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## **BUREAU OF INDIAN STANDARDS (BIS) COMPLETED 75 GLORIOUS YEARS**

• BIS is the National Standard Body of India established under the BIS Act 1986, assuming the functions of the erstwhile Indian Standards Institution (ISI).

> It is responsible for the harmonious development of the activities of standardisation, marking and quality certification of goods and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

> It functions under the aegis of Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution.

#### Significance of BIS

- > Standardisation: BIS follows internationally accepted good standardization practices to provide safe, reliable and high quality products to consumers.
- > Certification: Under it, a manufacturer of a particular product is given the self-marking rights of the BIS standards mark (ISI mark).
  - > BIS also operates various Management Systems Certification schemes
- > Hallmarking: BIS does hallmarking of gold, silver jewellery, gold bullion etc. to provide third party assurance to consumers on their purity or its fineness.

#### BIS Agenda for next 25 years:

- Work as a facilitator not an obstructer.
- To develop as a global organization, learning from global experiences and integrating global standards.
- OWork on Gap analysis to assess laboratory attesting needs of the country and set up high quality modern labs across India.
- Quality or standard revolution through One Nation One Standard
- Quality is not expensive it is cost effective.
- > Laboratory services: BIS has established eight laboratories in the country to cater to the testing need of samples generated from conformity assessment schemes.
  - > It also established Laboratory Recognition Scheme (LRS) for recognition of outside laboratories.

## SUPREME COURT (SC) GRANTS LAST CHANCE TO CENTRE TO RESPOND TO PIL ON IDENTIFYING MINORITIES AT STATE LEVEL

- PIL is seeking directions for framing of guidelines identifying minorities at the state level as Hindus are in a minority in 10 states.
  - > Plea has also been sought for minority status for Hindus in 6 states and 2 UTs, where number has fallen according to Census 2011.

#### • Minority status in India

- > Constitution does not define the word Minority and only refers to Minorities, rights of the minorities have been spelt out in detail under Article 29 and 30.
- > However, Centre, using National Commission for Minorities (NCM) Act, 1992, has declared Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains and Zoroastrians as 'minority'.
- > In TMA Pai Case, 2002, SC held that linguistic and religious minority are determined by taking state as a unit and not by taking into consideration the population of the country as a whole.
- > National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions (NCMEI) Act, 2004 has been enacted to safeguard the educational rights of the minorities.

#### **About NCMEI**



- O NCMEI, constituted under the **NCMEI Act, 2004,** serves as an appellate authority in respect of disputes pertaining to minority status.
- OIt is a quasi judicial body and has been endowed with the powers of a Civil Court.
- Olt has the power to cancel the minority status of an educational institution on grounds laid down in the Act.

#### • Benefits of getting minority status

- Minority communities' avail of exclusive schemes run by ministry of minority affairs.
- > Freedom to run educational institutions and trusts due to Article 30(1) and few other sections.



# PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS REGULATORY BOARD (PNGRB) FLOATS BIDS FOR CITY GAS DISTRIBUTION (CGD) NETWORKS

- Recently, PNGRB invited bids under '11A CGD Bidding Round' for CGD network in 5 geographical areas (GAs).
  - > Upon finalisation of bids under these rounds, 88% of the country's area would be authorised for development of CGD Network to provide access to natural gas to approximately 98% of the country's population.
- CGD refers to transportation or distribution of natural gas to enable the supply of cleaner cooking fuel (like Piped Natural Gas (PNG)) to households, industrial and commercial units as well as transportation fuel (like Compressed Natural Gas (CNG)) to vehicles through a network of pipelines.

#### CGD Networks in India:

- O Jagdishpur-Haldia-Bokaro-Dhamra Pipeline Project
- O Barauni- Guwahati Pipeline project
- O North East Region (NER) Gas Grid
- O Kochi-Koottanad- Bangalore-Mangalore Pipeline Project
- Ennore-Thiruvallur-Bangalore-Nagapattinam-Madurai-Tutico rin Natural gas pipeline.

#### About CGD network:

> Under the PNGRB Act 2006, PNGRB grants the authorization to the entities for developing a CGD network (including PNG network) in a specified GA of the country.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

- > CGD sector has 4 distinct segments: CNG predominantly used as auto-fuel, and PNG used in domestic, commercial and Industrial segments.
- > Benefits of PNG include: Safe and assured supply, convenient to use, no wastage, no hassle for replacement of cylinder or cylinder booking etc.
- > Benefits of CNG include: Very low levels of emissions, unlikely to ignite due to high ignition temperature, lowest injury and death rate per vehicle mile etc.

# MINISTRY OF STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLE-MENTATION RELEASES THE FIRST ADVANCE ESTIMATES (FAE) FOR 2021-22 I.E. FY22

- The FAE, first introduced in 2016-17, are typically published at the end of the first week of January.
  - > Finance Ministry uses the FAE GDP estimates to decide the next financial year's budget allocations.
  - > They are the "first" official estimates of how GDP is expected (hence called "advance" estimates) to grow in that financial year.
  - > However, they do not include the formal Q3 GDP data, which is published at the end of February as part of the Second Advance Estimates (SAE).

#### Key take away of FAE for FY 2022

### > GDP growth: **Real GDP** (GDP

calculated using constant 2011-12 prices) will grow by 9.2%,

#### **About GDP**

- OGDP refers to the total value of all final goods and services prod**uced** within the country in a financial year.
- O Nominal GDP is the actual observed variable. All Budget calculations start with the nominal GDP. Real GDP is a derived metric.
- Real GDP = Nominal GDP Inflation Rate.

(GDP calculated using current market prices) will grow by 17.6%.

- > The difference between the two growth rates about 8.5% is essentially a marker of inflation.
- > **Spending:** Government spending and investment will recover. But, average Indian in terms of income and expenditure recovery is still pre Covid level.
- > Low Private Consumption: Weak levels of private demand will make it difficult to sustain economic growth.

# 'UNIFORM CIVIL CODE (UCC) IS PUBLIC POLICY MATTER, **NO DIRECTION CAN BE ISSUED** TO PARLIAMENT': CENTRE TO **DELHI HIGH COURT**

- Centre further informed Delhi High Court that the matter of implementation of the UCC is currently pending with the Law Commission of India.
- A UCC refers to a single law, applicable to all the citizens their personal matters such as marriage, divorce, custody, adoption and inheritance.
  - > It is intended to replace the system of fragmented personal laws, currently govern interpersonal relationships and related matters within different religious communities
- Arguments favouring of UCC
  - > Article 44 of Constitution stating 'State shall endeavor to secure a UCC'.
  - make judicial pronouncements enforceable (Mohd. Ahmed Khan v. Shah Bano Begum, 1985 and Sarla Mudgal v Union of India, 1995).
  - > National integration as Different laws for different religious groups communalism
  - ➤ **Gender Justice** as Mostly the religious or customary personal laws are biased in favour of men.
- Arguments against UCC
  - Parliament does not have exclusive laws' jurisdiction over 'Personal (mentioned in the Concurrent List).
  - > Contradicts to Article 25 (individual's fundamental right to religion), Article 26(b) (right of each religious denomination).
  - > Against the diversity of the country.





## ISIAN WATERBIRD CENSUS (AWC) BEING CONDUCTED IN INDIA

- AWC is being carried out across 7 wetlands in the NCR- Hastinapur Wildlife Sanctuary; Dhanauri and Suraipur wetlands in Greater Noida; Delhi Zoo and Sanjay Lake; Okhla Bird Sanctuary; Najafgarh Jheel; and Yamuna River.
- About AWC:
  - > It is conducted in January each year and is coordinated by the Wetlands International South Asia and the Bombay Natural **History Society** (a NGO).
  - > It is an integral part of the global waterbird monitoring programme, the International Waterbird Census (IWC), coordinated by Wetlands International.
    - > IWC is a monitoring programme to collect information on the numbers of waterbirds at wetland sites.
  - > It runs in parallel with other regional programmes of the International Waterbird Census in Africa, Europe, West Asia, the **Neotropics and the Caribbean.**
  - > It is also an important part of the environment ministry's National Action Plan for conservation of Migratory Birds and their habitats along the Central Asian Flyways.
- Objectives of the census:
  - > To obtain information on an annual basis of waterbird populations at wetlands in the region during the non-breeding period of most species (January).
  - > To monitor on an annual basis the status and condition of wetlands,
  - > To encourage greater interest in waterbirds and wetlands amongst citizens.

## ALSO IN NEWS



- SC has upheld the constitutional validity of the 27% reservation for OBC in NEET UG and PG hence allowing the resumption of counselling for NEET-PG and UG courses.
- SC Judgement:
  - > Upheld 10% for the EWS in the All India Quota (AIQ) seats.
  - > Question of the validity of the EWS criteria, including income threshold would be decided upon by SC in March 2022.
  - > ₹8 lakh gross annual family income limit criterion for identifying the EWS, as originally notified would be implemented.



- The Delhi HC is hearing pleas seeking to criminalise marital rape in India.
- Legal provisions regarding Marital Rape
  - > In India, marital rape is not defined in any law.
  - > Section 375 of IPC deals with rape, according to which sexual intercourse by a man with his wife aged 15 years (increased to 18 years by Supreme Court in 2018) or above is not rape even if it is without her consent.
  - > Section 498A of IPC deals with women being subjected to cruelty by her husband or any relative of her husband.



- Thousands of troops from CSTO arrived in Kazakhstan to restore order amid spiraling unrest in Kazakhstan.
- CSTO is a **Russia-led military alliance** that promotes the collective defence of any member that comes under external aggression.
  - > CSTO originates from Collective Security Treaty signed in 1992 by Russia and few Central Asian
  - > CSTO is based on the principle of collective defense just like NATO.
- Current members: Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, the Russian and the Tajikistan.



**India's Nuclear Doctrine (ND)** 

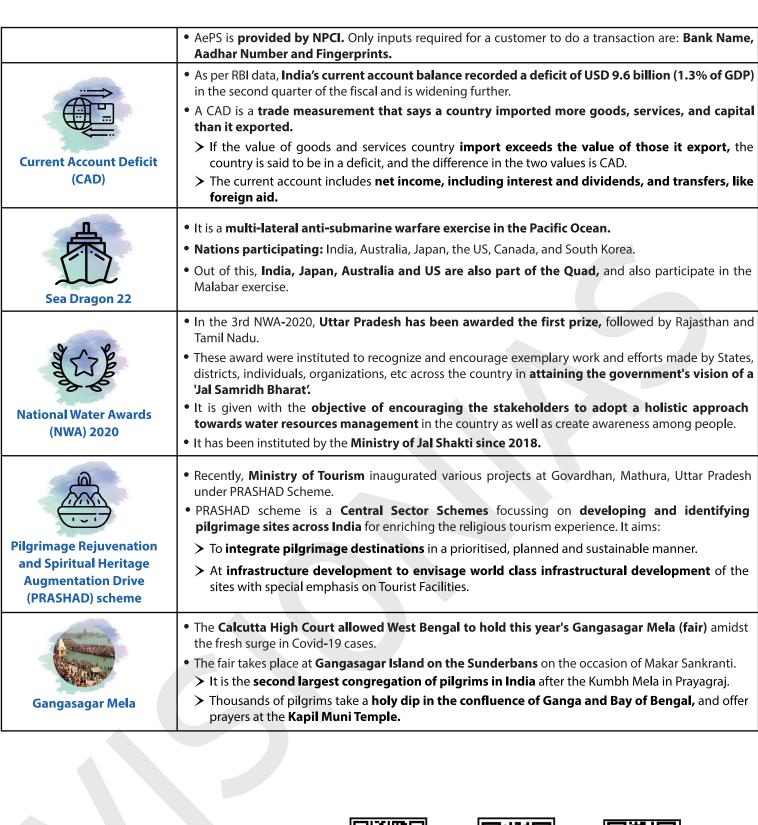
**Organization (CSTO)** 

- India welcomed the joint statement by nuclear weapon states (Britain, China, France, Russia and US) on preventing nuclear war while reiterating on maintaining its own nuclear doctrine.
  - > 5 key nuclear-armed nations had earlier said that a nuclear war cannot be won and must never be fought while vowing to prevent the spread of atomic weapons.
- India's stand on Nuclear weapons
- > Building and maintaining a credible minimum deterrence.
- > Goal of universal, non-discriminatory and verifiable nuclear disarmament.
- "No First Use" policy
- Non-use of nuclear weapons against non-nuclear weapon states.



Systems (AePS)

- National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has introduced limits for cash withdrawals and mini statements to standardise transactions through AePS.
- > Presently, Cash withdrawal from micro ATMs of AePS has a **limit of Rs 10,000 per transaction**.
- AePS is a bank led model which allows online interoperable financial inclusion transaction at PoS (MicroATM) through the Business correspondent of any bank using the Aadhaar authentication.
  - > BC are retail agents engaged by banks for providing banking services at locations other than a bank branch/ATM.
