WORKING WITH YOUR SCHOOL BOARD

WELCOME to another Twin Falls School District Board of Trustees Meeting. You are encouraged to attend all regular board meetings.

We are proud of our school system and the board members are dedicated to the continued improvement of the Twin Falls Schools.

We understand that from time to time patrons of school districts have concerns and feel a need to bring those concerns to the attention of the school or teachers. In order to maintain continuity and best resolve these concerns, we recommend to our patrons the following procedures:

- 1. The first and most effective step is to take the concern to the staff member who is closest to the problem. (In many cases this will be the teacher, coach, etc.) We have found that most problems are resolved at this level.
- 2. If there is still a concern on the matter, we then recommend that the concern be brought to the attention of the Principal. We have found that unresolved concerns from item #1 are usually resolved satisfactorily by the building administrator.
- 3. If the concern is not satisfactorily resolved at that level, then the concern should be taken to the Director of Elementary Programs or Director of Secondary Programs.
- 4. If the concern is not satisfactorily resolved at that level, then the concern should be taken to the Superintendent of Schools. Difficult concerns can usually be resolved.
- 5. However, if the patron still feels the concern has not been properly resolved he/she may use the right of appeal to the Board of Trustees. This is done by calling or writing to the Superintendent and asking for the item to be placed on the agenda of the next regularly scheduled board meeting.
- 6. If you desire to address the board, we would like you to be as comfortable as possible. As a board we hold public meetings which are not public forums and therefore have rules which are necessary for the benefit of all. The following guidelines will assist you as you present your information to the board.
 - A. Prepare your thoughts ahead of time. Usually a brief written outline handed to each board member helps the board follow your presentation. This outline would also give them something upon which to make notes as you speak.
 - B. If a group is involved, select one individual to be your spokesperson. He/she can then guide the presentation with the board and help the board chairman in directing questions to the group.
 - C. Plan your presentation to be as brief as possible. This should include a question/answer period. If more time is needed it is best to give a complete written presentation to the board for their future study. If you give more than five to six minutes of testimony, time restraints will make it difficult for the board to respond that same evening.
 - D. Usually the board will direct the administration to help resolve the concerns and ask for a report back to the board at a later date. However, please remember a solution may take time to be resolved.

We are eager to have our patrons and school staff working together for the improvement of education in the Twin Falls Schools.

 Call to Order The Board of Trustees of School District No. 411, Twin Falls County, State of Idaho, met in its properly noticed/posted, regular monthly meeting at Twin Falls School District Boardroom located at 160 Gooding Street West, Twin Falls, Idaho, at the hour of 7:00 p.m., on Monday, July 10, 2023. The following trustees were present: Vice Chairman, Jayson Lloyd; Trustees, Heidi Casdorph, Heidi Tubbs, and Eric Smallwood. There were also present Superintendent, Brady Dickinson; Board Clerk, Michelle Lucas, as well as district directors, interested patrons, employees, and the media. Chairman, Jonathan Lord was unable to attend.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance The Board of Trustees stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
- III. Approval of Agenda With no additions or deletions to the agenda, Trustee Smallwood moved to approve the agenda as posted. Trustee Tubbs seconded the motion, motion carried.
- <u>IV.</u> <u>Unscheduled Delegations (Audience to Address the Board)</u> There were none.
- V. <u>VI.</u> <u>Superintendent's Report:</u>

A. Superintendent Dickinson announced the exempt employee of the month recipient for the month of July as Chelsea Popplewell, human resources manager, and classified recipient for the month of July as Tom Nava, custodian, and classified maintenance employee of the month of July as Ken Shaffer, maintenance. Superintendent Dickinson read a brief

- resume' on each recipient and presented each with a gift, plaque, and gift certificate to Idaho Joe's. Mrs. Popplewell, Mr. Nava and Mr. Shaffer thanked the Board for the honor.
- B. Superintendent Dickinson gave the Board a brief update on current teacher openings. There are currently 44.5 certified openings: 23.5 elementary, 14 secondary, and 7 special education. He shared that emergency provisionals can be applied for after August 1st. Dr. Dickinson also explained the district transfers vs. in-district transfers and stood for questions.

Vice Chairman Lloyd arrived at 7:09 p.m. and took over running the meeting.

VII. Budget & Finance A. Information Items:

1. The Board reviewed the canned foods, frozen meats and products, non-food items, and equipment bid recommendations for August 8, 2023 through May 24, 2024. Bids recommended are: Nicholas & Company \$586,544.80 (weekly), \$72,816.33 to Nicholas & Company, \$42,632.65 to Gem State Paper & Supply; \$31,564.65 to Shamrock; \$51,084.83 to Sysco; and \$41,446.70 to Northwest Distribution for a total of \$826,089.96. Director of Educational Technology and Operations, Ryan Bowman stood for questions from the Board. A seven year comparison was included in the board packet showing that prices have continued to increase significantly due to supply and demand issues.

- VII. District Safety Plan Update A. Twin Falls Safety Committee Report
 Director of Educational Technology and Operations, Ryan Bowman shared the current
 safety plan and lessons learned from the Canyon Ridge High School incident/hoax. He
 shared lessons learned including the need to change the District reunification plans, the
 need for further collaboration and professional development, and better communications
 with staff, parents, community and police. Mr. Bowman shared that he is applying for a
 Serving Your Schools Grant for \$20,000 per school (all 16 schools) for the first round
 and possibly additional funds later. These funds can be used to update lock systems to be
 uniform with card readers, upgrade intercom systems, and for enclosing/securing our
 school campuses. This is much needed help to better secure our schools. Mr. Bowman
 stood for questions from the Board.
- VIII. 10 Year Plant Facilities Plan Update and District Building Projects Update
 Director of Educational Technology & Operations, Ryan Bowman gave an update on projects completed, current projects and future project needs. He also shared the challenges with inflation since the last levy making prices exceed the original estimated costs. The current estimated costs would be over \$80 million to meet the asphalt, HVAC, and roofing needs. As an example, Robert Stuart Middle School would need approximately \$9 million for their boiler. The District's Legal Counsel, Eric Heringer will attend a future board meeting to discuss financing/levy/bond options.
- IX. 2020-2025 TFSD #411 Strategic Plan- July Update
 Director of Public Relations, Eva Craner highlighted focus areas for each of the July
 2022-2023 updates for the 2020-2025 strategic plan. The plan's focus areas are: Life
 Ready Students; Quality Learning Opportunities; A Healthy Learning Community;
 Quality Personnel; School Community Public Relations; School Environment and
 Facilities; and Stewardship of Resources. Mrs. Craner stood for question from the Board.
 This item will return in September for Board action.

The Board took brief recess from 5:59 p.m. to 6:05 p.m.

- X. Student Achievement Reports/Board Discussion Vision, Goals, and Focus for Year
 - A. Associate Superintendent, Ryan Nesmith shared an overview of the data notebook and gave a brief outline on what the directors would review. Director of Elementary Programs, Jennie Peterson shared 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 elementary priorities: elementary literacy and math; staff retention; student behavior issues; and information on the magnet programs. She also shared testing data, several celebrations, and some challenges for elementary programs. Mrs. Peterson stood for questions and had several minutes of discussion with the Board.
 - B. Director of Secondary Programs, L.T. Erickson shared testing data and secondary priorities: ELA; math; curriculum; instruction; and CTE. He also shared several

- celebrations and some challenges for secondary programs. After much discussion, Dr. Erickson stood for questions from the Board.
- C. Director of Support Services, Kindel Mason shared 2022-2023 support services priorities: literacy and math; behavior; federal requirements; and GT programs. Mr. Mason addressed some questions from the Board that came up during the elementary and secondary presentations. He also shared 2023 LEA determinations; 2023-2024 support services priorities; celebrations; and challenges and stood for questions.



- Section 2. That Notice of Election shall be delivered to the Clerk of Twin Falls County, Idaho, who shall cause same to be posted and published pursuant to section 34-1406, Idaho Code.
- Section 3. That said election shall be held as specified in Notice of Election, prepared by the County Clerk(s), in accordance with Section 34-1406, Idaho Code, as amended.
- Section 4. That said election shall be conducted as other school elections and the persons to conduct said election, being two judges and one clerk at each polling place, shall be duly appointed by the County Clerk(s) of Twin Falls County.
- Section 5. That the polling places of said election shall be determined by the County Clerk(s) in accordance with Section 34-1406, Idaho Code, as amended.
- Section 6. That voting at said election shall be by secret ballot, and each ballot shall be prepared by the Clerk of Twin Falls County, listing all qualified nominees.
- Section 7. That voting at said election shall be by secret and separate ballot, and each ballot shall be prepared by the County Clerk(s) as required by and in accordance with law.
- Section 8. That immediately following the close of the polls, the Board of County
 Commissioners shall conduct the canvass of the election results within ten (10)
 days after the election in the manner prescribed by Title 34, Chapter 12, Idaho
 Code, as amended. The County Clerk shall then certify the election results to

the Clerk of the Board of Trustees. Upon receipt, the Board of Trustees shall subsequently issue the appropriate certificates of election.

Section 9. That the County Clerk shall cause the Notice of Election to be posted for at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said election in at least two (2) public places within the District, one (1) of which shall be at or near the main door of the Administrative Office of the District located at 201 Main Avenue West, Twin Falls.
