THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this date, July 21, 2020, by and between Primary Therapy Source, LLC, hereinafter the "Service Provider" and TWIN FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The Service Provider desires to provide and TWIN FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT desires to purchase physical and occupational therapy services for special education students.

Therefore, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **Term:** This Agreement shall commence on July 21, 2020 and shall continue until terminated. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other.
- 2. Service Provider Responsibilities: Provide Physical and Occupational Therapy services for students in the Twin Falls School District as a result of referrals from the district, which occur during school hours. The Service Provider shall conduct Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy evaluations, provide written reports and recommendations, provide physical and occupational therapy interventions, provide periodic progress reports, attend and participate in meetings as requested and consultation sessions and screenings according to individual student needs. Therapists will also be responsible for providing the required online documentation of services for Medicaid billing compliance according to the state law and school regulations.
- 3. District Responsibilities: The Special Services Coordinator or the Special Education Teacher will maintain correspondence, such as invitations to the appropriate meetings (IEP, MDT, CST and annual reviews) and provide verification of parent consent to evaluate students. Special Education Personnel will help arrange for space, any necessary forms, and keep PT and OT information in Special Education Student files. Also, school agrees to maintain HIPAA and FERPA requirements.
- 4. Payment for Services: The Service Provider will be compensated for the services provided at the rate of \$70.00 per hour. Time traveled among schools in the school district is also billed at the contract rate. A monthly billing will be submitted to Twin Falls School District stating the dates of service and students served.
- 5. Relationship of the Parties: This Agreement shall not be construed to create a partnership relationship or the relationship of employer/employee. It is understood the Service Provider is an independent contractor performing and providing services under contract. Accordingly, the Service Provider shall be responsible for all employment taxes, worker's compensation, professional liability insurance and other costs related to self-employment.
- 6. Non Solicitation: Twin Falls School District agrees not to solicit employment from therapists who are employed by Primary Therapy Source, LLC.

GUARANTEED SCHOOL-BASED COMPLIANCE MEDICAID ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT – ISDC Partnership Rate

This Agreement is made by and between Compliance Services Association, Inc., an Idaho General Corporation, located at 6003 W Overland Rd, Suite 201, Boise, ID 83709, hereinafter referred to as CSA, and the Twin Falls School District #411, located at 201 Main Ave W., Twin Falls, ID, hereinafter referred to as the SCHOOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, CSA is an Idaho corporation organized to provide COMPLIANT MEDICAID administration to Idaho schools, and has developed a complete COMPLIANT MEDICAID administration program which provides Idaho school districts with training, administrative, consultative, statistical, audit services, and a guarantee of compliance;

WHEREAS, the SCHOOL DISTRICT wishes to obtain, and CSA wishes to furnish these COMPLIANT MEDICAID administration services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual promises and undertakings of the parties hereinafter set forth, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The term of the Agreement shall be from July 20, 2020 to June 30, 2021, provided that the agreement shall be automatically renewed for successive oneyear terms, unless terminated in writing by either party 45 days before July 1 of the then current term of the agreement, or as provided in Section 9 of this agreement.
- CSA will provide COMPLIANT MEDICAID administration services as outlined in the SUMMARY OF MEDICAID ADMINISTRATION SERVICES (Attachment A) document attached.
- 3. The SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to perform the COMPLIANT MEDICAID administration services as outlined in the SUMMARY OF MEDICAID ADMINISTRATION SERVICES (Attachment B) document attached.

The parties herein covenant and agree to review the Idaho Medicaid Provider Handbook, Rehabilitative and Health Related Service and both parties herein covenant and agree to abide by the terms contained therein and subsequent orders and or directions as the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare shall provide in reference to the Idaho Medicaid Provider Handbook. Both parties herein acknowledge that they have a current copy of the above referenced handbook in their possession.
- Both parties herein acknowledge and agree that the information as submitted by 6. CSA to the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare is information provided to CSA from the SCHOOL DISTRICT through the IEP's and physician referrals. Any errors or omissions for services or billing documentation of those services provided in schools, whether or not reflected on the IEP or physician referral. may result in overpayment or underpayment, therein may affect and cause Medicaid adjustments. SCHOOL DISTRICT acknowledges that the accuracy of any Medicaid billings submitted by CSA are dependent on the accuracy of information provided to CSA by SCHOOL DISTRICT. CSA does not and will not guarantee errors or omissions for providing documented services or the billing documentation of those services. For services provided, documentation of those services and IDEA compliance, SCHOOL DISTRICT releases and holds harmless CSA, its officers and agents, from any and all liability to the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, Medicaid or any other governmental or private person or entity for any overpayments, adjustments, demands for repayment, interest, penalties of other claims of any sort related to any services provided by CSA, including without limitation any Medicaid billings submitted by CSA or SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The SCHOOL DISTRICT herein acknowledges and agrees that CSA is providing a service to the SCHOOL DISTRICT that is specialized and that in the implementation of this service CSA has trained SCHOOL DISTRICT agents and has provided SCHOOL DISTRICT agents with proprietary knowledge and information that said agents would not otherwise obtain. Therefore, SCHOOL DISTRICT herein acknowledges and agrees that during the term of this agreement the SCHOOL DISTRICT or its agents will not use, consult with, hire, retain, or otherwise cause any agent of SCHOOL DISTRICT, be it a SCHOOL DISTRICT employee, agent or independent contractor, or any other person or entity, to submit Medicaid billings or otherwise compete with the services as provided by CSA to SCHOOL DISTRICT and SCHOOL DISTRICT will not independently submit claims to Medicaid or cause an agent or any other person or entity to submit such claims, and shall not circumvent CSA in any other fashion, directly or indirectly. SCHOOL DISTRICT further agrees that it will not disclose any proprietary or other information provided to it by CSA to any other person or entity, will only allow such use of such information by its agents as necessary to perform the terms of this agreement, and will return all copies of any such information to CSA at the termination of this agreement. SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees that in the case of any attempt to terminate this agreement before the end of the term, or any submission of any Medicaid billing(s) performed by SCHOOL DISTRICT or any other person or entity on its behalf, SCHOOL DISTRICT shall account for all such submissions and shall owe CSA the above-stated (Section 4(c)) administrative fee for all such submissions. SCHOOL DISTRICT also acknowledges and agrees not to disclose specialized information and knowledge learned through CSA, to other school districts or their agents, or any other person or entity, via written or verbal communications. Such disclosure is a material breach of this agreement.
- 8. SCHOOL DISTRICT, by executing this agreement, warrants that the person signing this agreement has the authority to do so, so as to bind SCHOOL DISTRICT to its terms, and that all necessary meetings, approvals, authorizations, votes and other matters necessary to make this a valid and enforceable agreement binding SCHOOL DISTRICT have been completed, finalized and performed.

The SCHOOL DISTRICT is responsible for the following:

- Insure that; One time Parental consents are signed, Primary Care physician notifications requirements are met, students qualify for services listed on the IEP, all services listed on the IEP and Physician referrals are performed and documented by qualified personnel, that all services and documentation is in accordance with IDEA, and that the compliant billing documentation is accurate with the documented services listed on the IEP and Physician referrals.
- Insure that qualified personnel complete and submit timely and accurate; IEP cover page and service page, amendments, service delivery logs (records) that meet Medicaid requirements for documenting service delivery and for which the SCHOOL DISTRICT is seeking reimbursement and to submit such records to CSA via paper claims or web-based software provided by CSA, so that CSA may provide timely and accurate Medicaid claims and reporting for the district.
- Insure that certifications and licensures of all practitioners are accurate and uptodate. Insure that all practitioners submitting claims are not disqualified to do so by the Department of Health & Welfare or the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Maintain necessary paperwork related to certifications, licensures, etc. of all qualified staff including contracted services for whose services the SCHOOL DISTRICT is seeking reimbursement
- Maintain all Individual Education Programs (IEPs) according to Rehabilitative and Health Related Services program guidelines for all services for which the SCHOOL DISTRICT is seeking Medicaid reimbursement. Provide CSA with the IEP cover page and service page and amendments.

Physicians Referral

No claims will be submitted without insuring that a timely referral has been obtained by the SCHOOL DISTRICT for the services identified in the student's IEP. CSA will coordinate the referral process with the SCHOOL DISTRICT and make reasonable efforts to obtain a referral on behalf of the SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- When CSA has exhausted reasonable means, CSA will notify the SCHOOL DISTRICT of the names of the students for whom a referral was not obtained along with the reason why.
- CSA will maintain and archive referrals from a physician or other practitioner of the healing arts for services for which the SCHOOL DISTRICT seeks reimbursement.

FIXED PRICE CONTRACT

This is a contract between TWIN FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT 411 (hereinafter referred to as TFSD), 201 Main Avenue W, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301 and EDUCATION NORTHWEST, 101 SW Main Street, Suite 500, Portland, Oregon 97204, for the performance of work set forth below.

1.0 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

1.1 The purpose of this agreement is to continue the successful collaboration between Education Northwest and TFSD, with adjustments based on district's focus on writing for the 2020-2021 school year. In addition, continued support will be given to teacher-leader teams (led by TFSD coaches), who will attend the NW Literacy Cooperative convenings. All trainings will be aligned with Literacy Leadership Team meetings.

2.0 EDUCATION NORTHWEST AGREES TO:

- 2.1 Provide the services under the direction of Kimberly Barnes. Whenever, for any reason, this individual is unavailable for assignment for the work required under this contract, Education Northwest shall immediately notify the TFSD to that effect and shall replace such person with a person of substantially equal ability and qualifications.
- 2.2 Conduct a series of planning meetings with the director of elementary programs and elementary principals and coaches to lay the groundwork, create goals and develop plans for implementation.
- 2.3 Attend the TFSD professional development institute in August to learn about new district writing curriculum. Attendance may be virtual or in person depending on the COVID-19 developments and agreement in writing between both parties.
- 2.4 Provide five (5) onsite coaching visits to support schools. This facilitation may be delivered electronically or in person depending on the COVID-19 developments and agreement in writing between both parties.
- 2.5 Provide monthly reports that include summaries of onsite coaching supports. These will be provided to the director of elementary programs.
- 2.6 Provide monthly check-ins with Teresa Jones and Marybeth Flachbart throughout the school year to make any necessary adjustments in coaching.

3.0 TFSD AGREES TO:


- Pay Education Northwest the fixed price of \$179,623 to carry out the scope of work specified in 2.0 above.
- 3.2 Designate and make known to Education Northwest one individual to act as contact person and liaison with Education Northwest.
- Provide on-site facilities, staff support and written and visual materials that are necessary for Education Northwest to complete the scope of work specified in 2.0 above.

4.0 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 4.1 The period of performance of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.
- 4.2 This shall be a fixed price agreement in the amount of \$179,623.

Payment shall be made to Education Northwest upon satisfactory progress in the scope of work and invoice by Education Northwest. The payment schedule shall be:

10 monthly payments of \$17,962.30 on or about the last day of the month from August 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020.



- 4.3 No alteration or variation of the terms of this contract and no understandings or agreements not incorporated herein, unless made in writing between the parties hereto, shall be binding.
- In performing services under this agreement Education Northwest is an independent contractor and nothing herein is to be construed as establishing an employer-employee relationship. Education Northwest agrees that all work will be performed in accordance with the highest professional standards.
- 4.5 All materials produced under the terms of this contract shall become the property of TFSD. TFSD hereby grants Education Northwest a nonexclusive license to use these products in carrying out future educational work with other state and local school districts.
- In carrying out the work described in 1.0 above, individually identifiable student records may be shared by TFSD with Education Northwest starting on the effective date of this agreement. Education Northwest agrees to comply with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) by ensuring that the confidential information obtained in any form will be maintained and transmitted in a secure manner, in compliance with Education Northwest Procedure 303-5, Maintaining Security of Personally Identifiable Student and Family Information. Such data will be used only for the purposes of this agreement as stated in 1.0 above and only by representatives of Education Northwest who need access to fulfill these stated purposes. Education Northwest will not disclose any information in a personally identifiable way and will appropriately dispose of these records within 90 days of the completion of the contract.
- 4.7 The parties hereby agree that no qualified person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, national origin, disability, or gender, be excluded from or denied participation in, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any activity performed pursuant to this contract. There must be evidence that the contractor is an equal employment opportunity employer as defined by Presidential Executive Orders 11246 (Equal Employment Opportunity) and 13201 (Employee Relations).

- 4.8 Each party affirms that it will maintain business insurance during the term of this agreement as may be required by federal, state, or local laws.
- 4.9 Each party shall protect, indemnify, and save the other harmless from and against any damage, cost or liability for any or all injuries to persons or property arising from negligent acts or omissions of itself, its employees, its agents, or its Subcontractors, howsoever caused.
- 4.10 This agreement may be terminated by the mutual, written consent of both parties. Upon termination, Education Northwest shall stop work. Education Northwest shall be reimbursed for costs incurred to date of termination upon submission of an invoice within sixty (60) days of the date of termination.


