/she may use the right of appeal to the Board of Trustees. This is done by calling or writing to the Superintendent and asking for the item to be placed on the agenda of the next regularly scheduled board meeting.
- If you desire to address the board, we would like you to be as comfortable as possible. As a board we hold public meetings 6. which are not public forums and therefore have rules which are necessary for the benefit of all. The following guidelines will assist you as you present your information to the board.
  - Prepare your thoughts ahead of time. Usually a brief written outline handed to each board member helps the board follow your presentation. This outline would also give them something upon which to make notes as you speak.
- В. If a group is involved, select one individual to be your spokesperson. He/she can then guide the presentation with the board and help the board chairman in directing questions to the group.
- Plan your presentation to be as brief as possible. This should include a question/answer period. If more time is needed it is best C. to give a complete written presentation to the board for their future study. If you give more than five to six minutes of testimony, time restraints will make it difficult for the board to respond that same evening.
- D. Usually the board will direct the administration to help resolve the concerns and ask for a report back to the board at a later date. However, please remember a solution may take time to be resolved.

We are eager to have our patrons and school staff working together for the improvement of education in the Twin Falls Schools.

The following trustees were present: Chairman Bernie Jansen, and Trustees Bryan Matsuoka, Mary Barron, Paul McClintock, and Todd Hubbard. There were also present Superintendent, Brady Dickinson; Associate Superintendent, Bill Brulotte; and Board Clerk, Michelle Lucas, as well as district directors, interested patrons, and employees.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance The Board of Trustees stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
- III. Procedural Matters Action Items
- 1. Approval of Agenda (Additions and Deletions) Chairman Jansen asked if there were any additions or deletions to the agenda. There was none. Trustee Barron moved to approve the agenda as proposed. Trustee McClintock seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- <u>IV.</u> <u>Unscheduled Delegations (Audience to Address the Board) Chairman Jansen asked if there was anyone wishing to address the Board. There was no one.</u>

A/B. Superintendent Dickinson announced the certified employee of the month from Robert Stuart Middle School for the month of March as Todd Anderson, STEM teacher and from South Hills Middle School, Amy Nelson, 8<sup>th</sup> grade ELA teacher. Superintendent Dickinson

announced the classified employee of the month from Robert Stuart Middle School as Irene Haney, SpEd paraprofessional and from South Hills Middle School as Dixie Clements, SpEd IRC paraprofessional. Superintendent Dickinson read a brief resume' and presented each Mr. Anderson, Ms. Nelson, Ms. Haney, and Ms. Clements with a gift, plaque, and gift certificates for either Maxie's Pizza or Gertie's Brick Oven Cookery. Mr. Anderson, Ms. Nelson, Ms. Haney, and Ms. Clements thanked the board for the honor.

- C. Superintendent Dickinson announced that Twin Falls High School was recognized for having 100 years of continuous accreditation. Dr. Dickinson presented Principal of Twin Falls High School, Dan Vogt with a certificate and a large banner from Advanced Education. Only two other schools in the state of Idaho have been accredited for 100 years, Caldwell and Pocatello.

### VII. Instruction B. Action Items:

1. Director of Secondary Programs, L.T. Erickson recapped the information presented at the February 11, 2019 board meeting requesting to add a yoga curse to Canyon Ridge High School curriculum. Dr. Erickson stood for questions on the proposal. After a brief discussion, Trustee McClintock moved to approve this yoga course for Canyon Ridge High School. Trustee Barron seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

### VIII. Budget & Finance A. Information Items:

- 1. Director of Fiscal Affairs, Bob Seaman and Finance Accountant, Rachel Youren gave a presentation to the Board outlining the districts finance goals, general fund balance, organizational expenditures, salary revenues vs. expenditures, benefits revenues vs. expenditures, and FTE numbers compared to the state standards. Mr. Seaman explained that the general fund balance spike on the chart in 2015 was from holding over curriculum money to the following year to purchase math adoption curriculum in 2016. Ms. Youren shared information that showed the total net excess in salary expenditures over the State salaries reimbursement totaling \$5,874,434.77; of that amount, \$3,806,230.31 is spent on noncertified staff, \$1,319,283.03 is for instructional and pupil services, and \$748,921.43 is for administrators. Mr. Seaman reiterated how much districts now rely on discretionary money and supplemental levies to survive. Currently we have 8 days carryover in the general fund.
- 2. The board reviewed bid recommendations from Purchasing Agent, Sheila Rinehart for janitorial, general office and paper supplies.
- 3. Director of Educational Technology and Operations, Ryan Bowman shared background information on the need for fiber optic connectivity from the district office to twelve (12) of our schools. The lease of these fiber connections is contingent upon funding approval by the Federal E-Rate program. The district expects that the E-Rate program and the State of Idaho will pay 80% of the construction costs and 60% of the lease costs. Administration recommends approval of the bid proposal as submitted.

### VIII. Budget & Finance B. Action Items:

- 1. Trustee McClintock moved to approve janitorial supply bids as recommended for a total of \$109,518.72; general/office supply bids for a total of \$4,330.53; and paper supply bids for a total of \$116,962.35 as proposed by Purchasing Agent Sheila Rinehart. Trustee Hubbard seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Trustee McClintock moved to accept the bid proposal as outlined by Technology Coordinator, Brett Keller in the amount of \$396,000 for total construction cost, \$79,200 for expected discounted construction cost, \$3,000 for total monthly lease (5-10 years) and \$1,200 expected district discounted monthly lease. Vice Chairman Matsuoka seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

### VI. Building Board Reports

1. Principal of Robert Stuart Middle School, Amy McBride shared some highlights which included exceptional growth indicators for 6<sup>th</sup> grade and above average in 7<sup>th</sup> grade for science. Mrs. McBride shared performance goals and priorities. As for a couple challenges, Mrs. McBride shared that finding time to collaborate as a team is difficult, a late start would help in this area. Late starts will help give time for collaboration. Robert Stuart's building report was included in the board packet. After a few minutes of discussion with the Board, Mrs. McBride thanked the board for the opportunity to share information about her school.

- 2. Principal of South Hills Middle School, Ryan Ellsworth started his report sharing his goals for his school. He commented that his goal again this year is to increase another 2% and continue to build interventions and support. Mr. Ellsworth shared some highlights and challenges for South Hills Middle School. One challenge has been the difficulty providing common prep time for planning and implementing strategies. His building report was included in the board packet. After a few minutes of discussion with the Board, Mr. Ellsworth thanked the board for the opportunity to share information about his school.
- 3. Principal of Bridge Academy, Jim Brown shared a few challenges and followed up with some bright spots for Bridge Academy. His building report was included in the board packet. He shared that his goal is to get every student to phase three (3) or higher. A couple challenges are having paraeducator turnover and having a guest teacher shortage which pulls him away to cover classes. Dr. Brown is very grateful for having a capacity teacher which helps enhance staffing needs. After a few minutes of roundtable discussion with the Board, Dr. Brown thanked the board for the opportunity to share information about his school.
- 4. Principal of O'Leary Middle School, Ace Marcellus shared some highlights and challenges for O'Leary Middle School. His building report was included in the board packet. A couple bright spots Mr. Marcellus shared are that 98.3% of attempted credits were earned, 31% drop in major/minor incidents reported, and over \$17,000 collected for upgrading technology. After a few minutes of roundtable discussion with the Board, Mr. Marcellus thanked the board for the opportunity to share information about his school.

The District, through the Superintendent as its designee, may enter into contracts with private service providers and/or consultants to provide necessary services to students." In no event shall such agreement exceed twelve (12) calendar months."



### FIXED PRICE CONTRACT

This is a contract between TWIN FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT 411 (hereinafter referred to as TFSD), 201 Main Avenue W, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301 and EDUCATION NORTHWEST, 101 SW Main Street, Suite 500, Portland, Oregon 97204, for the performance of work set forth below.

### 1.0 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

1.1 The purpose of this agreement is to create a through-line from the district office to the elementary classroom, ensuring a well-defined, evidence-based approach to literacy instruction to create coherence between literacy leaders (instructional coaches, principals, and district administrators) and teachers, and optimize the use of curricular materials.

### 2.0 EDUCATION NORTHWEST AGREES TO:

- 2.1 Provide the services under the direction of Steve Underwood. Whenever, for any reason, this individual is unavailable for assignment for the work required under this contract, Education Northwest shall immediately notify the TFSD to that effect and shall replace such person with a person of substantially equal ability and qualifications.
- 2.2 Conduct a series of planning meetings with the director of elementary programs and elementary principals and coaches to lay the groundwork, create goals and develop plans for implementation.
- 2.3 Provide three (3) onsite visits with the district, principals and coaches to provide support and monitor progress.
- 2.4 Participate in planning of district institute to take place August 2019.
- 2.5 Provide coaching and other onsite support for implementation.
- 2.6 Provide one (1) onsite follow-up coaching visit to the district's nine elementary schools to support the literacy leaders in the change process.

### 3.0 TFSD AGREES TO:

- 3.1 Pay Education Northwest the fixed price of \$151,500 to carry out the scope of work specified in 2.0 above.
- 3.2 Designate and make known to Education Northwest one individual to act as contact person and liaison with Education Northwest.
- 3.3 Provide on-site facilities, staff support and written and visual materials that are necessary for Education Northwest to complete the scope of work specified in 2.0 above.

### 4.0 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 4.1 The period of performance of this agreement shall be from February 15, 2019 to June 30, 2019.
- 4.2 This shall be a fixed price agreement in the amount of \$151,500.

- 4.3 No alteration or variation of the terms of this contract and no understandings or agreements not incorporated herein, unless made in writing between the parties hereto, shall be binding.
- 4.4 In performing services under this agreement Education Northwest is an independent contractor and nothing herein is to be construed as establishing an employer-employee relationship. Education Northwest agrees that all work will be performed in accordance with the highest professional standards.
- 4.5 All materials produced under the terms of this contract shall become the property of TFSD. TFSD hereby grants Education Northwest a nonexclusive license to use these products in carrying out future educational work with other state and local school districts.
- In carrying out the work described in 1.0 above, individually identifiable student records may be shared by TFSD with Education Northwest starting on the effective date of this agreement. Education Northwest agrees to comply with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) by ensuring that the confidential information obtained in any form will be maintained and transmitted in a secure manner, in compliance with Education Northwest Procedure 303-5, Maintaining Security of Personally Identifiable Student and Family Information. Such data will be used only for the purposes of this agreement as stated in 1.0 above and only by representatives of Education Northwest who need access to fulfill these stated purposes. Education Northwest will not disclose any information in a personally identifiable way and will appropriately dispose of these records within 90 days of the completion of the contract.
- 4.7 The parties hereby agree that no qualified person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, national origin, disability, or gender, be excluded from or denied participation in, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any activity performed pursuant to this contract. There must be evidence that the contractor is an equal employment opportunity employer as defined by Presidential Executive Orders 11246 (Equal Employment Opportunity) and 13201 (Employee Relations).

- 4.8 Each party affirms that it will maintain business insurance during the term of this agreement as may be required by federal, state, or local laws.
- 4.9 Each party shall protect, indemnify, and save the other harmless from and against any damage, cost or liability for any or all injuries to persons or property arising from negligent acts or omissions of itself, its employees, its agents, or its Subcontractors, howsoever caused.
- 4.10 This agreement may be terminated by the mutual, written consent of both parties. Upon termination, Education Northwest shall stop work. Education Northwest shall be reimbursed for costs incurred to date of termination upon submission of an invoice within sixty (60) days of the date of termination.




# FTE Allowance by School
