The opinion of value conclusion for the subject real estate involves a reconciliation of the previous indications of value which are regarded to meaningfully contribute to this appraisal assignment. The valuation analyses are described in detail elsewhere in this report together with a statement explaining the exclusion of any of the three traditional valuation methods. Consideration of these valuation analyses along with professional judgement forms the basis for an opinion of value.

LOCATION DESCRIPTION

(See Neighborhood and Aerial Maps in Addendum)

The subject's neighborhood has, since it was originally developed in the early 1900's, always been recognized as the "Downtown Business District." Early on, commercial uses tended to locate near the number one corner of Main and Shoshone. This is still true today, but the Second Avenues are also desirable locations due to the traffic count. Though Blue Lakes Boulevard North now commands higher rents and prices, the downtown still remains viable for existing structures.

In any event, it is unlikely that there will be much construction of new retail buildings for the foreseeable future. One bright spot is the conversion of older warehouse buildings into office/retail space. Several of these conversions have been done over the last few years and it is likely that this trend will continue. Some buildings have been torn down, or are in the process of being replaced with newer, larger buildings.

The neighborhood is well liked by the population of the city. It boasts a large professional work force and support and service companies such as restaurants. It has been mostly stable in terms of rents, values and vacancies, but this is changing. Retail shops tend to be housed in smaller structures. Renewed interest in the subject neighborhood is being experienced and this should continue as the rents and values are inexpensive when compared to alternative properties on Blue Lakes Boulevard. As demand increases in downtown, it is likely that values and rents will rise. This also will have a tendency to lower vacancy rates.

Reasonable proximity to parking is a plus, distant or inadequate parking is a detriment. On-site parking, however, will be viewed in a positive light. As a majority of the city population is in favor of the city helping keep downtown viable, it is likely it will continue to be a vital part of the community. It is doubtful, however, that any major retail structures will be built here in the immediate future. Some trend of conversion from warehouse to office/retail will occur as the needs of the area's commercial community dictate. The downtown area has experienced some growth of new office buildings, i.e., several new office buildings and banks have been constructed or remodeled the past few years. Several warehouses have been converted to other uses such as retail stores, restaurants, and a 3-story building was remodeled into a condo/office building. This demand continues as several projects are in the inquiry stage or on the "drawing board".

LOCATION DESCRIPTION, CONTINUED

The property being appraised is located in the central portion of downtown Twin Falls. The immediate area consists of a mixture of commercial uses, such as small retail stores, restaurants, a mixture of professional office users, and a considerable amount of other service providers. This area enjoys a great deal of local traffic, Second Avenue West is U.S. Highway 30. This traffic traverses through the neighborhood and passes on the front of the subject property on a one-way street going east. This area shows strong values and demand due to the strong economy.

Conclusions:

The neighborhood is currently showing a trend to strong rents and values. In comparison to other similar areas in Twin Falls, the subject neighborhood is considered good near the subject. This area is known as the business community downtown Twin Falls as it is one block to the center of town.

SITE DESCRIPTION

(See Photos, Site Maps, Flood Map and Zoning Map in the Addendum)

According to the Assessor's records and inspection, the subject site is situated at the northwest corner of Gooding Street West and Second Avenue West. It has 75' of frontage along Gooding Street and 100' to the west along the alley, for a total of 7,500 s.f. There is curb, gutter, and sidewalks. It is zoned CB (Central Business) with a parking overlay by the city of Twin Falls. It is not located in a flood zone.

Surrounding the building in all directions is a mixture of commercial, retail, apartments, offices, and single family residences. Immediately east across the street is an office/retail facility; to the north, south and east are office buildings and residential uses.

DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS

(See Photos, Assessor's Sketch, and Floor Plan in Addendum)

According to the Assessor's records, inspection, and floor plans provided by the Realtor, the main floor contains approximately 5,380 s.f., plus a small basement of no value.

The building has stucco over brick siding, and the roof is a built-up mop asphalt roof.

The entryway has tile floor with glass doors. There are three heating systems: the main system is a gas force warm air unit; and two are wall-mounted systems. There are painted wallboard walls and ceilings throughout the building with ceiling-mounted four foot, 4-tube fixtures. The main floor has several offices throughout. Most all of the rooms are the same; they have wall-to-wall carpet, and painted wallboard walls pretty much throughout. There are two main restrooms. The subject does have a sprinkler system, but it is used in conjunction with the adjacent building where the main controls are located. This is not considered a plus due to the condition of the main controls.

DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS, CONTINUED

The building has four on-site parking spaces. These parking spaces are inadequate for the size of the building, which has a significant effect on the building's value. Although, there is a city public parking lot in the area, and there are a few spaces available. This is a typical scenario in the downtown area; however, the parking lot mentioned above cannot be guaranteed to be used for this particular building. There is some street parking, but it is minimal.

The subject building is average to good quality and is in average to good condition. Commercial space in the area such as the subject is in demand and the subject property fits well in the market and should have continued good marketability and demand.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

(See Deed in Addendum)

OWNERSHIP HISTORY

According to the public records, the subject property has been in the name of Edgewater Broadcasting, Inc., for over three years. It is currently under contract for a reported \$300,000. This appears to be market value based on data available. No lease data was provided; and it is vacant.

HIGHEST AND BEST USE

Highest and Best Use "As Though Vacant"

The legally permissible use of the subject site is for commercial/office use. The likelihood of a zoning change is not anticipated, and the zoning complies with the current use. It is financially feasible to improve the subject property with an office building. Thus, the maximally productive and highest and best use of the site, "as though vacant," would be for commercial/office use.

Highest and Best Use "As Improved"

It is doubtful that redevelopment of the site would result in an increase in the return to the land than is currently being generated. The existing commercial/office building is the highest and best use.

EXPOSURE TIME

Reasonable exposure time is one of a series of conditions in most market value definitions. Exposure time is always presumed to precede the effective date of the appraisal. A definition of exposure time can be as follows: The estimated length of time the property interest is being appraised would have been offered on the market prior to the hypothetical consummation of a sale at market value on the effective date of the appraisal; a retrospective estimate based upon an analysis of past events assuming a competitive and open market.

Exposure time is different for various types of real estate and under various market conditions. It is noted that the overall concept of reasonable exposure encompasses not only adequate, sufficient and reasonable time but also adequate, sufficient and reasonable effort. This appraisal focuses on the time component. The estimated exposure time for the subject is between three and six months.

The estimate of the exposure time for the subject property is based on typical lengths of time for marketing properties in the area found through general data and sales data verification, as well as interviews with agents and other market participants.

MARKETING TIME

Marketing Time is an estimate of the amount of time it takes to sell a property interest at the estimated market value during the period after the effective date indicated by the appraisal. An estimate of marketing time is not intended to be a prediction of a date of sale. It is not correct to assume that the value as of the effective date of appraisal remains static during a marketing period. Additionally, market factors external to this appraisal report were considered with a reasonable marketing time for the subject property estimated to be between three and six months.

VALUATION PROCESS

The appraiser has utilized one approach to value (Market Approach) in estimating the current market value for the subject property. The following is a summary of the approach to value utilized by the appraiser in estimating the current market value of the subject.

COST APPROACH

The Cost Approach to value is not utilized in the analysis and evaluation portion of an appraisal report. The Cost Approach can be an accurate utilization of the principle of substitution if the improvements are new. The principle of substitution is based on the proposition that the informed purchaser will pay no more for the property than the cost of producing a substitute property, with the same utility as the subject property. In this report, the cost approach is of little value given the age of the improvements.

INCOME APPROACH

The Income Approach, or Income Capitalization Approach, is based upon an analysis of the potential income stream generated by the real estate appraised. By agreement, the Income Approach will not be considered in this report. The market approach is of sufficient data to support the value. Buildings such as the subject are not considered investment property but are generally owner user.

SUMMARY OF ANALYSIS AND VALUATION

Following is a summary of the information analyzed, the appraisal procedures followed, and the reasoning that supports the analyses, opinion, and conclusions.

SALES COMPARISON APPROACH

The sales comparison approach, or market approach, is based upon a comparison of the prices that are paid for similar competitive properties in the same market, representing bona fide arm's length transactions. This approach works best in an active market where these prices serve as good indicators of the most probable selling price of the subject property as of the valuation date.

Comparable sales are analyzed and adjusted for conditions in the market, terms of financing, unusual conditions of sale, differences in physical characteristics and location. The adjusted sales price should be what the comparable property would have sold for if it had possessed the identical characteristics of the subject property at the time of the sale.

The appraiser considered office/commercial property sales that have occurred in Twin Falls and also researched the market for any sales of similar-type properties that might have occurred in other areas. There were sales of buildings that were used for office/commercial purposes. It was the appraiser's opinion that the buildings that have sold would give an indication of the general value of office/commercial space and did make an analysis based on this premise. The appraiser was able to determine an indicated sale price per square foot for each of the sales. The following pages describe sales that were considered for general indication of market value, and the pertinent information is extracted from each sale's description and used in the analysis which is located after the sales descriptions.

MARKET APPROACH, CONTINUED

In this section, the market value of the subject property will be estimated by direct comparison analysis. Direct comparison analysis compares improved sales to the subject property on a price per square foot basis. The price per square foot is based upon the physical characteristics of the property, and care must be taken in the comparable selection process.

Comparable Selection:

The subject consists of a 5,380 s.f. above grade, commercial/office building. I have analyzed four comparable sales with an emphasis placed on location, age, quality and size. The sales occurred in 2018 and 2019.

Adjustments:

For the sales, no adjustments are warranted for property rights conveyed, financing terms, conditions of sale, expenditures immediately after purchase and non-realty components. Regarding market conditions, discussions with active market participants indicated that property values had been trending upward through 2006 at a moderate rate. As a result of the economic recession of 2008 and 2009, values have been on a stabilization trend after peaking in 2009. Then values started rising again in late 2009 and 2010 with increases in 2011, 2012 and the current date. However, many of the properties never regained their pre-recession values.

When analyzing the comparables, primary consideration was given to physical characteristics such as location, access/linkage, age/quality, condition/appeal and size. A general discussion of these factors on a qualitative basis is presented in the following pages.

MARKET APPROACH, CONTINUED

The appraiser was able to review several sales of buildings located within the market area of the subject. The following is a summary of those properties:

DISCUSSION OF SALES

SALE NO. 1 is approximately one mile west of the subject. It is a comparable facility in fair condition. There is good on-site parking, but has an inferior location. It would require an upward adjustment for condition and location.

<u>SALE NO. 2</u> is approximately one block east of the subject. It is a superior location on Main Avenue, and larger site. It is a comparable quality, inferior finish and condition. An upward adjustment is required, as it also has no on-site parking.

<u>SALE NO. 3</u> is approximately four blocks west of the subject. It is an inferior condition building, remodeled, inferior quality, and larger site. An upward adjustment would be required for location and quality, but superior on-site parking.

<u>SALE NO. 4</u> is four blocks northeast of the subject. It is a comparable property, comparable site, has some on-site parking, and is in a superior location and exposure. A downward adjustment is required due to parking and exposure.

160 GOODING STREET W | FLOOR PLAN



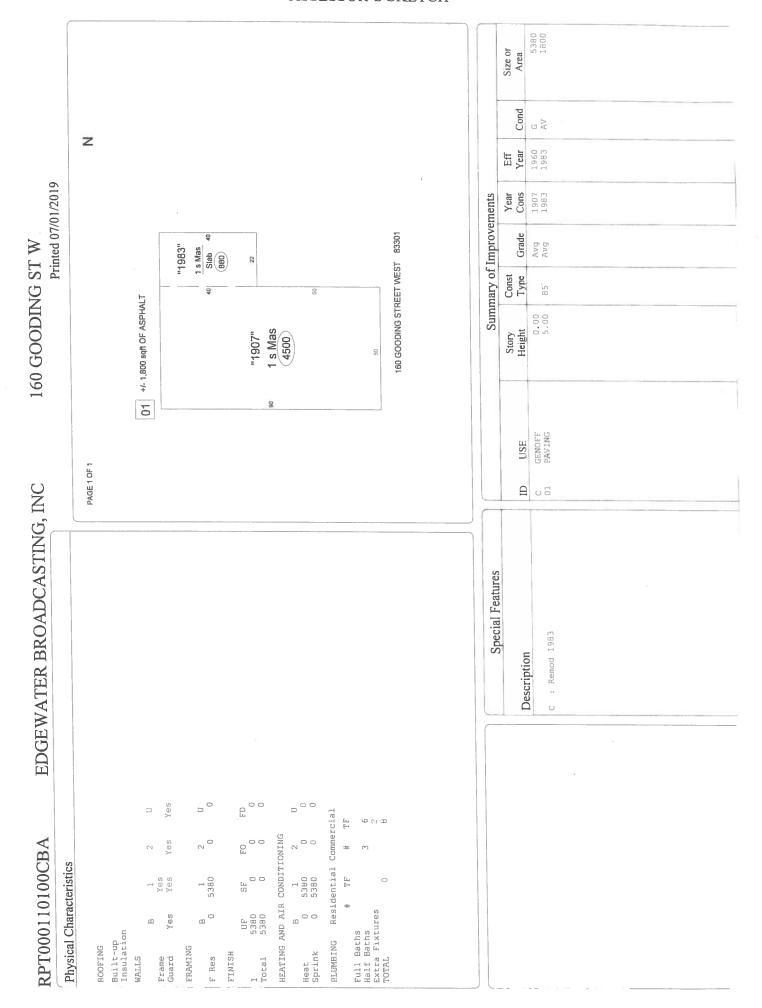

Definition of Market Value:

The most probable price which a property should bring in a competitive and open market under all conditions requisite to a fair sale, the buyer and seller each acting prudently and knowledgeably, and assuming the price is not affected by undue stimulus. Implicit in this definition is the consummation of a sale as of a specified date and the passing of title from seller to buyer under conditions whereby:

Market Value Comments:

The factors of utility, scarcity, desire and effective purchasing power are apparent in the definition. The implication that buyer and seller are working under equal pressure is seldom completely true, although typical motivation for each does imply a reasonable balance for a market value transaction.

Market prices do not necessarily follow all of these concepts and are often affected by salesmanship and the urgency and need of the buyer and/or seller. The central difference between market price and market value lies in the premise of knowledge and willingness both of which are contemplated in market value, but maybe not in market price. The most important obligation associated with the rights to the use and occupancy of a leasehold interest is the payment of rent. Contract rent is the actual rental income specified in a lease. Rent is commonly paid by the tenant to the lessor according to a specified schedule. A leasehold interest usually has value when contract rent is less than market rent. Market rent is the rental income that a property would most probably command in the open market. Most negotiated leases reflect contract rent equal to market rent.

When market rent exceeds contract rent, the leasehold interest may have value, assuming that the lease term is long enough to be marketable and the lease allows for subletting or assignment. When contract rent exceeds market rent, the leasehold is said to have negative value. (The Appraisal of Real Estate, Thirteenth Edition, Appraisal Institute, 2008.) Marketability is a key issue that must be addressed. In other words, would another tenant be found to pay an equal rent? Is the property marketable for the same use at a similar rental?

Definition of Leasehold Interest:

The interest held by the lessee (the tenant or renter) through a lease transferring the rights of use and occupancy for a stated term under certain conditions.

(The definition of leasehold interest was taken from the Dictionary of Real Estate Appraisal, 4th ed., published by the Appraisal Institute, 2002.)

Definition of Highest and Best Use:

The reasonably probable and legal use of vacant land or an improved property, which is physically possible, appropriately supported, financially feasible, and that results in the highest value. The four criteria the highest and best use must meet are legal permissibility, physical possibility, financial feasibility, and maximum productivity. (The Dictionary of Real Estate Appraisal 4th ed., by the Appraisal Institute. 2002.)

The definition immediately preceding applies specifically to the highest and best use of land and/or property. It is to be recognized that in cases where a site has existing improvements on it, the highest and best use may very well be concluded to be different from the existing use.
