COVID-19 Isolation Rooms

nhanced cleaning guidelines are recommended as extra steps when cleaning a room that housed a known COVID-19 positive person. The table below shows these enhanced procedures in comparison to cleaning

rooms that <u>did not</u> house a COVID-19 positive person (i.e., normal rooms	COVID-19 Positive	COVID-19 Negative
or suspected COVID-19 room where person tested negative). In both cases, cleaning shall occur after the individual is released by a physician.	Isolated individual tested positive	Isolated individual tested negative
PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)	Face mask to protect the wearer from splashes and sprays Respiratory protection – N95 is voluntary Medical mask Gloves Dedicated reusable apron or gown specifically for cleaning COVID-19 positive areas	No additional PPE other than what is normally required. Adding voluntary additional PPE due to employee's concerns is OK.
DISINFECTANT	EPA-approved disinfectant for COVID-19 virus such as Ecolab Facilipro peroxide glass and surface cleaner (EPA registration 1677-251)	Normal cleaning products
BEFORE CLEANING	If recirculating AC: Air out the room by opening windows for 24 hours prior to cleaning the room If HVAC provides negative air flow: Allow HVAC to run 3 hours without disturbance with the doors closed.	No need to air room
FOR LINENS AND TOWELS	 Do not shake dirty laundry Dirty laundry shall be placed in a plastic bag and set outside the door of the room by the person being housed. Launder items using the hottest appropriate water setting for the items and dry items completely Dirty laundry from an ill person can be washed with other people's items. Clean and disinfect hampers or other carts 	Normal laundry procedure

	Isolated individual tested positive	Isolated individual tested negative
FOR CARPETS, RUGS, AND DRAPES	Remove any decorative or extra cloth items prior to housing individuals. For soft (porous) surfaces such as carpeted floor, rugs, and drapes, remove visible contamination, if present, and clean with appropriate cleaners indicated for use on these surfaces. After cleaning: If the items can be laundered, launder items in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions using the hottest appropriate water setting for the items and then dry items completely. Dry clean items that cannot be washed.	• Normal cleaning
REMOVING PPE	Remove in this order: 1. Remove disposable apron/gown 2. Remove gloves and replace with new gloves 3. Remove face shield and N95 4. Remove gloves 5. Wash hands for 20 seconds immediately after removing all PPE	For extra voluntary PPE, remove in this order if necessary: 1. Disposable clothing (apron or gown) 2. Face shield and mask 3. Gloves 4. Wash hands for 20 seconds immediately after removing all PPE
DISPOSING OF WASTE DURING QUARANTINE AND ISOLATION	Person being housed shall place items in a plastic bag, wipe the outside with a disinfectant wipe, and set it outside the door. The plastic bag can be disposed in the regular trash.	Normal procedure
