Laboratory Safety



EH&S Moments that matter Customer Complaints

Faculty is upset at having to complete additional compliance work for his laboratory. EH&S has asked them to complete the Laboratory Hazard Assessment Tool, develop SOPs for each chemical, certify their laboratory is safe on a self-audit, and use an online form WASTe to pickup hazardous waste.

Staff are mad at all the facility problems they're experiencing, especially because no one is helping them fix it. EH&S has identified multiple problems in the Child

General Safety



Development Center during an including: tile inspection broken (asbestos), chipping (lead paint hazards), lack of Lockout/Tagout procedures for each equipment, evidence of unused paint being poured down the drain in a sink, and mold growing on the walls.

Students like to use a local street vendor "El Elotero" to help them fundraise for their clubs and organizations. They are upset that EH&S policies only allow food permits to be granted to campus organizations, but not to street vendors that work with them.

Scenario #2

Staff facilities Concern

EH&S staff #1

Bad example:

- Don't look at us, this is all Facilities' fault. They're the ones behind on their workorders
- Just pick up the phone and call them, I don't see what the problem is
- Why are you asking me to fix the problems when I'm not the one in your building in the first place
- You need to figure out who is pouring paint down the sink, that's a serious violation of environmental law
- If you can't come up with procedures for your equipment, then stop using it!

EH&S staff #2

Good example:

- I understand your frustration
- How we can work together to make this right?
- Not all of these hazards are life-threatening. Let's talk about how "safe" we need to be
- What if I work with Facilities to help address these issues for you?

Scenario #3

Student policy Concern

EH&S staff #1

- The law is the law. Why should he be exempt from getting a food permit, while other restaurants do it?
- You always pull the race card. This has nothing to do with it!
- You need to find another way to raise money
- We don't know how safe his food is. For all you know, he doesn't have training in handwashing techniques.
 That's why we give out food permits.

EH&S staff #2

Good example:

- I can see how you think our policies can seem exclusive
- It sounds like your dilemma involves a roadblock to your fundraising efforts
- Are there other options we can use for a vendor until this policy issue is resolved?
- Let's talk about coming up with a solution that can bring fairness to both our on-campus vendors as well as your organization
