achieving the 2 key behaviors.				
Once a puzzle is solved, spend time talking about the solution by asking some of these questions: • How many of you face this challenge? • Would this solution help you to eat more F/V? • Would this solution help you to be more physically active? • Who might try this solution this week? Compare participant solutions with those identified in the game and discuss which option				
might work for them. Goal time: 10 minutes
