
Reporting Period: January – March 2018

Noise and vibration from construction activity at Westridge Marine Terminal (WMT)

Trans Mountain will follow up on noise or vibration complaints related to construction activity at WMT. Trans Mountain will work with stakeholders to resolve and address such complaints where practical. Noise levels at the WMT construction site are monitored regularly and have remained within regulatory limits.

Traffic lighting at night


Trans Mountain understands there is increased traffic around the WMT during construction and lighting from vehicles or other activities may be perceptible for nearby residents at times. Construction activities mainly take place between 7 am and 8 pm Monday to Friday and from 9 am to 8 pm on Saturday to limit night-time disruption, and no work is planned on Sundays or statutory holidays.

Security presence Community

Safety and security of workers and the community are of utmost importance to Trans Mountain. Trans Mountain continues to implement its Security Plan as submitted to the National Energy Board.
