

Learn About Our Registration Process

In Texas, the COVID-19 Vaccine is currently available only for [those in Phase 1A and Phase 1B](#) per the [Texas Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel](#). If you are not in those categories, you may register but will not be offered the ability to schedule an appointment for the vaccine until you are in a group that is authorized under the State of Texas guidelines. If you or a loved one do not have access to Internet or a computer, please call 281-633-7795 to register.

Step 1. What You Need to Know

- At this time, only people in [Phase 1A and/or 1B categories](#) may receive the vaccine.
- FBCHHS is currently administering the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, which **requires two doses**. This vaccine can be provided to individuals 18+ years of age.
- Keep in mind that only certain dates will be available and that the current supply of vaccines may be limited.
- **Due to the limited supply, it may take weeks to be invited to schedule an appointment.**
- There is no charge for the vaccine or administration.

Step 2. Making an Appointment

- Click on the **Register Now link**
- Follow the instructions to register for the waiting list to receive your first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. You will be asked a series of questions to determine if you [qualify for the current distribution group](#).
- If you qualify, you will be **placed on a waiting list** to be invited later to schedule your appointment. This may take several weeks.
 - When you have registered to join the waiting list, **please allow 15 - 30 minutes for the waiting list confirmation email/text message to arrive.**
- *Later*, you will be notified via email, text message, and/or phone with a link to schedule your appointment. This may take several weeks.
- **If you registered by phone** and do not have access to Internet, you will be provided a date and time for an appointment.

- After you have scheduled your appointment, you will receive a confirmation email/text. **You must bring this confirmation with you to the scheduled appointment.**

Step 3. Receiving Your Vaccine

- When arriving to your scheduled appointment...
 - Ensure you have your appointment **confirmation**. This can be printed out or a screenshot from your confirmation email.
 - Follow signs and directions posted to navigate to the clinic.
- If, for whatever reason, you are unable to make your appointment and must cancel, you will need to complete the registration process again. Canceled appointments will not be rescheduled.

Step 4. Scheduling Your Second Dose (see below)

Moderna and Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines both require two doses to develop the best protection against the virus. It's best if you get your second dose from the same manufacturer as your first dose. For example, if you got a Moderna first dose, it's best to get Moderna for your second dose.

The timing between your first and second dose depends on which vaccine you received:

Moderna: 4 to 6 weeks after your first dose
Pfizer: 3 to 6 weeks after your first dose

- Upon completion of your scheduled first dose, the system will automatically schedule you for your second dose.
- You will receive a notification through text and/or email based on the option you specified during registration.
