













COVID-19 Confirmed Total Case Counts and Deaths by Region, Washington and Western States, US and British Columbia (as of May 6, 2020)









- Help set general expectations for May.
- Communicate changes in Stay Home, Stay Healthy order as they are made public.
- Keep public informed of developments relating to Public Health Advisory Board's Reopening Task Force.
- Communicate about importance and reliability issues of antibody testing.
- Provide connections for survivors of domestic violence.
