Industry News

H.R. 529 (115th Congress)

- Employer tax incentives
- Removes twice-annual reallocation
- Allows rollovers from 529s to ABLE
- No penalty for:
 - Payment of student loans
 - Donations to charity

State News

- IL issues RFP for new advisor-sold plan
- OH RFI for CollegeAdvantage

Industry Statistics

- \$252 billion in 529 savings at 12/31/16
 - Up 1.6% from \$248B at 9/30/16
 - Up 9.3% from \$230.5B at 12/31/15
- Net inflows of \$2.7B vs. \$2.6B in 4Q15
- 12 million savings accounts

 \$23B in prepaid plans with 1.1mm accounts (down from \$24B in 3Q16)
