#### **SCENARIO SUMMARY**

#### **EXERCISE ROLES**

Fire Site 1: (NorthEast) Dogwood Lane & San Jacinto River intersection, A Kingwood wildfire affecting urban development in Montgomery, Harris, & Liberty Counties. The City of Houston, IAH, and municipalities may hold assets which won't be available to assist.

Fire Site 2: (NorthWest) 1774 & Riley Road, a large wildfire with heavy timber load, affecting populations in Waller, Walker, Montgomery, & Harris Counties.

Fire Site 3 (West) I10 & 359 South: heavy brush and grass fires are affecting Colorado, Austin, Waller counties and supported by Fort Bend County resources.

Fire Site 4: (SouthEast) Marshland fires are common, but one has grown and is affecting Chambers county, creating smoke problems. Multiple brush fires are common and currently occurring in Galveston County. Supported by Galveston & Harris County resources.

Fire Site 5: (SouthWest) Grass fires on the county line near hwy 60 and on Rd 521 in Matagorda, Wharton, and Brazoria Counties, respectively.

**Players:** Personnel who discuss their decisions, roles, and responsibilities as they relate to the exercise scenario.

**Controllers/Facilitators:** Personnel who manage the conduct of the exercise and provide information to the participants. They facilitate the scenario and monitor the pace of discussion.

**Evaluators:** Personnel who record discussions and ensure documentation is submitted for review and inclusion in the after action report (AAR)/improvement plan (IP). Evaluators take notes and do not interact with players since this would affect the integrity of the exercise.
