# Size of the Internet "Unimaginable"

"By the end of 2016, global internet traffic will reach 1.1 zettabytes per year...by 2019, global traffic is expected to hit 2 zettabytes per year. One zettabyte is the equivalent of 36,000 years of high-definition video, which in turn, is the equivalent of streaming Netflix's entire catalog 3,177 times; in just three minutes, the amount of data travelling over the internet in just three minutes is the digital equivalent of every motion picture ever made in the last 120 years."

"...the Washington Post estimated that there are 305,500,000,000 pages online. How long would it take to download the entire Web: 11 trillion years."

- Each day the internet processes
   1,742,000,000,000,000,000
   (quintillion) gigabytes of
   information.
- One gigabyte = 64,782 8.5" x
   11" pages of data.

 If all the data on the global internet were in one day printed on 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper, it would reach 8,300 miles high and take 16,000,000 trees to produce that much paper.

 The average adolescent takes in 34GB of data every 24 hours into his/her brain from a "moving screen." This equals 2,202,588 - 8.5" x 11" pages of data. (And you wonder why they have a short attention span? Some estimate it is 8 seconds.)



Share of adults in the United States who are online almost constantly in 2018 - by age.





Then the other 9 all chimed in that it was a part of their lives.

Not often am I really surprised, but this shocked even me.

100% watch porn.

The sad commentary is that probably none of the pastors

(youth leader/pastors) nor their parents, would believe it.

## Column: Why millennials are drawn to socialism Chicago Tribune. May 18, 2018 Capitalism has been the most dynamic force for economic progress in history. Over the past century, it has delivered billions of people out of miserable poverty, raised living standards to once-unimaginable heights and enabled an unprecedented flourishing of productive creativity. But among young Americans, it finds itself on trial.

The University of Chicago's GenForward Survey of Americans age 18 to 34 finds that 62 percent think "we need a strong government to handle today's complex economic problems," with just 35 percent saying "the free market can handle these problems without government being involved."

Overall, 49 percent in this group hold a favorable opinion of capitalism — and 45 percent have a positive view of socialism. Socialism gets higher marks than capitalism, though, from Hispanics, Asian-Americans and African-Americans. Sixty-one percent of Democrats take a positive view of socialism — and so do 25 percent of Republicans. Contrast the millennials' opinions with those of their parents. A survey last year found that only 26 percent of baby boomers would prefer to live in a socialist country. Among young people, the figure was 44 percent.

What explains this generational divergence? The first factor is that young adults may take for granted the bounty capitalism has bestowed, from cellphones to inexpensive air travel to an endless array of food and beverage options. They can't remember the time when those things didn't exist. But they will never forget the pain and uncertainty caused by the brutal recession of 2007-09, which has taken years to overcome. Financial catastrophe is bound to foster disenchantment with the economic order.

'This troubling turn highlights widespread historical illiteracy in American society' By Bradford Richardson - The Washington Times -Saturday, November 4, 2017 The majority of millennials would prefer to live in a socialist, communist or fascist nation rather than a capitalistic one, according to a new poll. In the Victims of Communism Memorial Foundation's "Annual Report on U.S. Attitudes Toward Socialism," 58 percent of the up-and-coming generation opted for one of the three systems, compared to 42 percent who said they were in favor of capitalism.

# **What Is The Difference Between**"Gender" And "Sex"?

When two words have the same meaning, we call them synonyms. When two words have different meanings but people use them interchangeably, we write articles about what those words actually mean. Take gender and sex. While people substitute one for the other on the regular, their meaning and usage are significantly—and consequentially—different. Because we're most often talking about human beings when we use these terms, it's critical we get them straight. Give respect to get respect, right?

## What does the word sex mean?

First, let's talk about sex (baby). Intercourse aside for these purposes, sex is "a label assigned at birth based on the reproductive organs you're born with." It's generally how we divide society into two groups, male and female—though intersex people are born with both male and female reproductive organs.

(Important note: Hermaphrodite is a term that some find offensive.)

What does gender mean? Gender, on the other hand, goes beyond one's reproductive organs and includes a person's perception, understanding, and experience of themselves and roles in society. It's their inner sense about who they're meant to be and how they want to interact with the world.

While a person can only change their sex via surgery, one's gender is more fluid and based on how they identify. If someone's gender identity aligns with their biological sex, we refer to them as cisgender people. Gender is often spoken about as a social construct, for what a society considers to be female, for example, is based on such things as beliefs and values—not nature. That women are supposed to wear dresses and that "boys don't cry" are, ultimately, made-up social customs and conventions.

What does transgender mean? However, one's gender identity and sex as assigned at birth don't always align. For example, while someone may be born with male reproductive organs and be classified as a male at birth, their gender identity may be female or something else.

We refer to these individuals as transgender people (trans- a prefix meaning "beyond" or "across"). In some cases, they may take hormones and/or undergo surgery to better sync the two; in other cases, they simply live their life as the gender they feel best represents them. Well, as simply as society lets them,

which, as we know, is all too often not the case. Use of the term transgender should be used appropriately though. Calling an individual a transgender or a trans is offensive. In other words, it should be used as an adjective, not a noun, when referring to individuals (e.g., a person who is transgender or transgender rights).

Transgender individuals may also identify as genderqueer. And, some people may have a changing experience or expression of their own gender; this can be called gender-fluid or genderflux. Wikipedia > wiki > Gender **Gender - Wikipedia**

- Sex Gender Identity and expression



Historically, the terms "sex" and "gender" have been used interchangeably, but their uses are becoming increasingly distinct, and it is important to understand the differences between the two.

This article will look at the meaning of "sex" and the differences between the sexes. It will also look at the meaning of "gender," and the concepts of gender roles, gender identity, and gender expression.

In general terms, "sex" refers to the biological differences between males and females, such as the genitalia and genetic differences.

"Gender" is more difficult to define, but it can refer to the role of a male or female in society, known as a gender role, or an individual's concept of themselves, or gender identity.

Sometimes, a person's genetically assigned sex does not line up with their gender identity. These individuals might refer to themselves as transgender, nonbinary, or gender-nonconforming.

- There are more ways to heaven than just one God - specifically Jesus.

## d. Blind Inclusiveness.

The church is expected to tolerate and even embrace these viewpoints, and if we don't - we're the right-wing radicals, we're unloving homophobics, too exclusive, and too restrictive.
