### Step 1: Invite your Senior Project Mentor to attend your presentation.

## **Step 2:** Prepare note cards and practice your presentation.

Prepare a note card for each required section (Introduction, Body of Presentation, and Conclusion) and practice speaking with your note cards.

  - --Introduction of Self
  - --Attention Getter
  - --Preview of Main Points
- Body of Presentation:

### **Project Journal**

- -- Description of Project: What did you do get complete your 15 hours?
- --<u>Community Connection:</u> How did your project connect to a career exploration and/or a community service? Who did you choose as your mentor and how did he/she help you? Or

## **Research Paper**

- -- Description of Thesis Statement: Explain your thesis statement and how you developed it?
- --Research Findings: What did you learn from your research that support your thesis or refuted your thesis?
- Conclusion

## **Project Journal**

--<u>Learning Stretch:</u> How did grow from doing your project? What would you do different with another chance? How did it influence your future career plans? What were your most memorable moments?

Or

### **Research Paper**

--Learning Stretch: What new understandings did you gain from your research? What else would you like to learn? How did it influence your future career plans? How did your research impact your life?

## Step 3: Practice with effective presentation technique.

Consider and prepare for these other elements that will be evaluated when you are presenting.

- **Presentation Technique:** Properly prepare to deliver your presentation with confidence, making it engaging and organized with smooth transitions, lasting between 7-10 minutes.
- **Panel Questions:** The panel will ask you questions after your conclusion. This is your chance to demonstrate how much you know about your project. You are the expert.
- Things to Remember: Remember to be early and dress business-like. Don't forget your visual and Project Journal, or your Research Paper. When finished, thank the judges and shake hands.
