Principal Instructors:

Instructors are members of the FBI's Child Abduction Rapid Deployment (CARD) Team. The CARD teams consist of experienced and specially trained personnel who quickly respond to non-family child abductions, ransom child abductions, and mysterious disappearances of children across the country to provide investigative, technical and resource assistance to state/local law enforcement.

Who Should Attend:

Personnel who respond to, manage or handle missing/abducted child cases.

Course Goals:

This course is designed to provide law enforcement and first responder personnel with the tools, techniques and strategies to effectively respond to all phases of abducted/missing child investigations. At the conclusion of the course, attendees will be able to identify and effectively utilize the investigative tools/methods that will be explained through current case studies and research as the "best practices" in child abduction investigations.

This training is based on the FBI's Child Abduction Response Plan (CARP), which is the national model for best practices when responding to and investigating cases involving children who are missing under mysterious or suspicious circumstances.
