#### State of Hawaii, State Procurement Office (SPO) Price List Contract No. 15-10.

This Addendum will add the State of Hawaii as a Participating State to purchase from the NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement Number 3091 with Ricoh USA, Inc.

#### 1. Scope:

This Addendum covers NASPO ValuePoint (formerly WSCA-NASPO) Copiers, Printers & Related Devices 14-19 led by the State of Nevada for use by state agencies and other entities located in the Participating State authorized by the state's statutes to utilize state contracts.

#### Participation:

All jurisdictions located within the State of Hawaii, which have obtained prior written approval of its respective Chief Procurement Officer, will be allowed to purchase from the Master Agreement. Private nonprofit health or human services organizations with current purchase of service contracts governed by Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) chapter 103F are eligible to participate in the SPO price/vendor list contracts upon mutual agreement between the Contractor and the nonprofit. (Each such participating jurisdiction and participating nonprofit is hereinafter referred to as a "Participating Entity.") Issues of interpretation and eligibility for participation are to be determined solely by the Administrator of the SPO.

# 3. Changes:

A. Usage Reports: Contractor shall submit a quarterly State of Hawaii gross sales report to the Participating State contact person listed in Paragraph 5, below, (or as amended), in accordance with the following schedule:

Report Due
April 30
July 31
October 31
January 31

The quarterly report shall be subtotaled by each Participating Entity. The quarterly report shall also include any adjustments from prior periods.

- B. The validity of this Addendum, any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties to this Addendum, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Hawaii. Any action at law or in equity to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Addendum shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- C. Inspection of Facilities. Pursuant to HRS §103D-316, the Participating State, at reasonable times, may inspect the part of the plant or place of business of the Contractor or any subcontractor that is related to the performance of the Master Agreement and this Addendum.
- D. Campaign Contributions. The Contractor is notified of the applicability of HRS §11-355, which prohibits campaign contributions from Contractor during the term of the Addendum if the Contractor is paid with funds appropriated by the Hawaii State Legislature.
- E. Purchase under this Master Agreement is not mandatory. This Addendum is secondary and non-exclusive.
- F. The State of Hawaii's purchasing card (pCard) is required to be used by Participating State's executive departments/agencies, (excluding the Department of Education, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and the University of Hawaii) for orders totaling less than \$2,500. For purchases of \$2,500 or more, agencies may use the pCard, subject to its credit limit, or issue a purchase order.

Contractor shall forward original invoice(s) directly to the ordering agency. General excise tax shall not be applied to the delivery charge.

Pursuant to HRS §103-10, Participating State and any agency of the Participating State or any county, shall have thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of invoice or satisfactory delivery of goods to make payment. Any interest for delinquent payment shall be as allowed by HRS §103-10.

- G. Pursuant to HRS §103D-310(c), if Contractor is doing business in the Participating State, Contractor is required to comply with all laws governing entities doing business in the Participating State, including the following HRS chapters.
  - 1. Chapter 237, General Excise Tax Law;
  - 2. Chapter 383, Hawaii Employment Security Law;
  - 3. Chapter 386, Workers' Compensation:
  - 4. Chapter 392, Temporary Disability Insurance;
  - 5. Chapter 393, Prepaid Health Care Act; and
  - 6. Certificate of Good Standing for entities doing business in the State.

The Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE) is utilized for verification of compliance. The SPO will conduct periodic checks to confirm Contractor's compliance on HCE throughout the term of the Addendum.

#### PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM

- H. Effective Date and Contract Period. This Addendum is effective upon the date of execution by the Participating State and shall continue for the term set forth in the Master Agreement.
- I. Attachment O, Model Service Level Agreement (SLA) is attached and made a part of this Participating Addendum.

- 8. Participating Entity as Individual Customer:

Each Participating Entity shall be treated as an individual customer. Except to the extent modified by this Addendum, each Participating Entity will be responsible to follow the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement; and will have the same rights and responsibilities for their purchases as the Lead State has in the Master

Agreement. Each Participating Entity will be responsible for its own charges, fees, and liabilities. Each Participating Entity will have the same rights to any indemnity or to recover any costs allowed in the Master Agreement for their purchases. The Contractor will apply the charges to each Participating Entity individually.

# 9. Entire Contract:

This Addendum and the Master Agreement set forth the entire agreement, and all the conditions, understandings, promises, warranties and representations among the parties with respect to this Addendum and the Master Agreement, and supersedes any prior communications, representations or agreements whether, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof.

Terms and conditions inconsistent with, contrary or in addition to the terms and conditions of this Addendum and the Master Agreement, that are included in any purchase order or otherwise shall be void. The terms and conditions of this Addendum and the Master Agreement shall govern in the case of any such inconsistent, contrary, or additional terms.

# RICOH MODEL SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

The purpose of this model Service Level Agreement (SLA) is to provide the Participating Entities and Awarded Vendors with an example of a guarantee of service levels with penalties for failure to perform. This model SLA utilizes a scorecard method for the Customer level SLA and flat rate penalties for the Participating Entity. Awarded Vendors are to negotiate their own SLA with each Participating Entity at time of initiating the Participating Addendum. All parties are cautioned to utilize measurements that are reportable and measurable.

#### 1. Customer Level SLA

# 1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this addendum is to define service levels; penalties for the performance of the service levels; as well as provide the Customer with a defined replacement process for equipment performing below expectations. This SLA does not implicate or involve lease related invoicing rather it involves equipment performance and maintenance issues.

# 1.2 Customer Service Level Agreement

Vendor agrees to maintain the following service levels defined below as targets:

Performance Criteria	Target Level
Average Uptime	96% or Better
Average On-Site Response Time	4 Hours or Less
First Time Fix	80% of all service calls or better

These service levels will be measured on a quarterly basis between Vendor and the State.

# 1.3 Calculation of Service Level Points

Once per quarter, upon written request by the customer, Vendor will produce reporting to be measured against the Service Level Agreement and points will be assigned according to the following chart. These points will be added to produce a total Service Level score. This score will be used to determine the subsequent penalty according to the following schedule where the penalty can be up to 4% of the previous quarter's service and supplies billing (expressed as a negative %).

The penalty shall be awarded to the Customer as a credit or by check on the following period's service and supplies invoice.

# 1.5 Equipment Performance

Vendor guarantees that the customer's fleet specified within any maintenance agreement, for units within the Urban service area, will average the monthly uptime as measured on a quarterly basis by product segment listed below.

If any unit fails to maintain this level of performance for the monthly uptime, excluding service calls caused by operator error that system will be subject to replacement at the Customers discretion on a like-for-like basis with then current technology. Prior to installing a substitute product, supplier will be allowed 90 days to remedy any quality or reliability issues. The 95% uptime requirement

shall not apply to devices whose uptime depends, in large part, on the operator's efficiency in replacing operator replaceable components.

Should Ricoh determine that it cannot maintain a unit of Equipment or an Accessory in good working order, Ricoh shall, at its own expense, replace such Equipment with another unit of the same product designation as that Equipment (a "replacement unit") and Ricoh shall bear all installation, transportation, removal and rigging charges in connection with the installation of such replacement unit; provided, however that (a) the replacement unit may be a reconditioned or otherwise used unit rather than a new unit; and (b) if a replacement unit of the same product designation as the unit of Equipment it replaces is not available, the replacement unit may be a product of substantially similar or greater capabilities.

The replacement unit will be in "as new" condition, both in operation and appearance. In addition, all warranties and maintenance coverage that applied to the removed unit will also apply to the permanent replacement equipment.

A designated factory authorized technician must certify each unit's ability to produce acceptable impressions with acceptable copies between calls or uptime. The guarantee will remain in effect for the term of the contract or up to five (5) years from the date of purchase/lease, provided the equipment has not been subjected to abuse or neglect and has been continuously covered by a Maintenance Contract. This replacement policy will remain in effect for the term of the contract and is subject to the Customer remaining current with supplier's payment requirements.

#### 1.6 Additional Vendor Guarantees

1.6.1 **Training** — On-going training as requested by the Customer to be performed within two (2) weeks of requested date for on-site training and two (2) hours for phone/technical support.

To aid end-users after the training session, we provide a manual for every device for reference purposes. In addition, we offer Quick Reference Guides and 24-hour toll-free end-user technical support for everyday minor troubleshooting.

- 1.6.2 **Loaner Unit/Backup Production** If any unit is inoperable due to equipment malfunction for a period in excess of 72 hours, Vendor shall provide the Customer with either:
  - i) A loaner unit of similar speed and capabilities until such time as the unit(s) covered by this agreement are operable, or
  - ii) Provide the Customer with off-site manned production capabilities to accomplish the work of the unit that is inoperable at the sole cost of the Vendor. Such costs shall be limited to cost of

production (service and supplies), equipment, labor, power, transportation of jobs to and from the off-site production facility and facilities. With respect to NexPress devices, this is the only option available and provided Kodak receives (i) the red-alert status associated with the malfunctioning unit from the Customer within 24 hours of the unit's initial failure and (ii) the equipment malfunction is not due to operator error, operator abuse or adverse operating conditions.

1.6.3 Invoicing — Vendor shall maintain timely, accurate invoicing, less service run impressions, as defined below. The assigned copy machine operators, back-up personnel, and office personnel shall respond in a timely manner to the Contractor's e-mails, facsimiles, and phone calls in providing the readings. Receiving meters from end users is a necessary step in the process of generating a complete and accurate invoice. Invoices that are generated without receiving the proper meter read information, due to the customer's failure to provide such meters by the last day of the month, are not considered inaccurate. Failure on the vendor's part to maintain these levels as defined shall result in a \$50.00 per instance credit on the following invoice. Customer will provide written notice of any such alleged invoicing problem and vendor will be allowed a 30 day cure period to address any such issue.

# 2. Reporting and Billing

- 2.1 **Timely Reporting** Vendor shall produce reporting for the State within 30 days of the closing of the reporting period. Failure to do so will result in a penalty of \$5.00 per work day beyond the 30 day period.
- 2.2 **Timely Payment of Administrative Fees** Vendor shall produce payment for any State Specific Administrative Fee within -60days of the closing of the reporting period. Failure to do so will result in a penalty of \$5.00 per work day beyond the 60 day period.
- 2.3 **Accuracy of Reporting** The State may request at any point proof of the reporting accuracy through the data set supporting the reporting. If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic reporting errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's reasonable satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party whereby the Awarded Vendor will provide supporting documentation to allow such third party to confirm the accuracy of the reporting.. If errors are

found, the Successful vendor must reimburse the State for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any administrative fee errors provided, however, the Awarded Vendor shall not be required to reimburse the Customer for any cost of the auditor to the extent such cost exceeds the amount of the administrative fee error.

- Accuracy of Billing The State may request at any point proof of the billing accuracy through the data set supporting the billing. If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic billing errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's reasonable satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party whereby the Awarded Vendor will provide supporting documentation to allow such third party to confirm the accuracy of the reporting. If errors are found, the Successful vendor must reimburse the State for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any billing errors provided, however, the Awarded Vendor shall not be required to reimburse the Customer for any cost of the auditor to the extent such cost exceeds the amount of the billing fee error.
- 2.5 **Penalties** All penalties under this, section two (2) of the Service Level Agreement, shall be payable to the State.
- 2.6 All other Service terms and conditions are set forth in the Service Maintenance agreements, as included in Ricoh's bid submission, and are incorporated by reference into this SLA.
