- The attached amended Participating Addendum

The contractor shall provide multifunction copiers and related services specified by the NASPO ValuePoint Copiers, Printers, and Related Software contract. All references to the State of Nevada, Department of Administration's Purchasing Division and NASPO ValuePoint, in the attached documentation shall be deemed to refer to the State of Missouri with the exception of information specific to the State of Nevada and NASPO ValuePoint such as background information, statistical/factual information, etc.

- 1.1 The contractor shall submit invoices for products and services/supplies provided for the State of Missouri directly to the ordering agency.
- 2.1 The contractor shall allow for ongoing lease payments, as applicable, from the previous WSCA Copiers and Related Software contract #1715. The contractor should work with customers to determine if this specific State of Missouri contract or another contract with one of its authorized dealers is most appropriate for ongoing lease payments.
- 3.1 The State of Missouri hereby incorporates the following provisions regarding state agency use of the contract:
  - a. State agencies shall not be permitted to acquire printers (Group D) through this agreement. Political subdivisions and universities of the State of Missouri may acquire printers (Group D) through this agreement.
  - b. Quotations: State agencies should obtain price quotations from at least three manufacturers before purchasing products through the contract.
  - c. Color and High Speed Units: Before purchasing a color multifunction device of any speed or a black and white multifunction device with a speed greater than 60 pages per minute (PPM), a state agency must obtain written approval to purchase the device from OA General Services State Printing. State agencies must submit State Printing's written approval with the purchase order.
  - d. <u>Trade-Ins:</u> State agencies must obtain OA Surplus Property's approval before trading in a copier.
  - e. <u>Hard Drive Erase:</u> State agencies must purchase hard drive erase software for all devices containing a hard drive.
  - f. Orders and Invoicing: When the manufacturer utilizes dealers to accept orders and payments, then the order must be placed to the same vendor as the payment will be made. (i.e. If orders are submitted to the manufacturer, then payment must be submitted to the manufacturer. If orders are submitted to a dealer then payment must be submitted to the same dealer.)

- g. <u>Financing Options</u>: State agencies may enter into fair market value/operational leases, cancelable rentals, and non-cancelable rentals. <u>State agencies must not enter into capital leases</u>.
- h. <u>Sales Reporting:</u> The manufacturer must provide quarterly reports to the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management identifying devices purchased, leased, and maintained under this contract.
  - 1) The report must list the placement of all copiers (purchased or fair market value lease) during the previous three months.
  - 2) The report must be presented by email within 30 business days after the end of each reporting period.
  - 3) Reports must include the following:
    - i. Contract Number:
    - ii. Equipment Make, Model, and Serial Number;
    - iii. State Agency and Location;
    - iv. Purchase or Fair Market Value Lease;
    - v. Maintenance Agreements;

### 4.1 <u>Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee:</u>

- a. The contractor shall pay a one percent (1%) administrative fee to the State of Missouri which shall apply to all payments received by the contractor for all products and services provided under the contract. Payment of the one percent administrative fee shall be non-negotiable.
- b. The contractor shall pay the administrative fee at the end of each calendar quarter (i.e. March 31, June 30, September 30, December 31). The total administrative fee for a given quarter must equal one percent (1%) of the total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor during the calendar quarter as reported on the contractor's Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report specified below. The administrative fee must be received by the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management (DPMM) no later than the 15<sup>th</sup> calendar day of the month immediately following the end of the calendar quarter, unless the 15<sup>th</sup> is not a business day in which case the next business day thereafter shall be considered the administrative fee deadline.
- c. Payments shall be made using one of the following acceptable payment methods:
  - Check: Personal check, company check, cashier's check, or money order made payable to the "Missouri Revolving Information Technology Trust Fund" and sent to the following mailing address: Division of Purchasing and Materials Management, P.O. Box 809, Jefferson City, MO 65102 0809 OR Division of Purchasing and Materials Management, 301 West High Street, Room 630, Jefferson City, MO 65101-1517. The contractor's payment by check shall authorize the State of Missouri to process the check electronically. The contractor understands and agrees that any returned check from the contractor may be presented again electronically and may be subject to additional actions and/or handling fees.
  - <u>Electronic Payment</u>: Instructions on how to submit payments electronically by automated clearing house (ACH) will be provided upon request by contacting the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management at (573) 751-2387.
- d. All payments of the administrative fee shall include the contract number on any check or transmittal document. However, only one contract number must be entered on a check or transmittal document. If submitting an administrative fee payment for more than one contract, then a separate check or

electronic payment and associated transmittal document must be submitted by the contractor for each contract.

### 5.1 <u>Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report:</u>

- a. The contractor shall submit a Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report to the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management which shall identify the total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor from state agencies, political subdivisions, universities, and governmental entities in other states that were made pursuant to the contract.
- b. The contractor shall prepare and submit the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report at the end of each calendar quarter (i.e. March 31, June 30, September 30, December 31) for total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor during the calendar quarter. The Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report must be received by the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management (DPMM) no later than the 15<sup>th</sup> calendar day of the month following the reporting quarter entered on the report, unless the 15<sup>th</sup> is not a business day in which case the next business day thereafter shall be considered the reporting deadline. Even if there has been no usage of the contract during the reporting quarter, the contractor must still submit a report and indicate no payments were received by marking the appropriate box on the report form.
- c. The contractor shall agree that the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management reserves the right to modify the requested format and content of the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report by providing thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the contractor. The contractor shall also agree the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management may unilaterally amend the contract, with thirty (30) calendar days notice to the contractor to change the method of payment of the administrative fee, the timing for submission of the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report, and/or timing for payment of the administrative fee. The contractor shall understand and agree that if such an amendment is issued by the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management, the contractor shall comply with all contractual terms, as amended.

The contractor shall prepare and submit the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Usage Report at the end of each calendar quarter (i.e. March 31, June 30, September 30, December 31) for the purchases made under the contract during the calendar quarter. The Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Usage Report must be received by the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management no later than the 15<sup>th</sup> calendar day of the month following the reporting quarter entered on the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Usage Report, unless the 15th is not a business day in which case the next business day thereafter shall be considered the reporting deadline. - c. The contractor shall understand and agree that if such an amendment is issued by the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management, the contractor shall comply with all contractual terms, as amended.

7.1 <u>Leases:</u> State agencies may enter into fair market value leases, cancelable rentals, and non-cancelable rentals. <u>State agencies shall not enter into capital leases or short term rentals.</u>

#### 8.1 Affidavit of Work Authorization and Documentation:

The state may also withhold up to twenty-five percent of the total amount due to the contractor.
- c. The contractor shall agree to fully cooperate with any audit or investigation from federal, state, or local law enforcement agencies.
- d. If the contractor meets the definition of a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo, pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, the contractor shall maintain enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the contracted services included herein. If the contractor's business status changes during the life of the contract to become a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo, pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, then the contractor shall, prior to the performance of any services as a business entity under the contract:

### 7. TERMINATION.

- a. <u>Termination Without Cause</u>. Any discretionary or vested right of renewal notwithstanding this Agreement may be terminated upon written notice by mutual consent of both parties.
- b. Termination With Penalty. Leases may be bought out and return to Lessor, although operational, and non-cancelable rentals will be subject to a termination charge. - (ii) the Lease Minimum Payments (less the Maintenance Services and Consumable Supplies components thereof, as reflected on Lessor's books and records) remaining in the initial Term of a Lease order, discounted at 4% per annum; and
- (iii) all applicable Taxes. The State will notify Lessor and make the Equipment available for removal by Lessor in the same condition as when delivered (reasonable wear and tear excepted) within 30 days after notice of default.
- c. <u>State Termination for Non-appropriation</u>. The continuation of this Agreement is subject to and contingent upon sufficient funds being appropriated, budgeted, and otherwise made available by the State Legislature and/or federal sources. The State may terminate this Agreement, and Lessor waives any and all claim(s) for damages, effective immediately upon service of written notice (or any subsequent date specified therein) if for any reason the Leasing Agency's funding from State and/or federal sources is not appropriated or is withdrawn, or limited.
- d. Cause Termination for Default or Breach. A default or breach may be declared with or without termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to other party for any material breach or default by the other party of any terms, conditions, covenants, or obligations of this Agreement pursuant to the WSCA-NASPO Master Agreement. Upon the occurrence of an event of default, the State shall issue a written notice of default, identifying the nature of the default, and providing a period of 15 calendar days in which Lessor shall have an opportunity to cure the default. The State shall not be required to provide advance written notice or a cure period and may immediately terminate this Participating Addendum in whole or in part if the State, in its sole discretion, determines that it is reasonably necessary to preserve public safety or prevent immediate public crisis. Time allowed for cure shall not diminish or eliminate Lessor's liability for damages, including liquidated damages to the extent provided for under the WSCA-NASPO Master Agreement.
- 8. <u>INSURANCE</u>. ### STATE OF MISSOURI SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

#### 1. Customer Level SLA

- 1.1 Purpose The purpose of this addendum is to define service levels; penalties for the performance of the service levels; as well as provide the Customer with a defined replacement process for equipment performing below expectations. This SLA does not implicate or involve lease related invoicing; it involves equipment performance and maintenance issues.
- 1.2 Customer Service Level Agreement Contractor agrees to maintain the following service levels defined below as targets:

Performance Criteria	Target Level
Average Uptime	96% or Better
Average On-Site Response Time	4 Hours or Less
First Time Fix	80% of all service calls or better

These service levels will be measured on a quarterly basis between Contractor and Customer.

1.3 Calculation of Service Level Points - Upon written request of the Customer, the Contractor will produce reporting to be measured against the Service Level Agreement and points will be assigned according to the following chart for the previous quarter. These points will be added to produce a total Service Level score. This score will be used to determine the subsequent penalty according to the following schedule where the penalty can be up to 4% of the previous quarter's service and supplies billing only (expressed as a negative %). Penalty will not apply to lease payments.

If any unit fails to maintain this level of performance between calls and or the monthly uptime, excluding service calls caused by operator error that system will be subject to replacement at the Customers discretion on a like-for-like basis with then current technology. Prior to installing a substitute product, Contractor will be allowed 90 days to remedy any quality or reliability issues. A designated factory authorized technician must certify each unit's ability to produce acceptable impressions with acceptable copies between calls or uptime. The guarantee will remain in effect for the term of the contract or up to five (5) years from the date of purchase/lease, provided the equipment has not been subjected to abuse or neglect and has been continuously covered by a Maintenance Contract. - 1.6.2 Loaner Unit/Backup Production If any unit is inoperable due to equipment malfunction for a period in excess of 72 hours, Contractor shall provide the Customer with either:
  - i) A loaner unit of similar speed and capabilities until such time as the unit(s) covered by this agreement are operable, or
  - ii) Provide the Customer with off-site manned production capabilities to accomplish the work of the unit that is inoperable at the sole cost of the Contractor. Such costs shall be limited to cost of production (service and supplies), equipment, labor, power, transportation of jobs to and from the off-site production facility and facilities.
- 1.6.3 Invoicing Contractor shall maintain timely, accurate invoicing, less service run impressions, as defined below. The assigned copy machine operators, back-up personnel, and office personnel shall respond in a timely manner to the Contractor's e-mails, facsimiles, and phone calls in providing the readings. Receiving meter readings from Customer is a necessary step in the process of generating a complete and accurate invoice. Invoices that are generated without receiving the proper meter read information, due to the Customer's failure to provide such meter readings by the last day of the month, are not considered inaccurate. Failure on the Contractor's part to maintain the Service levels as defined in the table below shall result in a \$50.00 per instance credit on the following invoice provided Customer

If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic reporting errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's reasonable satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party whereby the Contractor will provide supporting documentation to allow such third party to confirm the accuracy of the reporting. If errors are found, the Contractor must reimburse the appropriate account or purchasing entity for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any administrative fee errors.
- 2.3 Accuracy of Billing The State may request, at any point, proof of the billing accuracy through the data set supporting the billing. If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic billing errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's reasonable satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party whereby the Contractor will provide supporting documentation to allow such third party to confirm the accuracy of the reporting. If errors are found, the Contractor must reimburse the appropriate account or purchasing entity for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any billing errors.
