Every student is screened **three** times a year and identified as above-grade level, at grade-level or as needing intervention. Depending on need, your student may be assigned to a more intensive support class for rereading/language arts and mathematics.

What We Do

- ❑ Paraprofessionals in classrooms helping with reading, writing, and math.

Identifying Students

At the middle school level, academic screening for reading, math, and writing occurs **three** times a year - fall, winter, and spring).

STAR Reading scores, iReady Math scores, and our Write Tools paragraph prompt scores are triangulated with each student's historical ELA and Math ISAT scores.

Students who need extra support in reading, math, and writing are placed in intervention labs. Throughout the year, these students are monitored to check how they are progressing in their intervention lab(s).

If you have questions about your child's academic growth/progress, our intervention teachers are available to help.
