






COVID-19 in Whatcom County, by School District Recent Two Week Case Rates & Cumulative Counts

- When analyzing data geographically, school districts are used as community boundaries because people often identify their community in connection to schools and school districts.


Newly diagnosed cases per 100,000 people during the prior two weeks, by Whatcom County School District Geography *see Data Explainer or FAQs





Update from Whatcom County Health Department - Testing

- The mobile testing unit will continue in its testing phase next week. It has been successful so far.
- The mobile testing unit will be available for at least one day per week in each school district; however residents may visit the testing unit in whichever school district it is that day, no matter where they live.
- The scheduler website will be active starting Saturday evening, and people will be able to schedule themselves for testing.
- The mobile testing unit has the capacity to test up to four people every three minutes.
- Test results will be provided via a website which users will be able to access as soon as they receive an email stating that their results are available.
 - o Test results will take 24-72 hours to receive.

SECTION UPDATES

LOGISTICS

- 1. Continuing to provide support and supplies to Byron Avenue I/Q facility.
- 2. Continuing to reconfirm and validate previously identified I/Q facilities for potential future needs.
- 3. Continuing to research and compile sourcing options for PPE and connecting customers directly to distributors on our supply list, when feasible.
- 4. Continuing to interact with the state for meeting PPE requirements.
- 5. Continuing to support staffing for ongoing, weekly food delivery efforts.
- 6. Providing resources, support, and volunteer staffing needed for the Whatcom County Health Department's mobile COVID-19 testing program.
- 7. Establishing a traffic flow plan and inventory checklist to enhance the setup, take down, and accessibility of the mobile testing site.
- 8. Working on providing cloth face masks to each school district within Whatcom County.

OPERATIONS

- 1. Supporting Friday's scheduled food delivery efforts to numerous Whatcom County Households and providing traffic control support during scheduled food distribution efforts.
- 2. Continuing operations of the Byron Avenue I/Q facility with the admittance of community members needing isolation/quarantine. Currently, one room is occupied.
- 3. Working towards making rooms at Byron Avenue I/Q facility operable at double capacity to increase the number of beds available for individuals.
- 4. Working in coordination with the Whatcom County Health Department to support the mobile COVID-19 testing program.

PLANNING

- 1. Continue to meet with the Healthcare Coalition to plan the development of a combined COVID-19 evaluation, testing, and medical surge facility.
- Working with the Food Security Branch, the Bellingham Food Bank, and the Opportunity Council to transfer food distribution support by the end of August to a sustainable model provided by other community agencies.
- 3. Working to amend site plans for the remote food distribution program.
- 4. Working in collaboration with members of the Whatcom Health Department and local healthcare professionals on management and dissemination of COVID-19 data.
- 5. Working on developing a revised traffic plan for onsite food distribution locations.
- 6. Working in collaboration with the Logistics section to expand the pool of volunteers being utilized for volunteer staffing.
