Word of Life Ministries 3640 County Rd 6 NW Stanchfield, MN 55080 To have a clear understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives — it is necessary to know how He operates like the Father and the Son, as well as, how He carries a different emphasis from that of the Father and the Son. To help us gain that understanding, we are going to take an individual look at the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. Our purpose is to learn to understand them and know them in a more personal way; as well as, understand how each of them relates differently to our lives.

This booklet deals with scriptural descriptions of God. (Hebrew - Elohim ---- Greek - Theos) When studying the word "GOD", it must be kept in mind that these Hebrew and Greek words refer to the Trinity in general. Therefore it can be difficult to understand if the verse is referring to all the members of the Trinity, or if it is specifically referring to one of the Trinity. Sometimes this can be discovered by looking closely at the context. As you study the scriptures which deal directly with the Father, it will be easily seen that ALL ORIGINATES WITH AND FLOWS FROM THE FATHER. ALL IS BROUGHT TO MAN THROUGH THE SON, AND IS APPLIED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT!!! So as you begin studying in this first booklet, bear in mind - eventhough some of the scriptures could be applied to Jesus, and/or the Holy Spirit - they are still very accurate descriptions of what the Father is like. REMEMBER: WHAT THE FATHER IS - THAT IS WHAT THE SON AND HOLY SPIRIT ARE. The Flow is ALWAYS from the Father. The Son and the Holy Spirit are of the Father and One with the Father.

In this first booklet, we are trying to get to know God. How He thinks - What He wants - His perspectives - Our relationship with Him - Etc. All of the scriptures in this study refer to the Father, eventhough the complete Trinity is included via the definitions of the word "God".

In a Nut-Shell, this is how we can differentiate the Father's working with man from Christ's and the Holy Spirit's -- and how we can differentiate Christ's working with man from the other two -- as well as differentiating the Work of the Holy Spirit:

Work of the Holy Spirit:

The Father: He is the Source of everything. He is the one ultimately

in control. He is the supreme authority in the Trinity. The Son and Holy Spirit answer to the Father. He is the one who sets the Destiny of ALL things. He is the ultimate originator of ALL things. He takes care of the overall picture of the Life. Covenants are made with the Father. He is the one planning, working, and bringing to pass everything in the Trinity's destiny for our lives.

The Son:

He is the Savior. He is the one who has established the covenant between man and the Father. He is the direction giver from the Father to the Holy Spirit. He is the mediator/intercessor between man and the Father. He is the Baptizer with the Holy Spirit. He is the Head

of the Church. He carries the government of His church and of this world on His shoulders. He is the Problem Resolver between the Father and man. It is through Christ that everything flows from the Father to man, and Vice/Versa.

The Holy Spirit: He is the one actively at work on this earth with man. He is the one who is literally with us at all times. He is the one who lives with us and in us. He is the Counselor/Comforter/Helper. He is the one who applies what Jesus says the Father desires. He is the one who helps us perform what the Father desires. He is the one who habitually speaks with us, teaches us, leads us, works with us, and ministers to us/through us according to what the Father desires.

ALL THINGS OF GOD come to us FROM THE FATHER, THROUGH JESUS THE SON, BY THE HOLY SPIRIT. In a very concise manner, this is the difference in the working of the Three in our lives. Until we can understand that they are one in purpose, character, power, glory, desire, attitude, etc. --- but yet very different in personality, office, responsibility, and their operation with man --- We will have difficulty really grasping why the Holy Spirit is here on this earth. That will hinder us in responding to and flowing with Him; WHICH WILL HINDER OUR SPIRITUAL GROWIH AND EFFECTIVENESS.
