JB Task 1: Understand Overview of Senior Project and Start to Prepare a Project Proposal.

Overview: The Senior Project is designed to be the culmination of each student's academic experience at Twin Falls School District. It is a real-life opportunity for students to merge their various interests, passions, and curiosities with the community, the modern workplace and their academic lives as seniors in high school. The project is a vehicle for seniors to demonstrate their life-ready leadership of personal autonomy, initiative, creativity, critical thinking and problem-solving, coupled with interpersonal communication, collaboration and synergy. This experience requires seniors to go beyond the basic knowledge of subject matter and utilize 21st century, life-ready learning and working skills, as mentioned above. The senior project is a measurement of life-ready skills that demonstrate seniors are ready for success in postsecondary education, career choice and life.

The Four Main Components of Senior Project

- 1. The Project Proposal (Junior Board Presentation)
- 2. The Research Paper (English 12A Senior Research Paper)
- 3. The Project (30-Hour Project)
- 4. The Presentation (Presentation/Portfolio)

The Project Proposal: Each student will develop a project proposal during the junior year in Leadership Class. The proposal will include an overview of the project and demonstrate how it meets the senior project requirements. The proposal will identify the area of focus and the purpose of the project and illustrate how the project connects to his/her academic interests, service to the community, and/or career interests. The student must be able to connect his/her proposal to two of these areas. Each junior student will provide an oral presentation of the project proposal for approval at their Junior Board with a poster or the option of a digital slide show displayed on a Chromebook.

The Project: The project is a creation based on choosing, designing, and developing a product, project, or service related to the student's interest while connecting it to the community or to a career interest of choice. The project must require 30 hours.

The Research Paper: Each project will require a senior research paper that supports a specific thesis statement with evidence from research and warrants. The paper will be written in the MLA format and require cited sources from research. This will be completed in the English 12A Course.

The Presentation: A portfolio will be compiled that includes all paperwork completed while working on the senior project (see Senior Project Portfolio Rubric). Each senior student will provide an oral presentation of the project with a trifold poster or the option of a digital slide show displayed on a Chromebook. A final evaluation of the portfolio containing all four required sections, and an evaluation of the final presentation will determine the successful completion of the senior project.
