Collaboration and Coteaching for English Learners

The goal of this 2-part 4-hour webinar is twofold: (1) to help participating educators engage in critical conversations, reflections, and action planning around collaborative practices for ELLs and students with disabilities, (2) to review, evaluate, and adapt the collaborative instructional cycle as well as the seven coteaching models (Honigsfeld & Dove, 2010; 2015); (Dove & Honigsfeld, 2018) that promote an integrated service delivery in K-12 instructional settings.

The 4-hour session will consist of 2 modules with a 10-minute break between them.

Module 1: Collaborative Planning and Assessment Practices Delivery

In this module, we will focus on two collaborative practices that all teachers may engage in if they work with students with disabilities (SWDs), English learners, dual language learners, multilingual learners, or other culturally and linguistically diverse (CLD) student populations in any program model or context. Teachers should not be planning instruction alone and should regularly examine student data together to design differentiated instruction and ensure student learning.

Participants will

- Explore key considerations for collaborative planning and assessment
- Identify how specific co-planning routines and structures support this collaborative effort
- Discuss practices they can use to respond to diverse learning needs and to enhance collaboration between and among teachers
- Identify 5 different types of supports and scaffolds.
- Organize assessment practices around three major approaches

Module 2: Coteaching Models to Support ELD

The purpose of this module is to review, evaluate, and adapt seven coteaching models that promote an integrated service delivery for the sake of ELs and SWDs in K-12 instructional settings.

Participants will

- Determine how specific co-teaching practices can accommodate the needs of diverse learners and enhance collaboration between coteachers and classroom teachers
- Identify, describe, and evaluate seven coteaching models; view and analyze video clips of coteaching in authentic and realistic situations.
- Compare the advantages and challenges of each of the seven arrangements
- Select, adapt, and combine coteaching arrangements presented that would be feasible for their own teaching situation including identifying specific types of classroom practices that work best in combination with various coteaching models

Additional Information:

Each 2-hour Zoom-supported module will follow this format:

- •50 minutes: Interactive Live Zoom Presentation (Zoom Chat and Answergarden participation)
- •25 minutes: Breakout rooms for teacher discussion on the topic of the module (During this time, teachers work in their assigned Breakout Rooms and share their responses on a specially designed Padlet. The presenter will visit all the rooms during this time.)
- •30 minutes: Return to hole group Zoom session for continued topic exploration
- •15 minutes: Q&A on Zoom

ClassWallet Master Service Agreement

The terms of this Master Agreement (the "Agreement") apply to the contract for services entered into by Kleo, Inc. d/b/a ClassWallet and Twin Falls School District (hereinafter referred to as the "Client"). This Agreement is subject to change upon written notice by ClassWallet to Client.

- ClassWallet's Responsibilities.
 - a. ClassWallet shall provide the Client with the services and products listed in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Services").
 - During the term specified, ClassWallet shall provide the Client with only those Services for the duration of the Term of this Agreement as listed in Exhibit A.
 - c. Use commercially reasonable efforts to make the Services available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week (99.9% uptime), except for circumstances beyond the control of ClassWallet or scheduled downtime or maintenance.
 - d. Provide the Client with basic support for the Services ordered from ClassWallet during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, excluding the federal bank holidays. Basic support includes phone support for application usage and email correspondence. ClassWallet reserves the right to limit any excessive usage of support services by the Client.
- 2. Client's Responsibilities.
 - a. Ensure that it and the users mutually authorized by it and ClassWallet ("Users") are in compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
 - b. Ensure that all Users are aware of and in compliance with this Agreement.
- 3. Fees and Payment for Contracted Services
 - a. Cost for Contracted Services is listed in Exhibit B.
 - b. The Client shall timely pay the fees listed in Exhibit B in accordance with the invoices issued to the Client by ClassWallet. At any time during the Term, the Client may contract with ClassWallet for additional Services.
 - c. Failure by the Client to make timely payments in accordance with the Contract for Services and invoices issued by ClassWallet shall result in an assessment of late charges at the rate of one and a half percent (1.5%) per month or the maximum permitted by the applicable law, if less. In its sole discretion, ClassWallet may suspend or discontinue its obligations to provide Services or make the Services unavailable under this Agreement if any amounts due by the Client are more than thirty (30) days late. The Client agrees to pay, to the extent permitted by law, the expenses of enforcement and collection of any amounts overdue including, without limitation, administrative costs, attorneys' fees and costs, and collection company fees
 - d. ClassWallet may assess late fees to any delinquent billing account after the grace period has ended. In the event of a returned payment on a billing account or financial aid application, ClassWallet may assess a returned payment fee payable by the Party who submitted the payment.

- e. Fees are subject to increase at the end of the Term.
- 4. Fund Collection And Remittance
 - a. ClassWallet is not a chartered banking entity.
 - b. The Client authorizes ClassWallet to act as an agent for the Client to collect and distribute funds to the Users. Any funds that ClassWallet collects as agent for the Client at the Client's direction shall be retained by ClassWallet and remitted to the Client in accordance with the timelines established for each product. ClassWallet shall hold the funds it collects from the Client in a segregated account titled the "ClassWallet Segregated Account f/b/o Customer" (the "ClassWallet Segregated Account") solely for the purpose of collecting funds from the Client, and remitting them to the Users, as agreed and permitted by law.
 - c. By acting as a conduit between the Client and the Users, ClassWallet exercises no control over the funds other than as contemplated herein. ClassWallet will not commingle its own funds in the ClassWallet Segregated Account. ClassWallet will not use the funds for its own benefit, except as may be explicitly permitted by the Client. ClassWallet reserves the right to deduct any late fees, processing fees, and other fees from the funds in the ClassWallet Segregated Account, as applicable.
 - d. All funds in the ClassWallet Segregated Account shall be the property of the Client.

5. Intellectual Property

- a. ClassWallet grants the Client, and the Client accepts a limited non-transferable and non-exclusive license solely to use the Services for the Term. The Client shall not permit any third party access to the Services and services provided by ClassWallet, unless expressly authorized and agreed to in writing by ClassWallet.
- b. The Client agrees and acknowledges that the Services are the sole and exclusive property of ClassWallet and/or its suppliers, and that the Client shall not have any right, title, or interest to any such Services or copies thereof, except as expressly authorized in this Agreement. ClassWallet reserves all rights.
- c. The Client shall not copy, modify, reverse engineer, disassemble, decompile, or make derivative works of the Services provided by ClassWallet, or any portion thereof, and shall not use the Services, or any portion thereof, other than as intended and provided for in this Agreement and the Contract for Services.
- d. The Client agrees to respect and not remove, obliterate, or cancel from view any copyright, trademark, confidentiality or other proprietary notice, mark, or legend appearing on any of the Services or the materials found on the ClassWallet website.
- e. ClassWallet may modify its Services from time to time
- f. If the Client desires additional functions or enhancements to the Services provided by ClassWallet, ClassWallet may, in its sole discretion, develop new functions or improvements to the existing Services for additional consideration to be mutually agreed upon. Any updates to the Services, new functions and enhancement shall be the sole property of ClassWallet.

g. ClassWallet agrees and acknowledges that the Client and the Users own the rights, title and interest in and to all of the non-public data provided to ClassWallet or uploaded to or stored in the Services by the Users and the Client. The Client and the Users grant ClassWallet the right to manipulate, modify, and edit all data provided by ClassWallet in connection with the services and Services provided hereunder. Client has sole responsibility for the accuracy, quality, integrity, legality, reliability, appropriateness, and intellectual property ownership of, or right to use, all such Client and User data.

6. Confidentiality and Privacy

- a. The Client agrees and acknowledges that the Services, including but not limited to the documentation and software, provided to the Client by ClassWallet constitute valuable, proprietary Services and contain intellectual property and confidential information of ClassWallet and/or its suppliers. Accordingly, the Client agrees not to disclose to any person, other than Users, any non-public portion of the Services, including but not limited to the documentation and any software that may be provided by ClassWallet hereunder. Furthermore, the Client agrees to take all reasonable efforts necessary to preserve the full confidentiality of all non-public portions of the Services provided to it by ClassWallet, including but not limited to any trade secrets.
- b. In providing services and Services under this Agreement, ClassWallet may receive non-public personal information from the Client and its Users. Such information may be gathered from a variety of transactions and documents. For example, enrollment agreements, applications, and other forms may contain such information. ClassWallet agrees not to disclose non-public, personal information received by it from the Client or its Users, except as: (a) permitted or required by law; (b) authorized by the Client or the Users; or (c) may be necessary to complete a transaction in the ordinary course of business. ClassWallet may share information, such as the transaction history of Users, with the Client, as permitted by law. Please see the ClassWallet privacy policy for additional information.
- c. ClassWallet acknowledges and agrees that it has implemented security measures, including physical, procedural and electronic safeguards, to protect non-public personal information provided to it and/or uploaded or input to the Services by the Client or the Users from access by unauthorized parties, consistent with applicable law.

7. Limitation Of Liability

- a. IN NO EVENT SHALL CLASSWALLET'S' AGGREGATE LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT EXCEED THE TOTAL AMOUNT PAID BY THE CLIENT DURING THE TERM.
- b. IN NO EVENT SHALL CLASSWALLET HAVE ANY LIABILITY TO THE OTHER PARTY FOR ANY LOST PROFITS OR REVENUES OR FOR ANY INDIRECT, SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES HOWEVER CAUSED ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT OR CONTRACT FOR SERVICES WHETHER OR NOT THE PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES, TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW.

- C. CLASSWALLET DOES NOT WARRANT OR GUARANTEE (a) THAT THE CLIENT'S ACCESS TO THE WEBSITE OR THE SERVICES WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR-FREE; (b) THAT THE WEBSITE OR THE SERVICES WILL OPERATE IN COMBINATION WITH HARDWARE, SOFTWARE, OR DATA OTHER THAN THAT DESIGNATED IN THE DOCUMENTATION; OR (c) THAT THE QUALITY OF THE SERVICES AND ANY PROFESSIONAL SERVICES PERFORMED IN CONNECTION HEREWITH WILL MEET SUBSCRIBER'S REQUIREMENTS OR EXPECTATIONS. ALL WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS, IMPLIED, STATUTORY OR OTHERWISE, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTY OF TITLE, NON-INFRINGEMENT, MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, ARE HEREBY DISCLAIMED BY CLASSWALLET TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW.
- d. THE SERVICES OR CLASSWALLET WEBSITE MAY BE SUBJECT TO LIMITATIONS, DELAYS, DELIVERY FAILURES, AND SIMILAR PROBLEMS INHERENT IN THE USE OF THE INTERNET AND ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND CLASSWALLET IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR, AND SHALL NOT HAVE ANY LIABILITY IN CONNECTION WITH, ANY DAMAGES THAT ARISE AS A RESULT OF SUCH PROBLEMS.
- 8. The term (the "Initial Term") of this Agreement shall commence on the 15th of August, 2020 (the "Effective Date") and shall continue for a period of twelve (12) months. Prior to the end of the Initial Term and each "Renewal Term" (as hereafter defined), this Agreement will automatically extend for an additional twelve (12) month period (each, a "Renewal Term") unless either party sends the other party a notice of non-renewal at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the "Term" (as hereafter defined). The Initial Term and any Renewal Terms shall be collectively referred to herein as the "Term."

9. Termination

- a. If ClassWallet commits a material breach of this Agreement and fails to cure such a breach within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of breach from the Client to ClassWallet, then the Client may, by giving notice to ClassWallet, terminate this Agreement.
- b. If the Client commits a material breach of this Agreement, including but not limited to non-payment or late payment of the applicable fees, ClassWallet may terminate this Agreement upon written notice of such termination to the Client.
- c. ClassWallet and the Client shall have the right to terminate the Agreement upon written notice to the other party: (a) upon the institution by or against either party of insolvency, receivership or bankruptcy proceedings or any other proceedings for the settlement of either party's debts, (b) upon either party making an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or (c) upon either party's dissolution or ceasing to do business.
- d. Upon termination of this Agreement for whatever reason, to the extent commercially feasible, ClassWallet shall maintain online Client access to the Client's data for the period of two calendar years from contract termination.

10. Use of Name and Logo

Client hereby grants to ClassWallet the express right to use Client's organization name and logo in marketing, sales, financial, and public relations materials and other communications,

including but not limited to email announcements, newsletters and marketing, banners, investor presentations, printed collateral, solely to identify Customer as a ClassWallet customer. ClassWallet hereby grants to Client the express right to use ClassWallet's name and logo solely to identify ClassWallet as a provider of services to Client. Other than as expressly stated herein, neither party shall use the other party's marks, codes, drawings or specifications without the prior written permission of the other party.

11. Force Majeure

Neither ClassWallet nor the Client shall be liable for any delay or default in performing hereunder if and to the extent such delay or default is caused by conditions beyond its control, including but not limited to act of God, war, fire, terrorist act, act or order of the government, labor dispute, network outages, or transportations delays, or delays associated with the performance of third parties or vendors not under the direct or indirect control of the non-performing party. The affected party will promptly notify the other party of the circumstances causing its delay or failure to perform and of its plans to implement a work-around solution.

12. Errors

Occasionally, even though it is outside of the scope of services regularly provided by ClassWallet and it is not required to do so, ClassWallet may assist the Client with data entry into the Services provided hereunder. Notional Virtual Wallet Account

Through ClassWallet, each account holder is provided a virtual wallet. The Client allocates a balance to each virtual wallet account which indicates to the account holder how much they are able to spend. 



AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO REFUGEES

Jannus, Inc., an Idaho nonprofit corporation ("Jannus") and **Twin Falls School District 411** ("Subrecipient") enter into this Agreement to provide services to eligible refugee populations under the grants listed in Schedule A to this Agreement ("Grants"). Within Jannus, administrative staff of the Idaho Office for Refugees ("IOR") will execute this Agreement.

1. BACKGROUND AND QUALIFICATIONS

- Jannus is the agency responsible for the provision of cash assistance and services to refugees in Idaho and for overall coordination of the statewide refugee program. As the state coordinating agency and recipient of Federal funds, Jannus is required to provide certain services under the Grants, and is authorized under the terms of the Grants to subgrant or subcontract portions of the work required in providing such services. Jannus is required, by the terms of the Grants and by regulations governing its role as state coordinating agency, to conform to certain information monitoring and reporting requirements in connection with the delivery of the services required under the Grants.
- 1.2 Subrecipient wishes to perform as a subrecipient pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below. Subrecipient warrants that (1) it has met the qualifications required of subrecipients or subcontractors under the Grants; (2) it has obtained all corporate or other approvals required to enter into this Agreement; and (3) its performance of the obligations of this Agreement will not conflict with any of Subrecipient's existing contracts or obligations.

2. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED

- 2.1 Subrecipient agrees to provide the services set forth on Schedule B to this Agreement to members of the target population as defined therein, to provide such services at times when a majority of eligible refugees in the service area are able to participate, as determined through Jannus' and Subrecipient's assessment of the needs of the target population, and to provide services in a manner that is satisfactory to Jannus and conforms to Jannus' standards for culturally and linguistically appropriate services. All services shall be provided within the geographic area set forth on Schedule B to this Agreement.
- 2.2 The determination whether services are satisfactory shall be made by Jannus according to:
 - 2.2.1 Subrecipient's adherence to the work schedule and timetable for project implementation set forth on Schedule B to this Agreement;
 - 2.2.2 Subrecipient's adherence to the terms of this Agreement;
 - 2.2.3 Other factors that Jannus, within its reasonable discretion, deems relevant.

3. COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES

- Jannus will reimburse Subrecipient on a monthly basis for actual expenses incurred in the performance of its obligation under this Agreement ("Costs"). Reimbursement of Costs shall not exceed \$63,401 during the term of this Agreement, unless this Agreement is amended as set forth in Section 17 of this Agreement. Payment for services will be based on satisfactory performance of the services set forth on Schedule B to this Agreement provided that:
 - 3.1.1 Costs are allowable by the terms of this Agreement, including any Standard Terms and Conditions of Grant Awards; Cost Principles as well as all other requirements referenced on Schedule A and D to this Agreement; and
 - 3.1.2 Costs are incurred in accordance with the Subrecipient's established policies and procedures

Indirect expenses, if applicable, will be reimbursed as Costs at the lesser of the rate shown in the budget attachment (Schedule C) and the Subrecipient's approved Federal indirect rate.

3.2 Subrecipient shall submit an invoice to Jannus within the time frame specified on Schedule C Budget and Billing Procedures. Jannus shall make payment within fifteen (15) days after receipt and approval of the monthly invoice. Invoices must show sufficient detail to indicate clearly the nature of all expenses in the format provided on Schedule C. A final invoice must be submitted within 60 calendar days after the termination of this Agreement and must be marked "Final." All invoices shall be submitted to:

4. INFORMATION REPORTING

- 4.1 Subrecipient agrees to adhere to the information reporting requirements set forth on Schedule B, including but not limited to providing the following information to Jannus on an ongoing basis through the Statewide Refugee Information System:
 - 4.1.1 Enrollment and employment services information; and
 - 4.1.2 Information on individual participation in services.
- 4.2 Subrecipient agrees to provide progress reports to Jannus no later than fifteen (15) days after the close of each reporting period during the term of this Agreement. Progress reports shall include:

- 4.2.1 Measurements of progress toward achievement of project goals and objectives, and
- 4.2.2 Other information required by the terms and conditions of Schedules A or B.
- 4.3 Subrecipient agrees to provide financial reports as follows:
 - 4.3.1 Annual audit report within 30 days of agency receipt.
- 4.4 Subrecipient agrees to maintain accurate and complete records of participant eligibility for assistance and services, types and amounts of assistance and services provided, cost of assistance and services, and outcomes of service delivery. Subrecipient shall make such records available to Jannus upon request.
- 4.5 Subrecipient agrees to maintain accurate and complete financial records that document the uses of all funds provided by Jannus pursuant to this Agreement and to make such records available to Jannus whenever requested.
- 4.6 Subrecipient agrees to maintain all fiscal and program records and to make such records available to Jannus for inspection and copying for a minimum of three years after the end of the grant period.
- 4.7 Subrecipient agrees to grant Jannus, the U.S. Office of Refugee Resettlement, the U.S. Comptroller General, and all of their duly authorized representatives access to any books, documents, papers and records of Subrecipient that are directly pertinent to the Grants and the services provided there under for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts and transcriptions.

5. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

- 5.1 Jannus will assist Subrecipient in the performance of its duties under this Agreement by providing technical assistance, training and resource information. Such assistance may include the following:
 - 5.1.1 Publication and dissemination of policies, procedures and best practices;
 - 5.1.2 Quarterly meetings of Subrecipients, conducted for the purpose of discussing issues evolving in connection with the Grants and the services provided there under and to further the goals and objectives thereof;
 - 5.1.3 On-site visits by Jannus staff; and
 - 5.1.4 Such additional technical assistance as Jannus deems beneficial.
- 5.2 Subrecipient agrees to participate actively with Jannus in its technical assistance programs, and to make good faith efforts to implement recommendations and other guidance received from Jannus' materials and staff.

6. INSURANCE

Subrecipient shall maintain, at its own expense, commercial general liability and, if applicable, worker's compensation insurance and shall provide Jannus certificates of insurance upon request.

7. ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS, COST PRINCIPLES AND AUDITS

This Agreement is subject to the administrative requirements set forth in 2 CFR Part 200 –

Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal

Awards as well as the terms and conditions listed on Schedule D. Jannus will reimburse

Subrecipient for direct and indirect costs provided that the applicable cost principles are
followed. In the event that Subrecipient receives more than \$750,000 (directly or as a passthrough) from federal sources, a single audit must be performed in addition to an annual
financial audit.

8. PRIOR APPROVAL AND NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 8.1 The following Subrecipient actions require prior approval from Jannus:
 - 8.1.1 Change in scope of project;
 - 8.1.2 Significant deviation from or changes in line-item budget;
 - 8.1.3 Changes in key personnel: Subrecipient is required to notify Jannus in writing if the Project Director or key personnel, as identified in the budget narrative, will withdraw from the project entirely, be absent from the project during any continuous period of 3 months or more, or reduce time devoted to the project by 25 percent or more from the level that was approved at the time of award;
 - 8.1.4 All actions requiring prior approval listed in the Cost Principles.

9. PUBLIC POLICY REQUIREMENTS

- 9.1 Subrecipient hereby agrees to provide equal employment opportunity and to take affirmative action in employment in accordance with all relevant sections of Executive Order 11246 as amended by Executive Order 11375 and Department of Labor Regulations set forth at 41 CFR, part 60.
- 9.2 Subrecipient acknowledges that the Department of Health and Human Services has rights in any research or other original work product developed in connection with the services delivered under the Grants in accordance with 37 CFR, part 401 "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements" and any implementing regulations issued by the Department of Health and Human Services.
- 9.3 Subrecipient hereby agrees to file a certification with Jannus that it will not and has not used federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any federal contract, grant or

- other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Subrecipient further agrees to disclose to Jannus any lobbying with nonfederal funds conducted in connection with obtaining any federal grant award.
- 9.4 Subrecipient certifies that it has not been debarred, suspended or otherwise excluded from receiving federal contracts in accordance with Executive Order 12549 or 12689 and that the name of Subrecipient and the name of Subrecipient's directors and officers do not appear on the General Services Administration's "List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Nonprocurement Programs." Subrecipient consents to a search of the Excluded Parties list at http://sam.gov
- 9.5 Subrecipient will acknowledge Federal funding when issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid invitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal funds. Subrecipients are required to state (1) the percentage and dollar amounts of the total program or project costs financed with Federal funds and (2) the percentage and dollar amount of the total costs financed by nongovernmental sources.
- 9.6 Subrecipient acknowledges, and to the extent applicable, agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 providing that any individual participating in any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance not be discriminated against on the basis of age (45 CFR part 91) race, color or national origin (75 CFR part 80) or handicap (45 CFR parts 84 and 85).
- 9.7 Subrecipient must take reasonable steps to ensure that people with limited English proficiency have meaningful access to health and social services and that there is effective communication between the service provider and individuals with limited English proficiency.

10. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 10.1 The initial term of this Agreement shall commence on the effective date of October 1, 2020, and shall continue for one year from the effective date unless renewed by mutual agreement of the parties or terminated earlier pursuant to this Section.
- 10.2 This Agreement may be terminated by either Jannus or Subrecipient, with or without cause, upon sixty (60) days notice delivered in accordance with the requirements of Section 12 of this Agreement.
- 10.3 This Agreement may be terminated immediately for cause, upon delivery of notice to the non-terminating party. Cause includes, but is not limited to the following:
 - 10.3.1 Jannus' failure to make the payments required by Section 3;
 - 10.3.2 Subrecipient's failure to perform the services required by Section 2 in a satisfactory manner and/or failure to perform the information reporting or access to information required by Section 4; and

- 10.3.3 Subrecipient's failure to comply with applicable federal public policies as required by Section 9.
- 10.4 This Agreement will terminate immediately in the event any of the Grants is withdrawn, terminated or modified in a manner inconsistent with the existence of this Agreement by the U.S. Office of Refugee Resettlement, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services or the U.S. Congress.

11. DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND ENFORCEMENT

- 11.1 In the event of any dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the parties shall attempt to settle the dispute through good faith negotiations. Such negotiations will include open communications and joint problem solving to reach a mutually agreeable resolution of the dispute.
- 11.2 If good faith negotiations fail to settle any dispute and there remains any unresolved controversy, claim or failure to comply with any material term of this Agreement, Jannus shall be entitled to enforce Subrecipient's performance under this Agreement through the exercise of any remedy set forth in Title 45, Section 92.43 of the Code of Regulations, including, but not limited to, any one or more of the following:
 - 11.2.1 Withholding contract payments, including the withholding of payments in amounts equal to overpayments to refugees which result from Subrecipient's error or noncompliance;
 - 11.2.2 Disallowing all or part of the cost of any activity which is not in compliance with the terms of the Agreement;
 - 11.2.3 Suspending or terminating the funding provided to Subrecipient under this Agreement, in full or for specified activities; and
 - 11.2.4 Withholding further awards from Subrecipient.

Jannus' imposition of the remedies described in 11.2.1 and 11.2.2 above shall not relieve Subrecipient of its obligations to perform fully under this Agreement. The forgoing remedies shall be in addition to Jannus' right to terminate this Agreement under Section 10 of this Agreement and any other remedies available under applicable law.

11.3 In the event that Subrecipient believes that any of the remedies set forth in this Section has been imposed against it without due cause, or is otherwise aggrieved by Jannus' exercise of the rights set forth in this Section, Subrecipient shall be entitled to present its claim to an impartial mediator, agreeable to both parties, for resolution. The mediator shall hear testimony from both parties and any reasonable number of witnesses that each party wishes to call, and shall recommend a solution to the conflict. Subrecipient shall give Jannus notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 12 of this Agreement, of its intent to present the matter for mediation.

- 11.4 In the event that the dispute described in Section 11.2 cannot be resolved through mediation, the parties agree to submit the matter to an arbitrator for binding resolution in accordance with the Uniform Arbitration Act, Idaho Code Title 7, Chapter 9. The arbitrator shall be chosen from a roster of qualified neutral arbitrators, and shall be agreeable to both parties. In the event that the parties cannot agree on the selection of an arbitrator, Jannus and the Subrecipient shall each identify three (3) three acceptable neutral arbitrators, and, starting with Jannus, shall alternate in striking one (1) name from the other party's list of arbitrators. The last name remaining shall be the arbitrator of the dispute. The arbitrator shall have no authority to impose punitive damages or to vary the terms of this Agreement, and shall be bound by controlling law.
- 11.5 This Agreement is governed by Idaho law. Any unresolved controversy or claim shall be settled by a court of competent jurisdiction located in Ada County, Idaho. Ada County, Idaho shall be the proper venue for mediation, judicial or other proceedings under this Agreement.
- 11.6 Each party shall be responsible for payment of any attorney fees it incurs in connection with the dispute resolution processes described in this Section, and fifty percent (50%) of the costs of such dispute resolution procedure. All proceedings under this Section shall be scheduled in a manner, which accommodates both parties.

12. NOTICE

All notices under this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered in person or sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, to Jannus and Subrecipient at the notice addresses set forth below, or such other addresses as may from time to time be designated in writing by the applicable party. Notices shall be deemed given on the date they are mailed in accordance with this Section.

13. INDEMNITY

Subrecipient shall indemnify and hold harmless Jannus from and against any and all claims arising in connection with this Agreement and the services provided hereunder and from and against all costs, attorneys' fees, expenses and liabilities incurred in or from any such

claim. Subrecipient, upon notice from Jannus, shall defend the same at Subrecipient's expense by counsel reasonably satisfactory to Jannus; however, in no event shall the amount paid to Subrecipient's attorney exceed what would be reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in connection with the applicable claim.

14. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, of which the Schedules, and any other attachments and exhibits are an integral part, contains all covenants, accords and agreements between parties relating in any manner to the Grants and the services to be provided there under, and may be amended only in the manner set forth herein.

15. SEVERABILITY

Any provision of this Agreement that shall prove to be invalid, void or illegal shall in no way affect, impair or invalidate any other provision thereof and the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

16. ASSIGNMENT

Subrecipient shall not assign any portion of this Agreement without Jannus' prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

17. AMENDMENT

This Agreement may be amended only by written agreement signed by both Jannus and the Subrecipient.

Services to be Provided

APPROACH

Student Eligibility. School district services will be provided to refugees possessing an I-94 arrival card or Permanent Resident card showing refugee, asylee, Cuban/ Haitian Entrant status or Iraqi and Afghan children with a Special Immigrant Visa (SIV). Eligibility will be documented at time of student enrollment. Student U.S. arrival and enrollment dates will be tracked through school district data bases or by other means, allowing district personnel to determine which students have been residing in the U.S. for less than three years. All services will be prioritized to newly arrived refugees and recent arrivals with persistent adjustment issues.

OBJECTIVE 1: Improve refugee families' school readiness, enrollment and transition process

The Twin Falls School District will maintain a dedicated full-time Family Liaison position to continue improving school enrollment assistance for newly arrived refugee families. With interpreter assistance, the Liaison will meet with each newly arrived family to review the enrollment process and assist with forms, appointments, and document gathering. The liaison will accompany (or coordinate with case managers to accompany) families to school enrollment meetings, with the CSI Refugee Center providing both transportation and interpreters. During enrollment, the liaison will facilitate family tours of the school and introductions to school personnel as a means to establish strong parent-school relationships. For children with special needs and/or behavioral or emotional issues, the Family Liaison will help to connect the students and families with the appropriate staff and resources at the schools.

The Twin Falls School District will fund the school orientation program. Sessions will continue to evolve, will be led by the Family Liaison position within the School District, and will be coordinated with the CSI Refugee Center.

The Family Liaison will secure donations of school supplies or clothing and assist with the free and reduced priced meals application. The Liaison will give refugee parents school bus schedules, mapped directions to the school, school telephone numbers (with guidance on how and when to call), and school/ELL handbooks for the students and parents.

¹ ORR recognizes that some school districts interpret the 1982 Supreme Court decision in Plyler v. Doe to prohibit school officials from asking for any documentation of a child's immigration status for any purpose, including verifying eligibility for federally funded refugee programs. The holding in Plyler does not affect programs funded by ORR, which by their nature require verification that a prospective beneficiary is eligible to receive services. As required by 45 CFR 400.43(a), children seeking to participate in projects funded by an ORR Refugee School Impact Grant must provide documentation of their refugee status. Recipients and subrecipients should secure copies of I-94's and green cards for eligible refugee children for their files. If a local Voluntary Agency provides a Refugee School Impact grantee or subrecipient with a letter certifying a list of children to be eligible refugees with refugee name, date of birth, refugee status, and date of arrival, and such certification and source documentation are available for the Government to review, ORR will consider the requirement to be satisfied.

The sheltered programs' teachers will work with the Family Liaison to introduce refugee parents to their child's new school and teachers; and with mainstream teachers on the refugee students' academic progress, adjustment, and culture.

OBJECTIVE 2: Sustain and expand refugee students' academic programs and services

New 6th-12th grade students may be placed in the Newcomer Program where their language and academic levels are assessed and developed with the Secondary-level Newcomer Teacher for two class periods each day. Services will include monitoring of progress on state and federal mandated testing, grade and course placement, acculturation, and English language instruction. Students may be placed in co-taught courses or Newcomer Cohorts for additional support throughout the school day. The District will also sustain its K-5th grade Newcomer Program at district expense.

OBJECTIVE 3: Support refugee parent involvement in their children's education

The Twin Falls School District, with the support of CSI Refugee Program staff, will develop relationships with refugee parents and remove barriers to their involvement in their children's education. The Family Liaison will conduct at least two home visits with newly arrived families, more for those with complex adjustment issues, to learn about the family's culture and home learning environment, talk about their children's learning, discuss perceived academic success as well as behavioral challenges, and encourage attendance at school meetings and events. Interpreters will be utilized. The District will sponsor family-centered activities that are inclusive of newly arrived refugees. Refugee parents will be specifically asked to attend online (due to COVID 19) parent-teacher conferences, back-to-school meetings, reading nights, school fairs, sports events, and other occasions. Schools will encourage refugee participation in family literacy programs offered by local organizations.

OBJECTIVE 4: Increase refugee student involvement in school activities

In order to reduce barriers to refugee student participation in school activities and create new activity opportunities, the Family Liaison and teachers will identify children's interests in extracurricular activities. The Liaison will facilitate students' activity enrollment. CSI Refugee Center will support the District's efforts by offering transportation for students to attend school activities.

School Personnel Training: The Twin Falls School District will continue to host State Department of Education professional development workshops on English Language Learner Standards and sheltered instruction.

OUTCOMES EXPECTED

Outcomes expected to be achieved as a result of educational services provided under this contract are specified below. Outcomes address refugee students who arrive during the annual budget period or have arrived during the preceding year. All outcomes will be compared to Fall 2020 baseline data from the school districts.

Outcome 1: Academic Performance

Outcome goal. At least 80% of refugee students will meet expected growth targets, as defined by

the Idaho Department of Education, for Spring 2021 and Fall 2021 Idaho State Achievement Test (ISAT).

Outcome measures and reports. The ISAT is given to all students in grades 3-10 every fall and spring. (First year LEP students are not required to take reading and language test sections.) Spring test scores will be the best indicator of student academic progress resulting from project objectives. Refugee student test outcomes will be reported to the district's Federal Programs Director.

Outcome 2: School Attendance Rates

<u>Outcome goal</u>. Ninety percent of refugee students will meet school district's policy of at least a 90% attendance rate.

<u>Outcome measures and reports</u>. The District ELL Instructional Coach will report refugee student attendance rates to the Federal Programs Director on a quarterly basis.

Outcome 3: English Language Acquisition

<u>Outcome goal</u>. Ninety percent of refugee students will meet growth targets, as defined by Idaho Department of Education, in the WIDA Access 2.0 test domain.

Outcome measures and reports. The WIDA Access 2.0 assesses English language proficiency levels in reading, speaking, listening, and writing. A placement test is given to English language learners upon enrollment. Every spring the WIDA Access 2.0 test will be given. School districts are accountable for meeting standardized growth levels for each student. Spring test scores will be the best indicator of student progress;

Outcome 4: School Adjustment

<u>Outcome goal</u>. The percentage of refugee students with discipline issues will be same as other students.

<u>Outcome measures and reports</u>. Each school will report the number of refugee student suspensions or expulsions to the Federal Programs Director on a quarterly basis.

Outcome 5: School Advancement

Outcome goal. Ninety-five percent of refugee students will be promoted to next grade level.

<u>Outcome measures and reports</u>. The district's Federal Programs Coordinator will examine its data base of refugee student records at the end of each school year.

OBJECTIVE 6: Participate in RSIG semiannual meetings as well as quarterly Community Consultation Meetings.

The Twin Falls School District will participate in the above meetings for the purposes of strengthened collaboration and information sharing with the Refugee Service Providers.



ARTICLE 1. TERMS OF AGREEMENT The period of this agreement will commence on the 19th of August, 2020 and remain in effect until the 20th day of May, 2021.

ARTICLE 2. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES In performing services under Agreement, Provider is and shall at all times remain an independent contractor of the District. Nothing herein is to be construed as establishing an employer employee relationship.

ARTICLE 3. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PARTIES Provider agrees that all information regarding services provided pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the student's identity and the nature of services rendered, shall be confidential. Provider is prohibited from disclosing any information obtained as a result of rendering services pursuant to this agreement to any individual not authorized by the District without parental consent.

ARTICLE 4. REPORTING OF ABUSE, ABANDONMENT OR NEGLECT Provider

acknowledges its obligation to comply with Idaho Code 16-1601, et seq. and report within 24 hours, any suspected abuse, abandonment, or neglect of a child to the Building Administrator. The building administrator will assist with further reporting.

ARTICLE 5. PROVIDER LICENCE For the duration of the contract, the provider will maintain in effect and have

in possession, all applicable licenses required by state and federal laws for ASL Interpreters. Provider will supply support services with a current copy of said license each year.

ARTICLE 6. INSURANCE AND LIABILITY Provider shall be solely liable for any losses or damages resulting from Provider's performance of any of the services covered by this agreement. Provider shall indemnify and hold harmless the District from any liability including, but not limited to, costs, expenses, and attorney's fees resulting from Provider's performance of the services provided under this agreement. Providers Worker's Compensation Policy and Proof of liability insurance shall be submitted to the district within one month of the date of this agreement. Provider will provide the district with a copy of\$1,000,000,000, liability insurance naming Twin Falls School District as insured.

ARTICLE 7. AMENDMENT/TERMINATION This Agreement may be amended at any time with the prior written mutual consent of both parties. Any and all amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing. Additionally, either party may terminate this Agreement within 30 days written notice.

ARTICLE 8. NON-DISCRIMINATION The parties hereby agree that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, age, or disability, be excluded from or denied participation in, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any activity performed pursuant to this Agreement

ARTICLE 9. SCOPE AND SEQUENCE OF SERVICES

Provider agrees to provide services to Twin Falls School District students who qualify for services via an evaluation team process. Provider will provide ASL Interpreting services. If the provider will be unavailable for a day, provider agrees to contact the schools and support services. A detailed service statement will be delivered to support services before the 6th of each month for services rendered. If the statement arrives after the 6th payment will be paid the following month.

District will provide notice to the provider of meetings in advance if the ASL Interpreter is required to attend.

ARTICLE 11. COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES

SPECIAL SERVICES INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT

This Contractual Agreement is entered into between -----(hereinafter referred to as "District") and Miller Behavior Group (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor").

Whereas, the District provides special education and related services to assist students attending school in the District in their educational development, as identified on the students' individualized education program (IEP) plan; and

Whereas, the Contractor is duly licensed or qualified and able to provide the outlined services below to the District's students;

It is hereby agreed by both parties that:

DURATION OF AGREEMENT:

The period of this Contractual Agreement will commence on the 1st day of October, 2020, and remain in effect until the 30th day of June, 2021. This Contractual Agreement is contingent upon the availability of funds of the District. This Contractual Agreement shall not exceed twelve (12) calendar months. At the discretion of the District, the Contractual Agreement may be renewed annually or can be terminated by either party with thirty (30) days written notice.

COMPENSATION/BILLING:

The District shall compensate Contractor for the following types of direct services:

- Observations
- Screenings for instructional purposes
- Administer and score academic assessments
- · Functional behavioral assessments
- Behavior Consultation
- Behavior plans and follow-up
- · Prepare reports summarizing assessment results
- · Prepare recommended goals and objectives
- Provide environmental recommendations
- Attend meetings
- Provide staff training on agreed upon topics

Contractor will submit, by the 5th day of each month, a statement of services rendered each month including the completed district's Medicaid reporting forms. These completed forms must be accurate and ready to submit for Medicaid reimbursement. The district will issue checks as soon as possible based on District needs but no later than 45 days after receiving the invoice. Provided contract has submitted the proper paperwork to the District. Each monthly statement must include the following information for each student receiving services: a) student's name; b) description or services provided; c) total number of units spent in providing professional services; and d) cost of services provided. Additional documentation may be required by the District and will be provided within ten (10) working days of the date the written request for the documentation is made. The district agrees to provide a summer of this information prior to contract work being completed

The district agrees to pay the contractor 520\$ per full day of service. Should teletherapy be an needed the district will pay 50\$ an hour.

RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES:

In performing services under this Contractual Agreement, Contractor is and shall at all times be an independent contractor of the District. Nothing herein is to be construed as establishing an employer-employee relationship.

SERVICES TO BE RENDERED:

Contractor shall render the professional services enumerated on an outlined work plan and the Summary of Services, attached hereto and made a part of this Contractual Agreement as if set forth fully herein.

RECORD KEEPING:

Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining complete and accurate records documenting the professional services provided pursuant to this Contractual Agreement and shall provide copies of the records to the District within ten (10) working days of the date requested. Additionally, upon reasonable notice, the District shall have the right to review such records at any time during business hours, at Contractor's office.

CONFIDENTIALITY:

Contractor agrees that all information regarding services provided pursuant to this Contractual Agreement, including, but not limited to, the students' identity and the nature of services rendered, shall be confidential pursuant to the Family Educational Records and Privacy Act (FERPA). Contractor is prohibited from disclosing any information obtained as a result of rendering services pursuant to this Contractual Agreement to any individual not authorized and directed by the District, without parent/guardian consent or consent of the student if 18 years of age or older.

REPORTING OF ABUSE, ABANDONMENT, OR NEGLECT:

Contractor acknowledges its obligation to comply with Idaho Code Section 16-1601, et seq. and report, within 24 hours, any suspected abuse, abandonment, or neglect of a child to the law enforcement agency or Idaho Department of Health and Welfare. Contractor also agrees to inform the District, within 24 hours, of such suspicion.

SERVICE DELIVERY: TIME AND PLACE:

Contractor shall perform services set forth on an outlined work plan unless the parties mutually agree to a modification of service delivery.

COORDINATION OF SERVICES:

To facilitate delivery of services, the District will provide: 1) reasonable and prompt notification of meetings and other appointments in which the Contractor is expected to participate; 2) signed parental consent forms, as necessary; 3) identifying information regarding the client and the parent/guardian; and, 4) reasonable assistance in facilitating communication between the Contractor and clients, parents/guardian, and other providers and agencies.

PRIOR APPROVAL OF SERVICES:

All services rendered by Contractor under the terms of this Contractual Agreement shall require prior approval by the District in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations, local policies and procedures, and professional codes of conduct.

CONSENT/AUTHORIZATION TO ACCESS EDUCATIONAL RECORD INFORMATION OR PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION:

District and Contractor shall at all times require the written consent or authorization of the parent/guardian/or adult student, if age of 18 years of age or older, for the disclosure of access to educational information pursuant to FERPA or protected health information pursuant to the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) regarding the student, and shall maintain the confidentiality of that information consistent with the state and federal law and regulations.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES:

The services rendered pursuant to this Contractual Agreement will be provided by individuals who are duly licensed to perform the services or supervised by a licensed/certified provider in accordance with applicable professional standards. Contractor agrees that all work pursuant to this Contractual Agreement will be performed in accordance with the highest professional standards. Written assurances will be provided to the District attesting that all employees who come into contact with students shall have been subject to a criminal background check at least as stringent as that required by Idaho Code 33-130 and policies of the District, and have been determined to not have

a criminal background inconsistent with working with children. The District shall have the right to observe services being provided to the clients.

INSURANCE AND LIABILITY:

Commercial General and Umbrella/Excess Liability Insurance. Contractor and its subcontractor(s) of any tier shall maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) written on an occurrence basis and with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and in aggregate. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately by location and shall not be less than \$1,000,000. CGL insurance shall be written on standard ISO occurrence form (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury, and liability assumed under a contract including the tort liability or another assumed in a business contract. Waiver of subrogation language shall be included. If necessary to provide the required limits, the Commercial General Liability policy's limits may be layered with commercial Umbrella or Excess Liability policy.

ASSIGNMENT:

This Contractual Agreement shall not be subject to assignment, in whole or in part, by Contractor or by operation of law, so as to authorize any person other than Contractor, or Contractor's employees, to assume the duties subject to this Contractual Agreement without the District's prior written consent.

AMENDMENT:

This Contractual Agreement may be amended at any time with the prior written consent of both parties. Any and all amendments to this Contractual Agreement shall be in writing.

TERMINATION:

This Contractual Agreement may be terminated without cause by either party within thirty (30) days after providing written notice of the intent to terminate to the other party.

Additionally, the District may immediately terminate this Contractual Agreement, upon written notice, in the event funding for the District's program is no longer available or the specific services to this Contractual Agreement are modified or terminated for a student.

DEFAULT:

Upon default by either party, the non-defaulting party may cancel this Contractual Agreement immediately, upon notice and may pursue any and all available legal, equitable, and other remedies. The defaulting party shall be liable for any and all expenses that are incurred by the non-defaulting party as a result thereof, including, but not limited to, procuring substitute performance, legal fees, and other losses incurred due to the default.

TIME OF PERFORMANCE:

Time is of the essence in this Contractual Agreement; therefore, all times for performance of the obligations, as stated herein, shall be strictly complied with by the parties.

NON-WAVIER BREACH:

The failure of Contractor or the District to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Contractual Agreement, or to exercise any option herein conferred in any or all instances, shall not constitute a waiver or relinquishment of any such term, but the same shall be and remain in full force and effect, unless such waiver is evidence by the prior written consent of Contractor or the District.

NON-DISCRIMINATION:

The parties hereby agree that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, age, or disability, be excluded from or denied participation in, or otherwise subjected to, discrimination under any activity performed pursuant to this Contractual Agreement.

GOVERNANCE:

This Contractual Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Idaho. Contractor shall, at all times, comply with and observe all federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and ordinances which are in effect and applicable during the period of this Contractual Agreement.

ATTORNEY FEES:

If either party defaults in any manner or fails to fulfill any and/or all provisions of this Contractual Agreement, and if the non-defaulting party hires an attorney to exercise its rights upon such default or failure, or if the parties are involved in any litigation (including any proceedings in bankruptcy), the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney fees and costs from the other party. This paragraph shall be enforceable by the parties notwithstanding any rescission, forfeiture, or other termination of this Contractual Agreement.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION:

All participating agencies agree to resolve systemic disputes that arise in the provision of special education and independent contractor services in a non-adversarial manner and to ensure that using the following process to resolve interagency disputes does not disrupt services to students and families:

- 1. An individual or agency with a concern will first use the agency's internal procedures to address the concern.
- 2. If resolution is not achieved at the previous level, the issue and all relevant information will now be forwarded to the special education director of the Joint School No. 2 and contractor's administrator.
- 3. If consensus is not reached at the previous level, the special education director will forward the issue and all relevant information to the superintendent of the Joint School No. 2.
- 4. If a concern is identified that is related to the quality of service or health and safety issues, schools should refer concerns about a contractor, their services, or quality of services to the special education director and contractor's administrator to address these concerns.
- If these concerns are not resolved in the dialogue with school administrator (special education director and/or superintendent) and the contractor's administrator, the DHW regional licensing entity may be contacted to investigate the situation.

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AND SECURITY

Contractor acknowledges its obligation to comply with the Idaho Data Accountability Act, Idaho Code Section 33-133. Contractor covenants and represents as follows:

- Contractor agrees that all information regarding services provided pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the student's identity and the nature of services rendered, shall be confidential and comply with all federal and state laws:
- Contractor represents and warrants that it has in place Administrative Security, Physical Security, and Logical Security controls to protect from a data breach or unauthorized data disclosure;
- 3. Contractor agrees to restrict access to personally identifiable information (PII) to only authorized staff who require such access to perform their assigned duties;
- Contractor is prohibited from using student data and PII for secondary uses including, but not limited to, sales, marketing, or advertising;
- 5. Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the School District from any liability, including, but not limited to, costs, fines, expenses, and attorney fees, resulting from Contractor's performance of the services provided under this Agreement and/or non-compliance with state and federal law regarding Student Data Privacy and Security; and

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN SOUTH CENTRAL PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICT AND TWIN FALLS SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR USAGE OF THE ABBOTT BINAXNOW RAPID ANTIGEN TESTING CARDS

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into effective on the date of final signature by and among South Central District Health located at 1020 Washington St. N, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301 and Twin Falls School District. located at 201 Main Avenue West, Twin Falls, Idaho 83331, collectively known as the "Parties".

I. Purpose

This MOA is prepared to identify joint responsibilities and operational requirements for the usage of Abbott BinaxNOW Rapid Antigen Card (referred to herein as the "Card") between South Central District Health (referred to herein as SCPHD) and Twin Falls School District (referred to herein as TFSD) commencing this date and continuing until amended or cancelled.

II. Description of Services and Agreements

The Parties have recognized the benefits of cooperating as entities of local public health and medical care providers, and in furthering that cooperation agree to share and manage the Cards. SCPHD shall distribute the testing cards to each Provider based on the population of the area served. The Parties specifically agree to the following:

A. For Abbott BinaxNOW Card users only, TFSD agrees to:

- Participate in a one-time training session on the use of the Card and proper reporting procedures
- 2. Conduct training for all intended users of the Card on the necessary training.
 - Training videos, modules, guidance documents, and FAQs for the BinaxNOW™ test can be accessed on Abbott's website. For questions regarding the BinaxNOW™ test, please call Abbott Technical Services at 1-800-257-9525 or email ts.scr@abbott.com.

B. For Abbott BinaxNOW users, TFSD agrees to:

- Adhere to all safety precautions, including but not limited to the use of Personal Protective Equipment and proper hygiene measures, when conducting tests with the Card.
- Have sole usage of the Card to prioritize testing according to the following Tier system:
 - Tier 1 Symptomatic teachers, staff, students of public or non-public schools

The parties agree as follows:

- SCOPE OF WORK: COUNTY engages CONTRACTOR provided by SCHOOL DISTRICT to perform the individual as well as group educational instruction with Safe House as a part-time educator/tutor as set forth in this Agreement.
- 2. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This contact shall be effective when signed by all parties.
- 3. <u>TERM:</u> This contract shall be effective when signed by all parties and shall continue for one (1) year from the effective date, or until funding and grants are no longer available for the position, whichever occurs first.
- 4. TERMINATION: Termination by CONTRACTOR must be in writing and delivered two weeks prior to the termination date. Safe House Director and/or COUNTY may terminate this agreement at any time without notice. Such termination must be in writing with an explanation of the reasons for the decision. Otherwise, this Agreement shall continue based on funding and grant availability.
- 5. PAYMENT: The SCHOOL DISTRICT will be funding the CONTRACTOR, having set aside funds specifically to provide a tutor to Safe House. SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR for services rendered under this Agreement on an hourly basis at the rate of \$25.00/hour. Hours will be established between Safe House and the CONTRACTOR to work best with the CONTRACTOR's schedule.
- 6. DUTIES OF THE PARTIES UNDER THE CONTRACT.
 - **a. <u>DUTIES AND RESPONSIBLITIES OF CONTRACTOR</u>:** In consideration of payment from SCHOOL DISTRICT on the behalf of COUNTY (as described below), CONTRACTOR will perform the following services:

- vi. To ensure that the academic instruction being provided is accurate and reflective of the current school curriculum.
- vii. In the event that additional work or outside services are required, CONTRACTOR shall provide notice to the COUNTY, and be subject to approval by the COUNTY.
- **b.** <u>COUNTY'S DUTIES:</u> In exchange for the above service, the COUNTY shall perform the following to facilitate this agreement:
 - i. To provide feedback to SCHOOL DISTRICT on an as-needed basis regarding performance, attitude, praise and/or concerns of the CONTRACTOR.
 - ii. To provide adequate notice if CONTRACTOR'S hours will be reduced due to funding or grant issues as communicated to the COUNTY by the SCHOOL DISTRICT.
 - iii. To provide notice if the position must be eliminated due to budget issues or if the grants and funding are inadequate to maintain the position.

7. CONTRACTOR'S RIGHTS:

- To receive a clear description of duties in order to perform contracted services, and the opportunity for a meaningful work experience.
- b. To be provided, within reason, the information, guidance, resources, and tools necessary to meaningfully and productively perform the contracted services.
- To receive consideration and responses to suggestions, questions and concerns, including timely feedback.
- d. To have access to the Director for assistance in resolving problems.
- To receive respect and appropriate recognition and appreciation for efforts and contributions.
- f. At the discretion of the Director, depending on the nature of the work, CONTRACTOR may be entitled to incidental expenses. Reimbursements shall be made monthly. At the beginning of each month, a Safe House employee will gather the necessary records from the CONTRACTOR. - SCHEDULES AND HOURS: Duty hours will be mutually agreed upon between COUNTY and CONTRACTOR. Hours will be based on upon CONTRACTOR's schedule and availability.

4.	The Contractor agrees to provide and pay for all materials, tools and equipment required for the prosecution and timely completion of the work. Unless otherwise specified, all materials shall be new and of good quality.
5.	In the prosecution of the work, the Contractor shall employ a sufficient number of workers skilled in the trade to suitably perform the work.
6.	All changes and deviations in the work ordered by the Owner must be in writing, the contract sum being increased or decreased accordingly by the Contractor. Any claims for

increases in the cost of the work must be presented by the Contractor to the Owner in writing, and written approval of the Owner shall be obtained by the Contractor before proceeding with the ordered change or revision.

- The Owner's representative and public authorities shall at all times have access to the work.
- 8. The Contractor agrees to re-execute any work which does not conform to the drawings (if required) and specifications, warrants the work performed, and agrees to remedy any defects resulting, from faulty materials or workmanship which shall become evident during a period of one year after completion of the work.
- 9. The Contractor agrees to furnish a valid certificate of insurance for Worker's Compensation and a valid certificate of liability listing the Twin Falls School District as the additional insured for \$1M to the Owner prior to work being started on the project.
- 10. Contractor must obtain all necessary permits and licenses required by the local municipal/county government to do the work.
- 11. In the event the Contractor is delayed in the prosecution of the work by acts of God, fire, flood or any other unavoidable casualties; or by labor strikes, late delivery of materials; or by neglect of the Owner; the time for completion of the work shall be extended for the same period as the delay occasioned by any of the aforementioned causes.
- 12. In the event the work is delayed due to neglect of the Contractor, the Contractor agrees to pay the owner the sum of \$100.00 per day as liquidated damages until such time as the work is completed.
- 13. This contract contains the entire agreement of the parties, and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement whether oral or written concerning the subject matter of this contract. This contract supersedes any prior written or oral agreements between the parties.
- 14. Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Owner, and its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, actions, or judgments for damages or injury to persons or property arising out of or in connection with the acts and/or any performances or activities of Contractor, Contractor's agent, employees, or representatives under this agreement.
- 15. The Owner shall have the right to inspect all work performed under this contract. All work that needs to be inspected or tested and certified by an engineer as a condition of

any government departments or other state agency, or inspected and certified by the local health officer, shall be done at each necessary stage of the project and before further work can continue. All inspection and certification (if required) will be done at the Owner's expense.

- 16. Neither the Owner nor Contractor shall have the right to assign any rights or interest occurring under this agreement without the written consent of the other, nor shall the Contractor assign any sums due, or to become due, to him under the provisions of this agreement.
- 17. This agreement shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of Idaho.
- 18. Attorney's fees and court costs shall be paid by the defendant in the event that judgment must be, and is, obtained to enforce this agreement or any breach thereof.
