Student Success Class **Introduction**

Purpose

Student Success Class (SSC) teachers are advisors and advocates that:

- check in with students daily
- check grades weekly
- discuss with students their strategies for success
- act as the main contact for families to discuss students' progress in all classes

Organization

Student Success Class is divided into two thirty blocks, the first of which is dedicated to literacy and mathematical skills development. With the second block set aside for students to work on course work from their different classes in a supported study hall environment. The structure of SSC is designed to provide:

- a quiet environment to work independently
- assistance with course work
- communication with other teachers

• dedicated time to monitor and communicate reading and math goal progress weekly

Block One

Overview

Block One is dedicated to developing literacy and mathematical skills. Skills that span through and intertwine in all subjects and courses of work. Building and strengthening literacy and mathematical skills allows students to grow their educational foundation.

Math

Each Monday students will work on developing mathematical skills through supported independent practice. Utilizing the program iReady, students will work through lessons at their independent mathematical skills level. Levels and lessons are determined through a diagnostic assessment that students take three times throughout the school year (beginnings of year, end of semester one, and end of year).

Math Goal

Students will complete one **green** iReady lesson per week.

Reading

Each Tuesday through Friday students will work on developing literacy skills through supported independent practice. Utilizing the Accelerated Reading (AR) program students will quiz on books that students read independently, jointly, in class, or read to them. For books that do not have AR quizzes, students will meet with the librarian and have a conversation discussing the book instead. Students are encouraged to find books they enjoy.

Reading Goal

Students will have quarterly reading goals.

Block Two

Overview

Block Two is time for students to work on course work from their different classes in a supported study hall environment. During this time students will:

- work individually or with peers to complete course work
- meet with teachers to receive targeted assistance
- monitor and communicate academic progress weekly
