






COVID-19 in Whatcom County

Rate: Number of confirmed cases per 100,000 people for the past two weeks (11/01-11/14/20) *See Data Explainer for info




Count: Cumulative cases of COVID-19




WHATCOM COUNTY HOSPITALIZATION COUNTS



SECTION UPDATES

LOGISTICS

- 1. Support volunteer staffing needs for ongoing, weekly food distribution efforts.
- 2. Provide resources, support, and volunteer staffing needed for the community-wide low barrier COVID-19 mobile testing program.
- 3. Complete modification of the Byron Ave I/Q facility fencing and security.
- 4. Begin implementation of inclement weather low barrier COVID-19 testing site.

OPERATIONS

- 1. Support Wednesday's scheduled food stocking efforts and provide traffic control support during food distribution operations.
- 2. Continue operations of the Byron Avenue I/Q facility for community members needing isolation/quarantine. Currently, 8 rooms are occupied. Cumulatively, the I/Q facility has provided a total of 948 bed days of service for 120 community members.
- 3. Continue to refine the operations plan for the community low barrier COVID-19 testing program.
- 4. Continue to implement the community low barrier COVID-19 testing program.
- 5. Increase access and availability to COVID-19 testing by adding additional testing dates and appointment times.
- 6. Identify and implement modifications of Byron Ave I/Q facility services to increase efficiency and security measures.
- 7. Continue daily operations supported by the communicable disease division at WCHD for case identification, interviewing, contact tracing, community mitigation, and isolation and quarantine work.
- 8. Finalize plans to move the low barrier COVID-19 testing program to the inclement weather testing location.

PLANNING

- 1. Continue to plan for Whatcom County's coordinated, collaborative and community approach for COVID-19 medical surge response.
- 2. Ongoing review and edit of the status report template to be utilized for data updates in the medical surge plan.
- 3. Coordinate with local and regional healthcare agencies to plan for future COVID-19 vaccination.
- 4. Plan for WCHD to assist with increasing flu vaccine rates in Whatcom County.
- 5. Assist food security community partner agencies in transitioning their food distribution programs to self-supported, sustainable operations.
- 6. Implement inclement weather plans for all outdoor WUC operations.
- 7. Coordinate combined strategic planning efforts and data management responsibilities.
- 8. Conduct daily data entry, analyzation and reporting to support and inform Operations.
- 9. Update relevant ICS forms in the IAP software in preparation for the next operational period.
