#### ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS

- ✓ Required risk-screening for all entering HASC facilities
- ✓ All entrants are required to sanitize their hands upon arrival at all HASC facilities
- ✓ Social distancing through increased space between each partitioned training station in labs and decreased class sizes to allow for 6 feet of separation between trainees
- ✓ Reduced class sizes and increased the number of Basic Plus Orientation courses scheduled at our Pasadena location, with classes at 7, 9, and 11 am to minimize the number of people in each class, giving more room to put distance between trainees
- ✓ Additional hand sanitizing and additional stand-alone hand-washing stations with universal tips and sanitary instructions
- ✓ Disinfecting training stations, keyboards, classrooms, and all materials before and after each use, and using disposable pencils and materials in all classrooms
- ✓ Suspended all non-essential pulmonary function testing, but will continue to issue respirator clearance letters (MEQs) (per ACOEM & OSHA recommendations)
- ✓ Expanded ability for employee screening through our teleSTAT program to eliminate unnecessary doctor visits
- ✓ Increased janitorial services
- ✓ Signage throughout our facility in English and Spanish with universal precautions
- ✓ Complimentary micro-learning opportunities throughout our Pasadena campus regarding COVID-19
- ✓ Rescheduling all non-essential meetings at our campus to reduce unnecessary additional traffic

We are continuing to work with our medical team to monitor updates and will advise if circumstances change. We are in close communication with industry and are encouraging open communication regarding plans so that we can be best prepared to handle needs as they arise.

Our goal will continue to be to take care of our industry and its people while serving the mission.
