LEARNING FOCU

Reading: What Do People Use To Do Their Job? Letter /sound Oo. Sight word: <u>vou</u>. Vocab words: utensils, uniform, equipment, expect, remained. CVC words like pot, mop, mom, and rod.

Math: Counting sequence. Numbers 1-20 and 1 more or 1 less. Example: 1 more than 8 is 9. One less than 7 is 6. Continuing pattern work. Leadership: Synergize: Together is better. There is more than just my way or your way, there is a <u>3rd alternative</u>. To find it, we need to listen, value others opinions, and be open to new ideas.

Social Skills: Ignoring distractions and things that annoy us so we can be more focused and productive. Talk about things that annoy you and how you can ignore them. What does that look like?
