Hebrews 12:1-3 (NIV)

[1] Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.

[4] In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. [5] And you have forgotten that word of encouragement that addresses you as sons: "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you,

[6] because the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son.” [7] Endure [hardship as] discipline; God is treating you as sons. For what son is not disciplined by his father? [8] If you are not disciplined (and everyone undergoes discipline), then you are illegitimate children and not true sons.

- (1) Cannot marry someone who is an Israelite.**

(#1) Cannot marry someone who is an Israelite.

> In NT > only marriage in the Kingdom, is our marriage to Jesus.

(Ephesians 5:22-33; Rev. 19:7-9)

(#2) The children of an illegitimate person also cannot marry into the congregation of Israel for 10 generations.

> Because of the way the New Covenant is set up, I'm not sure that point applies to us in the New Testament.

(#3) They could not hold public office as an elder, judge, magistrate, priest, or other official in Israel. (Dake)

> In the NT - The only ruling and reigning that is emphasized has to do with establishing the Kingdom of God on earth. It's dealing with spiritual / supernatural activity.

3 reasons in New Testament why prayers are not answered

(#1) Unbelief (believing the wrong thing)

- Hebrews 3 & 4

(#2) Sin / Disobedience

- Hebrews 3 & 4

(#3) Refusing God's Discipline

(Illegitimate son)

- Hebrews 12

Question: How do you know if God is Disciplining you?

- Are you in sin....., willful Disobedience.....??**
 - Ask the Holy Spirit > He will talk to you.....**
- (Don't expect some Big Thing.....)**

Acts 17:29-31 (AMP)

[29] Since then we are God's offspring, we ought not to suppose that Deity (the Godhead) is like gold or silver or stone, [of the nature of] a representation by human art and imagination, or anything constructed or invented.

Laymans' Definition:

- **Discipline: Forward progress stops; benefits withheld.**

Something happens in our lives that stings.

- **Punishment: Backward slide; benefits are lost.**

**True Wisdom and Knowledge is
built on the Fear of the Lord**

A. What does that mean?

1. Godly Fear is to create the Knowledge & Wisdom that the rest of our life on earth is to stand upon.

2. What God thinks about anything and everything is the starting point / foundation for all other thoughts, plans, words, and action.

- a. All facts (Knowledge) are measured against that.**
- b. Every application (Wisdom) of Knowledge is to be measured against that.**
- c. All reasoning, speculation, and philosophy - if it is going to be accurate - must begin with that.**

- c. The Fear of God will create true
Wisdom and Knowledge in our lives.**
- d. One rule of thumb to know if we're in
it or not:**
- In all our Knowledge / Wisdom,**

> If we hate evil (anything contrary to Yahweh Jesus, and the Holy Spirit) we have Godly Fear.

> If we accept evil, make excuses for it, and/ or willfully choose to live in it - we don't have the Fear of the Lord, which will skew the rest of our perceptions & perspectives.

1. Instruction > Correction > Discipline > Punishment.
