# SUPREME COURT (SC) UPHOLDS 27% OBC OUOTA IN NEET

- SC upheld the constitutional validity of quota for Other Backward Classes candidates within NEET-PG and NEET-UG All India Quota seats for 2021-22 admissions.
  - > SC held that 'reservation is not at odds with merit but furthers its distributive consequences'.
    - > Distributive justice is concerned with the fair distribution of the burdens and benefits of social cooperation among diverse persons with competing needs and claims.
- SC gave following reasons to approve 27% OBC reservation:
  - > Articles 15(4) and 15 (5) are not an exception to Article 15 (1) of Constitution of India, which itself sets out the principle of substantive equality (including the recognition of existing inequalities).
  - Merit cannot be reduced to narrow definitions of performance in an open competitive examination which only provides formal equality of opportunity.
  - ➤ High scores in an examination are not a proxy for merit. Merit should be **socially** contextualized and reconceptualized as an instrument that advances social goods like equality.
- SC also accepted the recommendation of the Ajay Bhushan Pandey Committee to stick to the prescribed Rs 8 lakh income limit for **EWS quota** for the current admission cycle.
- NEET has been the uniform entrance test for medical courses across the country. Though the same examination is held across the country, a chunk of the seats in state medical/dental colleges is reserved for students domiciled in their respective states. The remaining seats —15% in UG and 50% in PG — are surrendered by the states to the All-India Quota (AIQ).
  - > Reservation for the OBC and EWS categories within the AIQ will be offered in medical colleges from the current academic year.

# REVISED RURAL AREA DEVELOPMENT PLAN FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION (RADPFI) GUIDELINES RELEASED

- Released by: Ministry of Panchayati Raj.
- RADPFI guidelines aim is to have planned spatial development for overall integrated development of villages.
- Need of Spatial Planning
  - > Unplanned spatial development in Gram Panchayats
  - > Extended Urbanisation Area,
  - > Emergence of Census Towns,
  - > Improve the Quality of Life & Sustainability of Gram Panchayats,
  - > Integration of Reforms/programs (SVAMITVA, RURBAN, New changes in State Acts & Amendments, re-emphasis on Disaster, Climate Change, Resilience Codes, etc.)
  - ➤ Need to be linked to Agro-Climatic Regions/zones linked to SDGs
- New Guideline (2021) is Focused on
  - > To prepare the spatial development plan, focus on **Typology of villages** i.e population, agro-climatic zones, Hill areas, disaster occurrence etc;
  - > Village Town Planning Scheme (VPS) through community based on Collaborative Planning.
  - > Linking 15th Finance Commission with State Finance commission with respect to village level planning.
  - > Integrating/Consolidation of GP Development with RURBAN CLUSTERS/Block/District Plan, as per the 73rd and 74th CAA and GPDP.
  - > Improving the E-Governance through Spatial Data Infrastructure.
  - > Use of SVAMITVA (and other digital tools) for the Abadi area (linking to land records).
  - > Planning for environmental benefit and disaster preparedness.










# STATES OPPOSE RULE CHANGE ON CENTRAL POSTING OF IAS OFFICERS

- Centre has proposed amendments to the IAS (Cadre) Rules 1954 in order to exercise greater control in central deputation of IAS officials.
  - > At present, a cadre officer may, with the concurrence of the State Governments concerned and the Central Government, be deputed for service under Central Government or another State Government etc.
- What amendments propose?
  - > Each State Government shall make available for deputation, such number of eligible officers of various levels, adjusted proportionately by the number of officers available with State Government vis-à-vis total authorized strength of State cadre at a given point of time.
  - > In case State does not give effect to Central government's decision within specified time, "officer shall stand relieved from cadre from date as may be specified by Central government."
  - > In specific situation where services of cadre officers are required by Central government in "public interest" State shall give effect to its decisions within a specified time.
- Why do states oppose?
  - > States are arguing that the amendment is against spirit of cooperative federalism and state's power to veto an IAS or IPS officer's central deputation, or issue an objection or no objection notice, stands 'defunct'.
- Rules have been brought as Centre has been facing a huge crunch of IAS and **IPS officers** as the states do not want to release their cadre officers easily.
  - According to DoPT, number of central deputation reserve of IAS officers has gone down from 309 in 2011 to 223 presently.

# INDIA LAUNCHES SLEW OF INFRA & DEVELOPMENT **PROJECTS IN MAURITIUS**

- India inaugurated the **Social Housing Project**, and laid the foundation stones for a Civil Service College and an 8 MWt Solar PV Farm project.
  - > Two agreements were also exchanged, one for extension of US\$ 190 million Line of Credit to Mauritius for the Metro Express and other infrastructure projects and MoU on the Implementation of Small Development Projects.
- India Mauritius relations
  - > Indian origin people comprise nearly 70% of Mauritius's population.
  - > Both signed Comprehens ive Economic Cooperation and **Partnershp Agreement** (CECPA), in 2021.



- > Both signed agreements in security realm including transfer of a Dornier aircraft and an Advanced Light Helicopter, Dhruv.
- > Earlier, India in 2016 had extended a grant of US\$ 353 mn as Special **Economic Package** to execute priority projects.
- Mauritius occupies a special place in India's vision of 'SAGAR' (Security and **Growth for All in the Region)** for building a secured regional architecture.
  - > Mauritius' proximity to important Sea lines of communications to West Asian oil fields.
- Challenges for India- Mauritius relations: China's growing presence and influence in the Indian Ocean region, round-trip of investments in India through Mauritius, etc.

# CENTRE TO RANK STATES ON **FASTER GREEN NODS**

- Environment ministry plans to rank State environment impact assessment authorities (SEIAAs), on the speed with which they accord environmental clearances (EC) development projects.
  - > SEIAAs are responsible for providing environmental clearance for a bulk of the infrastructure, developmental industrial projects.
  - > This is intended as a mode of recognition and encouragement and for prompting **improvements** where needed.

### Parameters

- > Average number of days taken to accept proposals seeking either EC or terms of reference (ToR) for projects;
- > Number of complaints addressed;
- > Percentage of cases for which site visits are carried out:
- > Percentage of cases in which additional information is sought from project proponents more than once;
- > Disposal percentage of proposals seeking fresh or amended ToRs that are older than 30 days; and the disposal percentage of proposals seeking fresh or amended EC that are older than 120 days

### • Concerns:

- > May weaken the authority of the SEIAAs by imposing time limits on their functioning.
- > Rating system is in violation of the Constitutional responsibility of Central Government to protect the environment.
- > The process undermines scientific rigour in the decision making process.





# **ALSO IN NEWS**



'Agri Nutri Garden **Week' under Deendayal** Antyodaya Yojana -**National Rural Livelihood Mission** (DAY-NRLM)

- It aims establishment of 'Agri Nutri Gardens' in the rural households through awareness campaign and encouraging.
- It's agenda is to support rural poor household to have Agri Nutri Garden to fulfill the need of the family's nutrition and any excess production can also be sold for income generation.
- It also aims promoting nutritional awareness, education and behavioural change, harnessing traditional knowledge and implementing nutrition-sensitive agriculture through homestead agriculture and nutri-garden.
- DAY-NRLM is flagship program for promoting poverty reduction through building strong **institutions** of the poor, particularly women.



• First BRICS Sherpas meeting of 2022 was held virtually.

## About Sherpas:

- > A Sherpa is a **personal representative** of the leader of a member country at an international Summit such as the G8, G20 etc.
  - > The term is derived from the Nepalese Sherpa people, who serve as guides for mountaineers in the Himalayas.
- > They coordinate the agenda, seek consensus, and participate in a series of pre-Summit **consultations** to help negotiate their leaders' positions.
- > There is only one Sherpa per Summit for each member country.



• Border Security Force (BSF) launched operation 'Sard Hawa' at the international border of Rajasthan, under which vigil will be beefed-up to check the instances of infiltration due to the dense fog in the area.

- The operation will be carried out from January 23 to 28.
- BSF conducts "Operation Garam Hawa" in summer and "Operation Sard Hawa" in winter every
- BSF is a central armed police force (CAPF) that functions under the Union government. It was raised in 1965.
- BSF is deployed along the Pakistan and Bangladesh borders. It is also deployed in areas affected by Left Wing Extremism etc.



• Centre may reduce the moisture content (MC) limit for wheat, paddy, hence more tightening of MC limits.

- > MC is the weight of water contained in a product expressed in percent.
- > Reason for high moisture in Crop: Untimely rain, lack of storages, overirrigation.
- At present, farmers have to take a price cut on MSP when selling wheat stocks above the 12% limit to FCI.
  - > Stocks with above 14% moisture are rejected.
- According to the proposal wheat stocks with moisture content above 12% will not be procured even with a price cut.




• I-LAB is first of its kind Mobile Diagnostic Laboratory (I-LAB) is capable of performing both RT-PCR and ELISA.

- I-LAB is dedicated to provide COVID testing access to rural and remote parts of the North Eastern Region.
- It is a biosafety facility and can also be utilised for testing of other infectious diseases like TB, HIV, and therefore will remain relevant even in post-COVID times.



- BrahMos, supersonic cruise missile, with increased indigenous content and improved performance, was successfully test-fired.
- BrahMos missile (Indo-Russian joint venture) variants can be launched from land, air, sea and under water.
  - > The range of the missile was originally capped at 290 km as per obligations of the Missile **Technology Control Regime (MTCR).**
  - > Following India's entry in MTCR in 2016, it was decided to extend the range to 450 km and to 600 km at a later stage.
- Recently, Philippines has approved a \$374.96 million contract for the purchase of shore based anti-ship variant of the missile from India.



### Tyagaraja (4 May 1767 – 6 January 1847)

- A great saint and music composer, he was born in the village of Thiruvayaru in the Thanjavur district
- Tyagaraja is considered the most legendary Carnatic music composer of all time, who played a very significant role in the development of this music genre.
  - > He saw music as a means to experience the love of god and as such, his sole intention was purely devotional while performing.
- He is the largest composer of Telugu Carnatic music.
- Values: Rama bhakti, Devotion, commitment, spirituality

### **Tahiti**

- Scientists have discovered a pristine, 3-km long reef of giant rose-shaped corals off the coast of Tahiti.
  - > Discovery suggests that there may be many more unknown large reefs in our oceans, given that only about 20% of the entire seabed is mapped.
- The island of Tahiti is the largest island in French **Polynesia.** Papeete, on Tahiti's northwestern coast, is the capital and administrative centre of French Polynesia.
- French Polynesia is overseas collectivity of France consisting of five archipelagos in the south-central Pacific Ocean.
